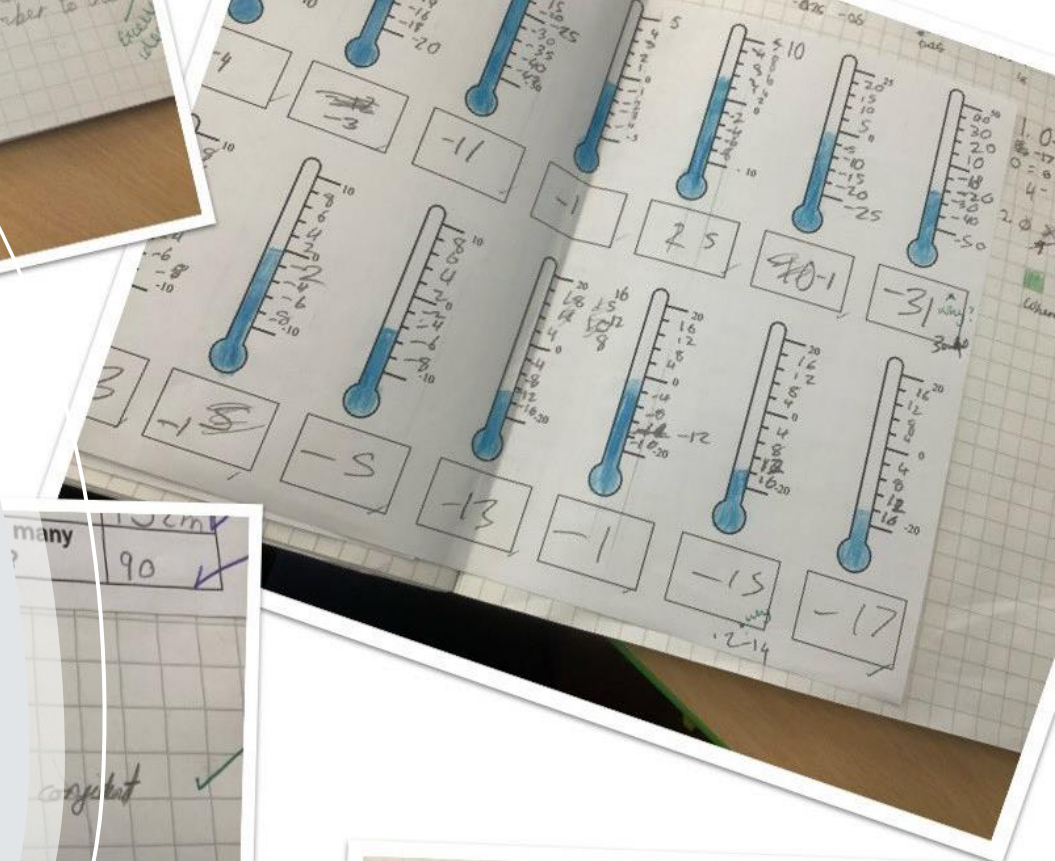


The Nursery children have been hard at work looking after their environment!

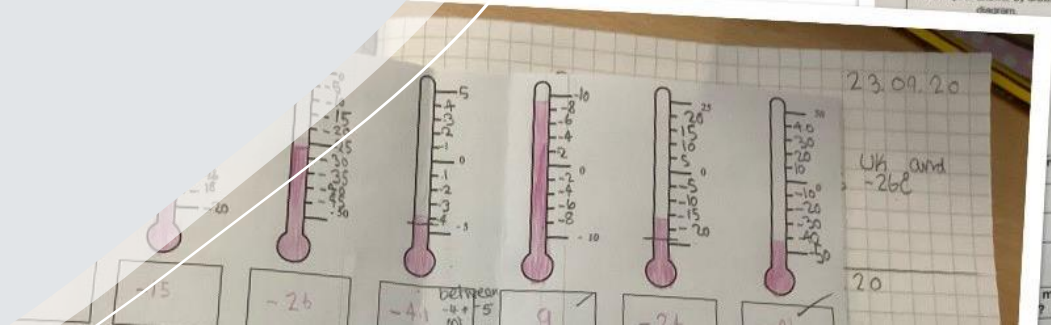

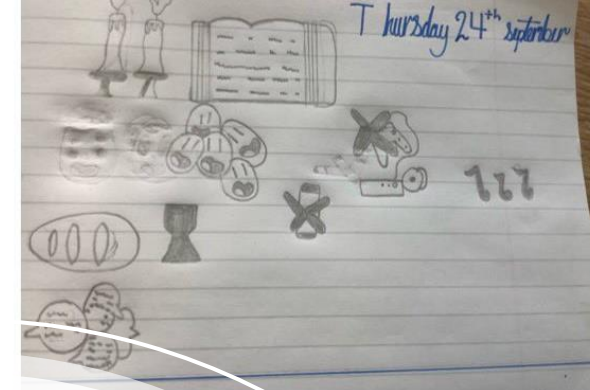

① The Profession of faith is said by the whole church after the Homily, because it is saying Catholics believe in God.

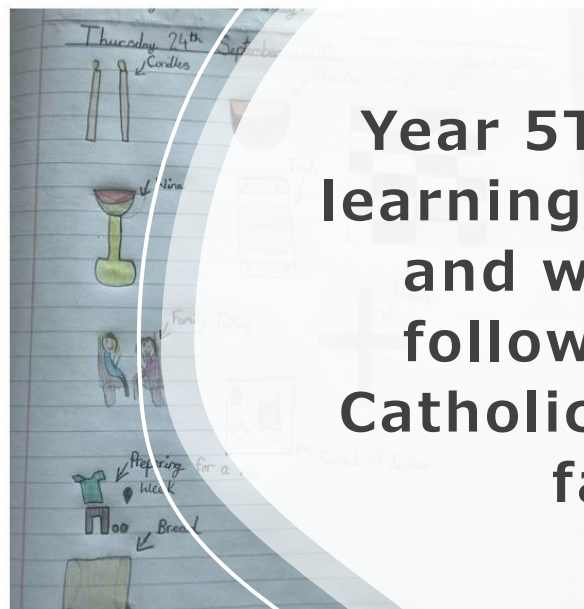
② It reminds believers that God willingly created everything, so Catholics celebrate their belief in that.

A catholic shows they are keeping the Lord's commandment Holy by going to mass and joining in what we can.

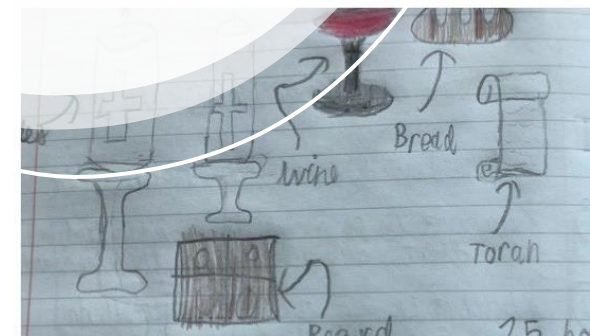
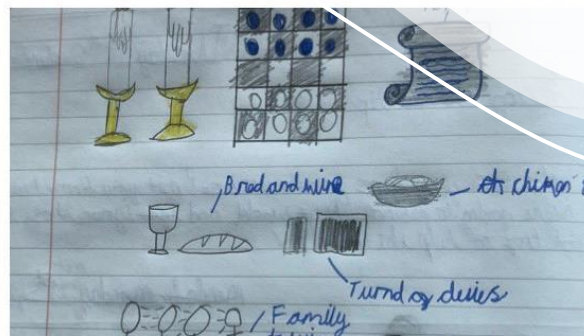
