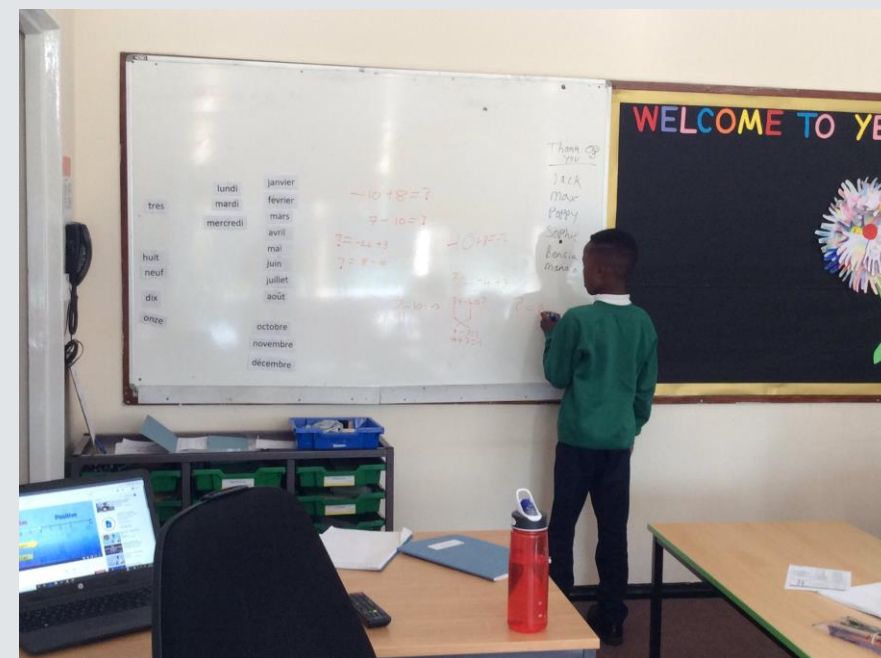
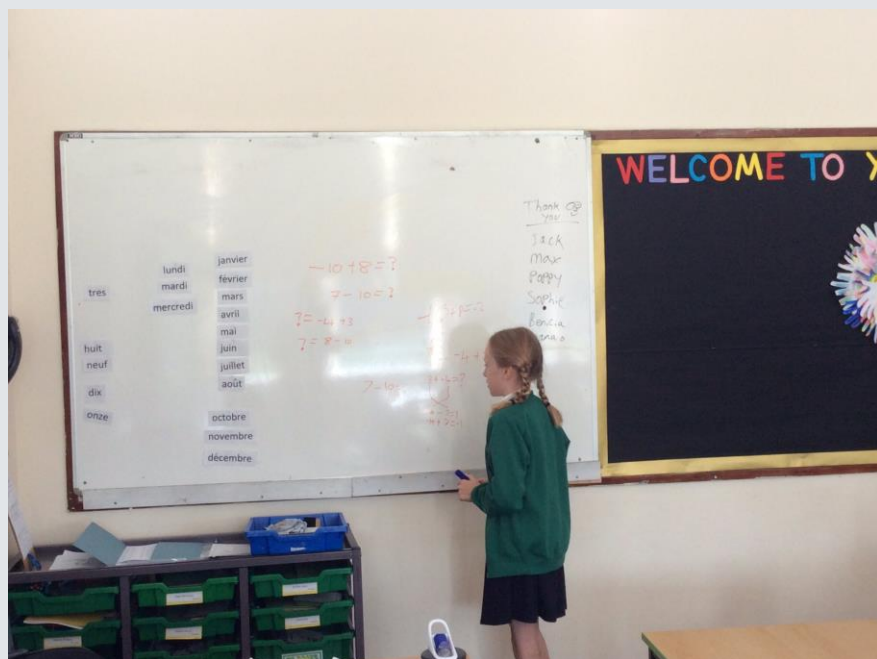
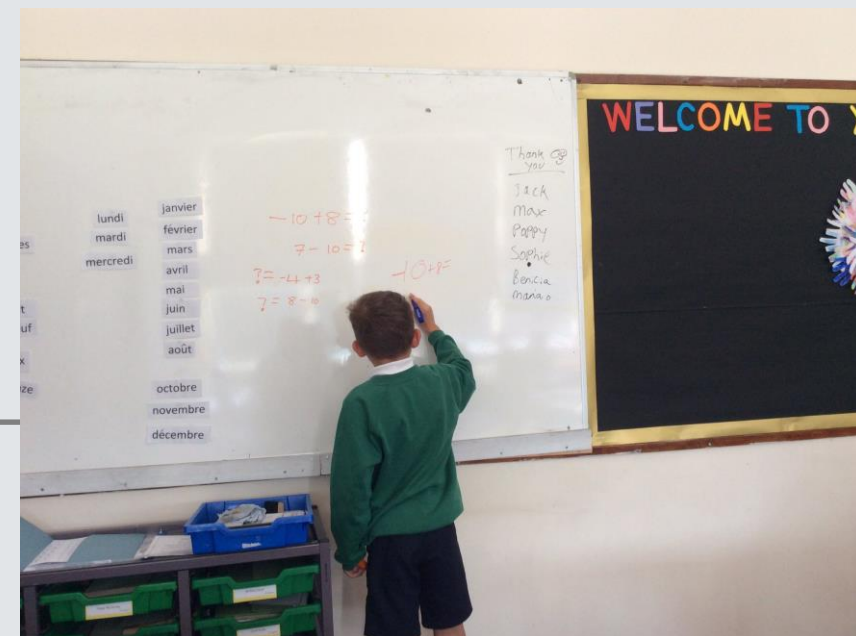
Year 3 have been talking about their own family, the Holy family, their Christian family and their parish family. They produced lots of lovely drawings and great talk about the people in each family.

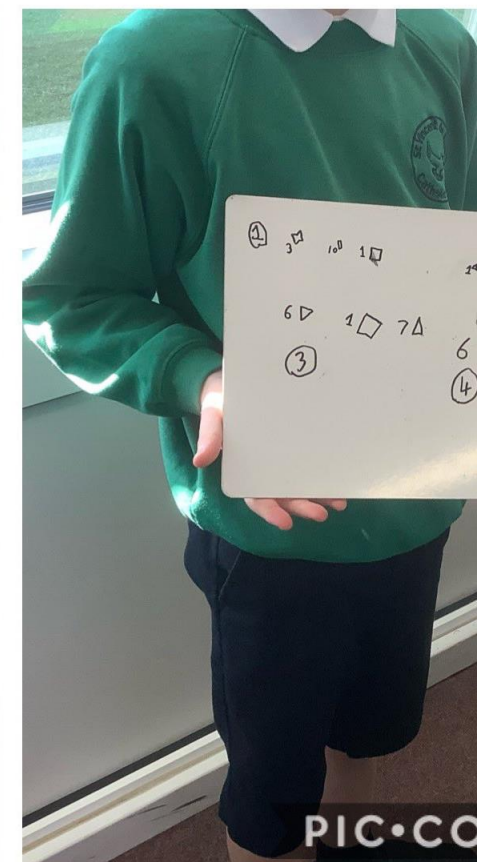
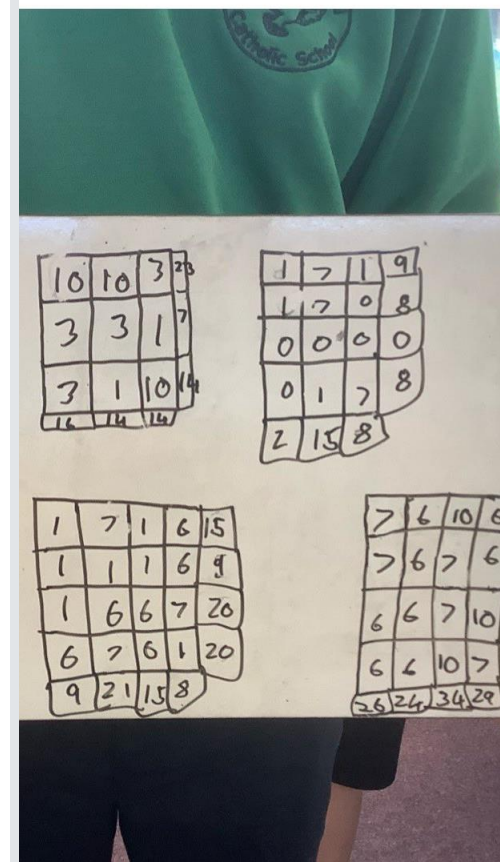
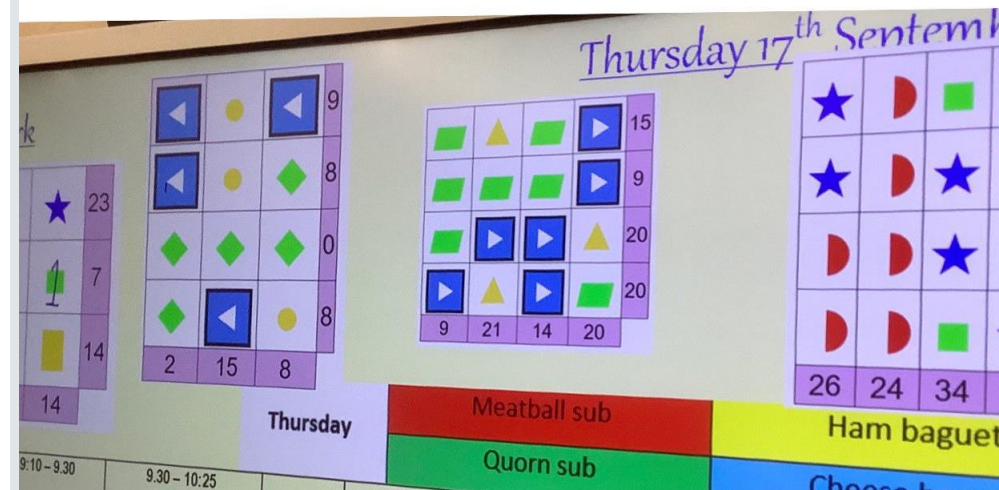
Y4 Michelangelo learnt how to do overhand throws, make an upper case L, side to target, step, twist, throw. They used these skills to play a new game.




An Early Morning Task maths star in Y2 Pasteur led to Maths fun at playtime... and a lot of talk about the diagrams on the playground at drop off and collection times

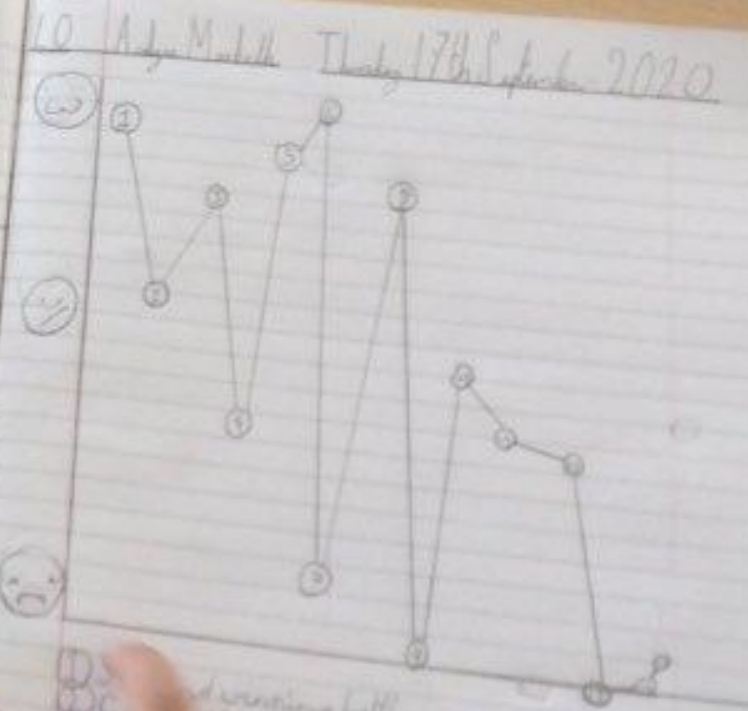
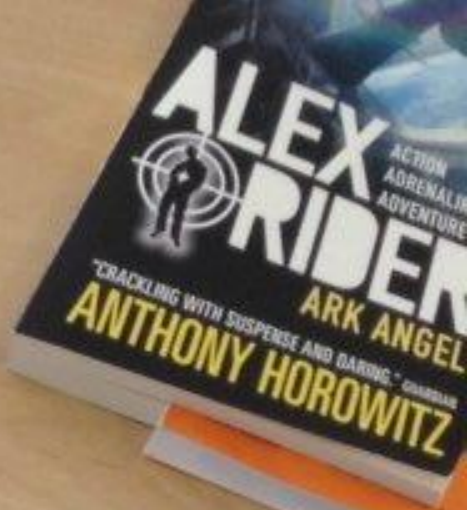

Year Six worked in pairs to try to achieve a total nearest to 1000 by rolling a dice nine times to generate random numbers and selecting where to enter them in the grid.



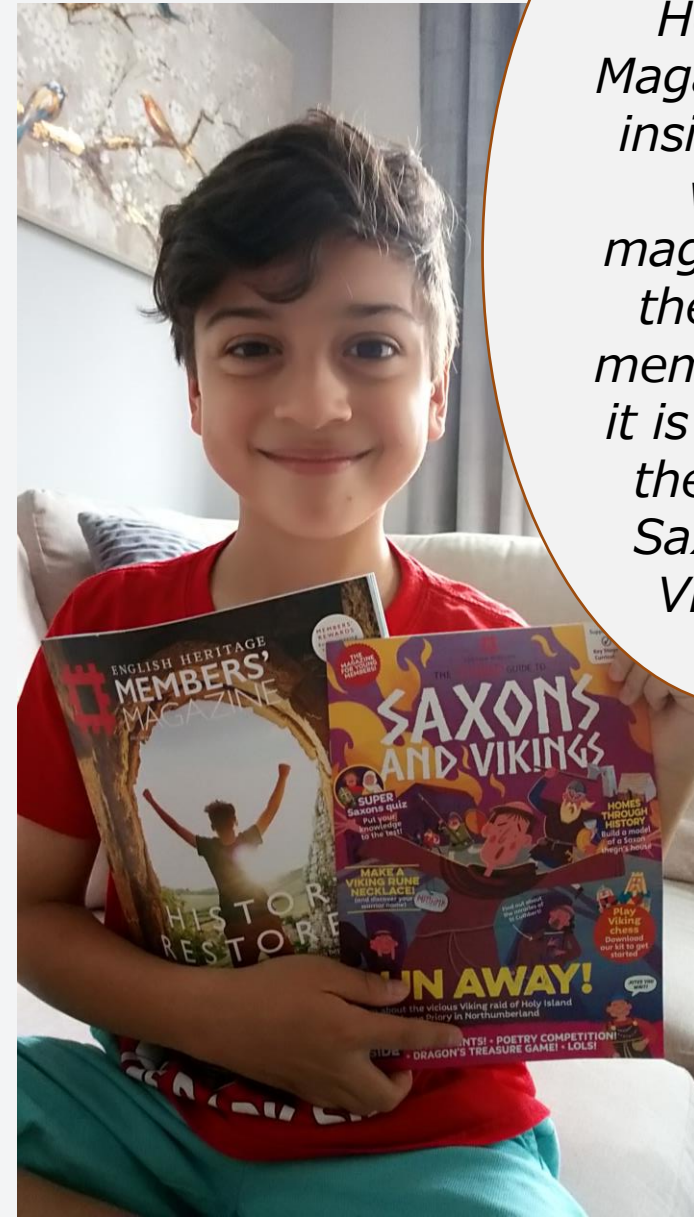
