have to walk to school and back on my own

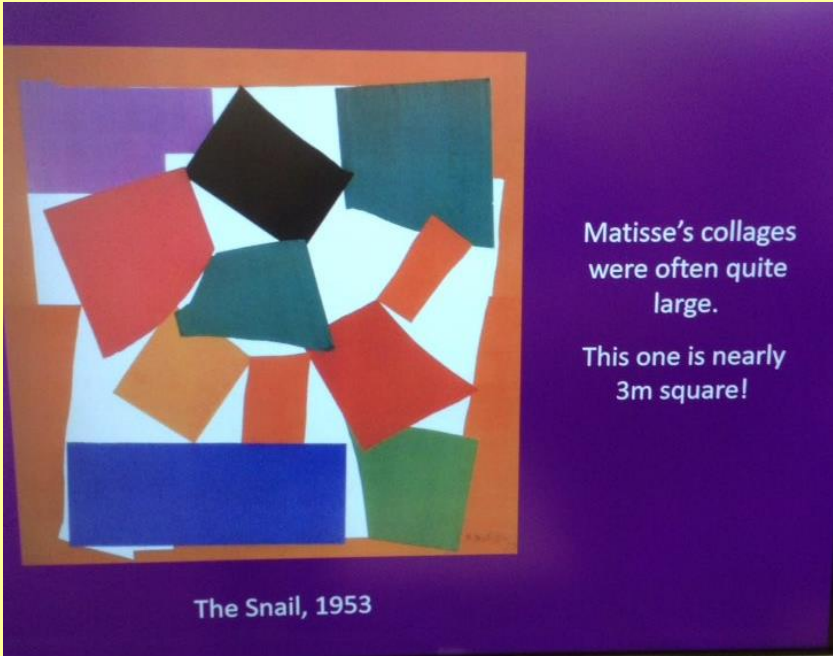

This one is nearly 3m square!

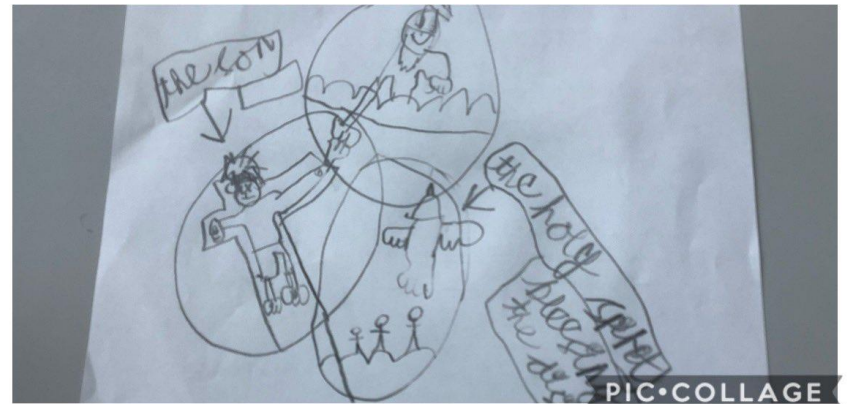
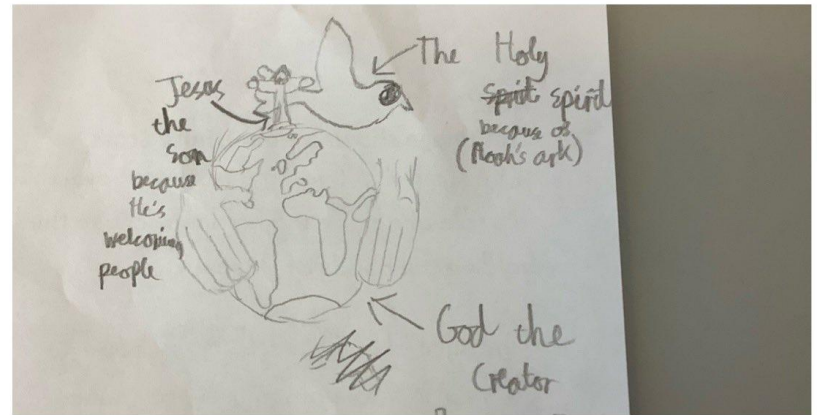
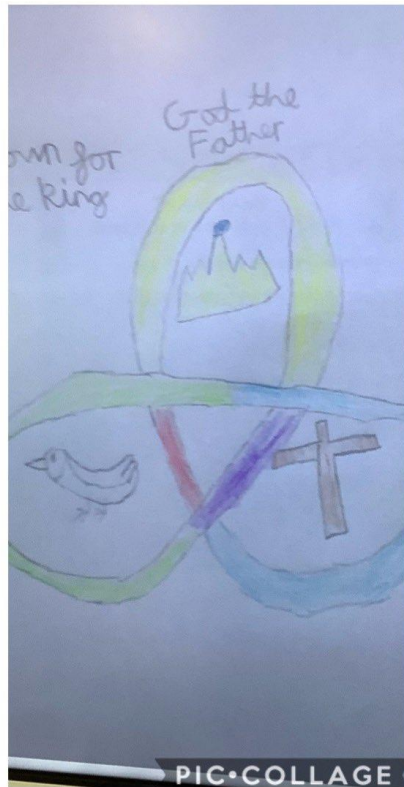
The Snail, 1953

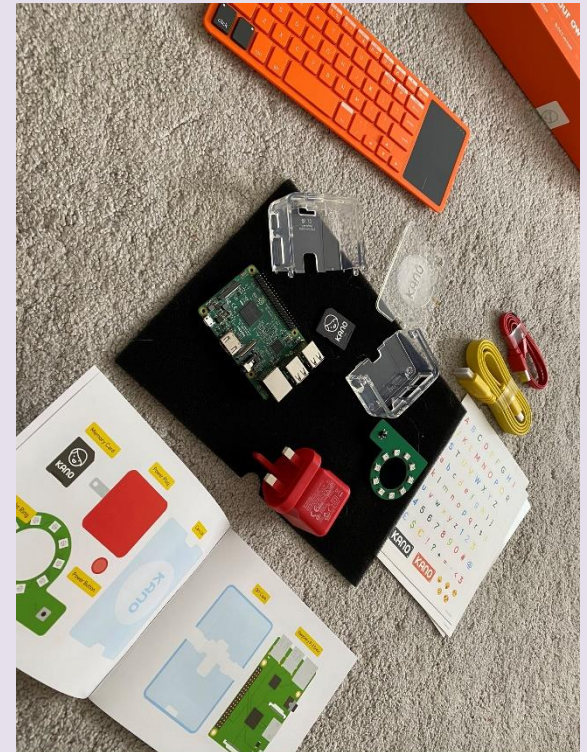
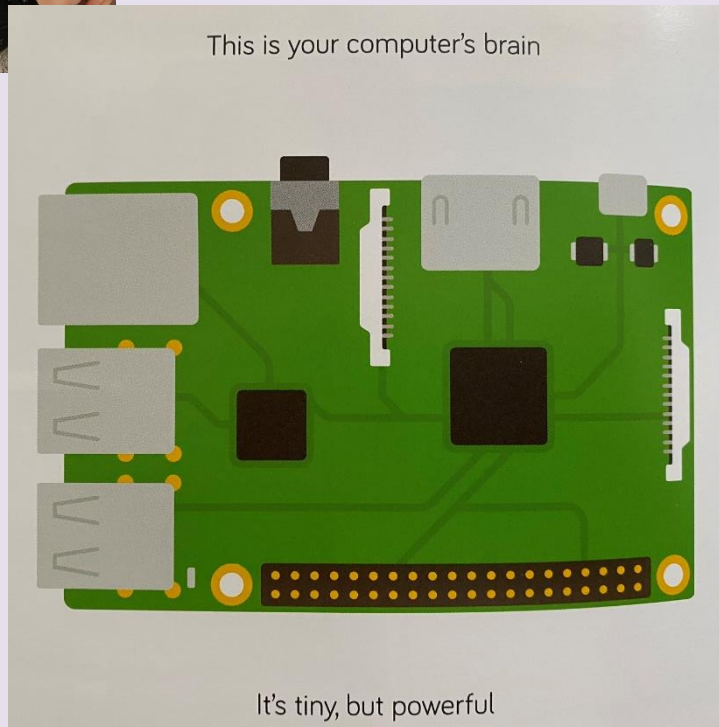
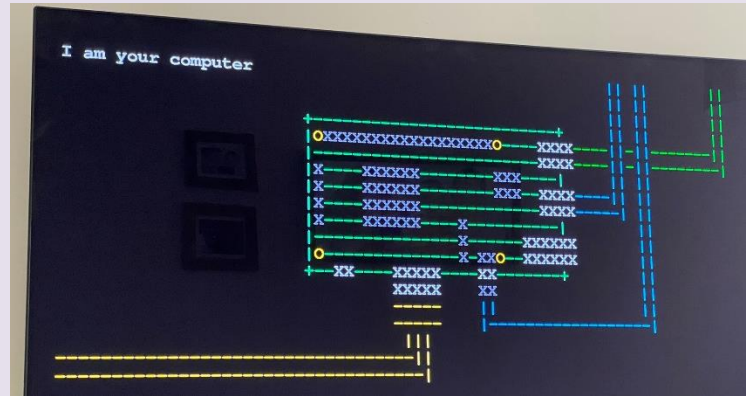
Bubble 6 key workers have been mixing the primary colours of red, yellow and blue in the style of Kandinsky.

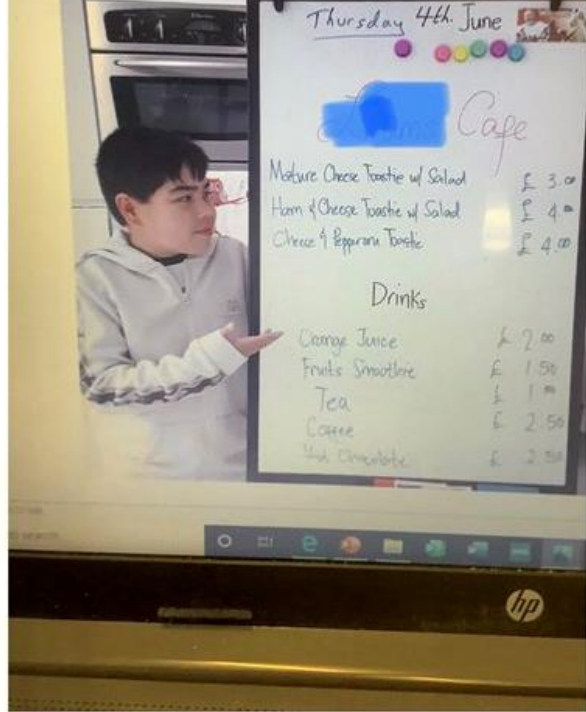

Toilet Roll Bird

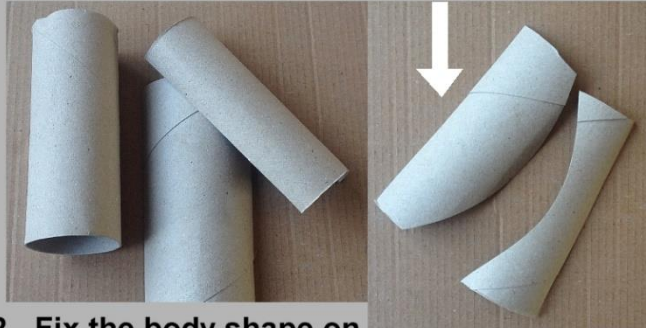


* I've based this on a Hummingbird, you can use any bird you like, but you might need a photo to look at?

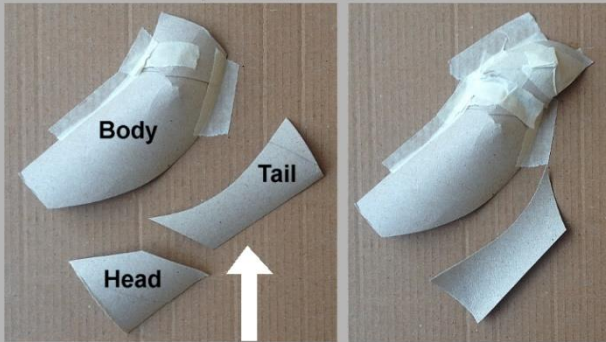
This has been an "art jumpstart" by Darrell Wakelam



1 - Cut a toilet roll tube in half lengthways, keep one half and cut the other like this . . .



2 - Fix the body shape on . . .

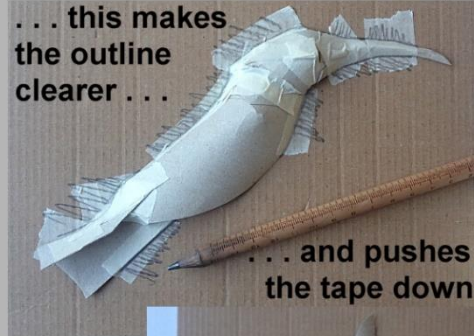


then cut the other part in two diagonally. Use one part for the head and the other for a tail.

3 - From the saved half of the tube cut a beak shape and tape it on.

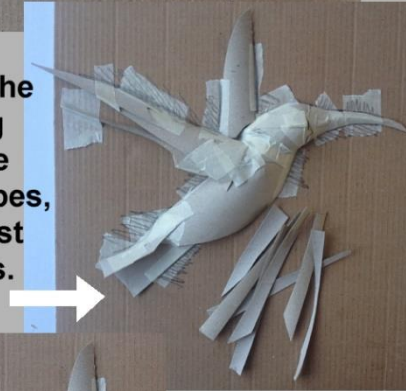


4 - I often scribble over the tape . . . this makes the outline clearer . . .



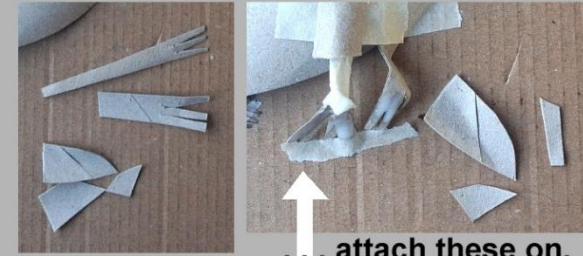
. . . and pushes the tape down.

4 - From the remaining tube make wing shapes, cut the rest into strips.



5 - Use these strips to make wing and tail feathers, save a few.

6 - From the last strips cut out thin legs, and chop out little toes . . .



. . . attach these on.

7 - Roll up some tape or tin-foil into a ball for an eye . . .



. . . and make a socket to hold it in.



8 - Paper mache the background to hide the tape.
