





Year 3 have been talking about their own family, the Holy family, their Christian family and their parish family. They produced lots of lovely drawings and great talk about the people in each family.



















Fabulous focus in Year 5 T with their creative use of the slot technique for joining cardboard and a group busy sewing.

Y4 Michelangelo learnt how to do overhand throws, make an upper case L, side to target, step, twist, throw.


