## Dear parents carers

Working in partnership with you, we fully recognise that since March, there have been considerable additional strains on families throughout our community. With the help of Caritas, The Felix Project, Feed-up Warm up and other generous donors the school has managed to distribute 294 food parcels to families from within the school and the three parishes. We hope that this has gone some way to help families as they deal with a range of circumstances.

A team of 10 teachers, senior leaders, TAs and Governors voluntarily gave of their time for 7 consecutive weeks to deliver a total of 294 food parcels (averaging 42 per week). I would like to take this opportunity to thank these volunteers for their amazing dedication and commitment to the school community. I know that they enjoyed the socially distanced conversations with so many of you on the doorstep!

As you are aware, we are currently planning for the potential the safe return to school for over 200 pupils; this is taking up much time for all school personnel and this work is likely to increase as gradually more pupils are allowed to return. As such the weekly food parcel deliveries are no longer possible to source, prepare and deliver; we must focus our attention on the safe return preparations. Therefore, we want to support you in obtaining alternative arrangements for this provision should you continue to need support.
