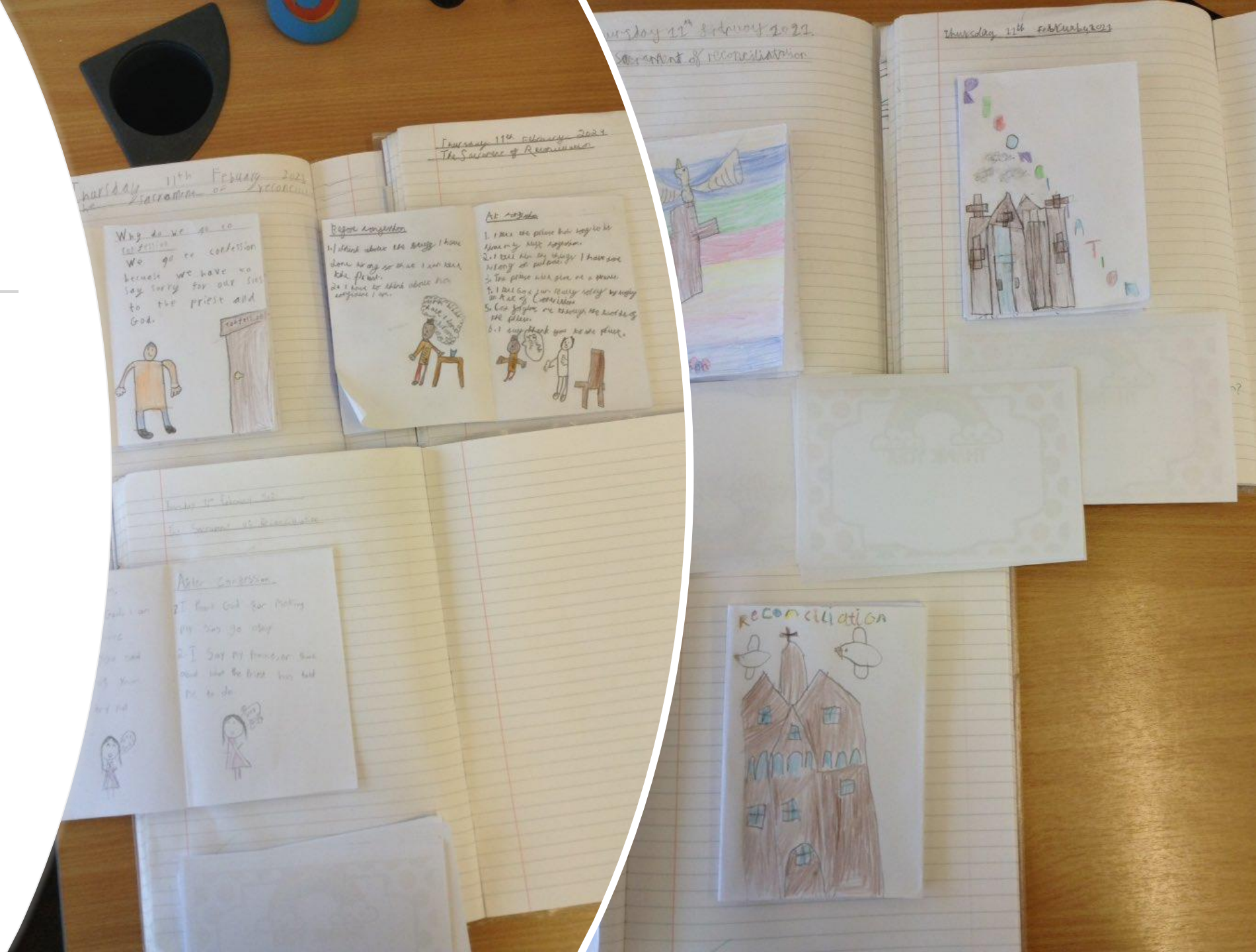


Year 1 were busy at home and in school writing out sentences and putting in the correct punctuation

They are interested in ordering numbers, building, balancing and modifying and having their own ideas.

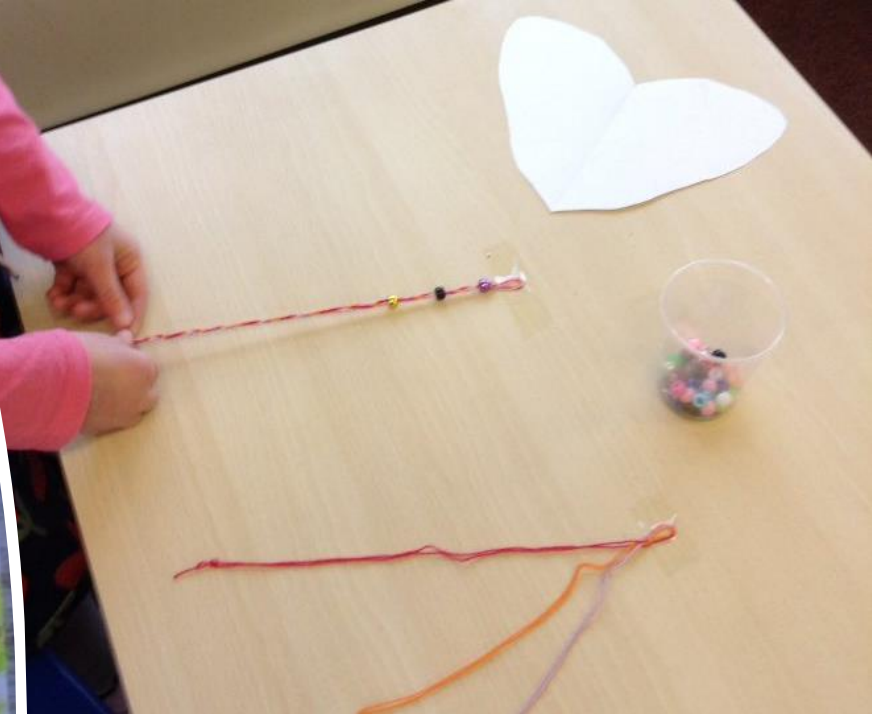
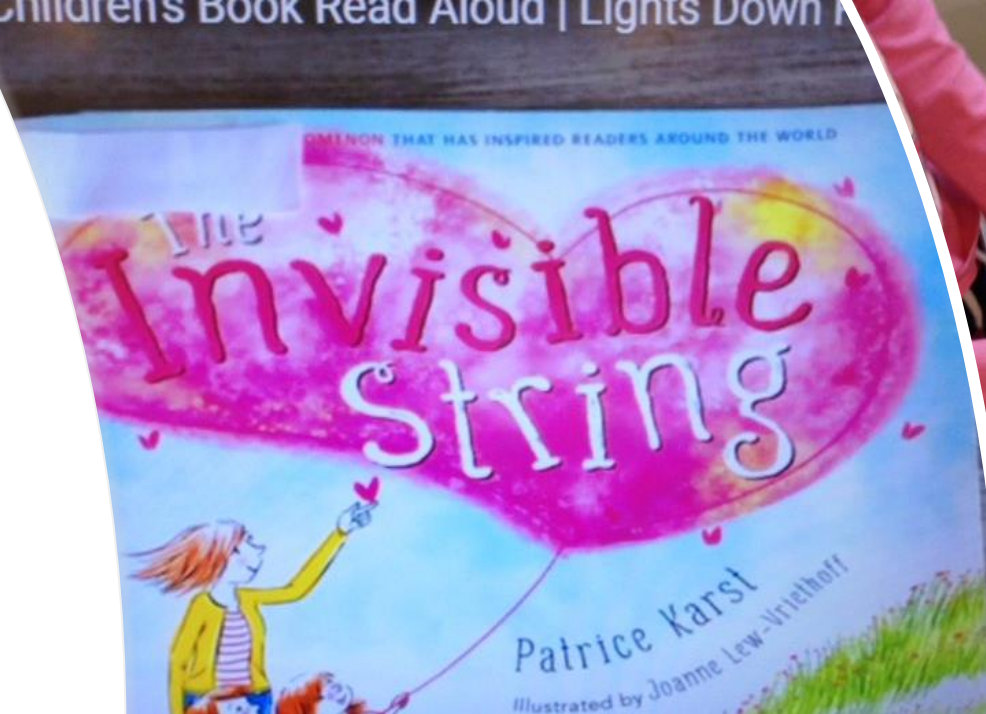

Preparing for Lent

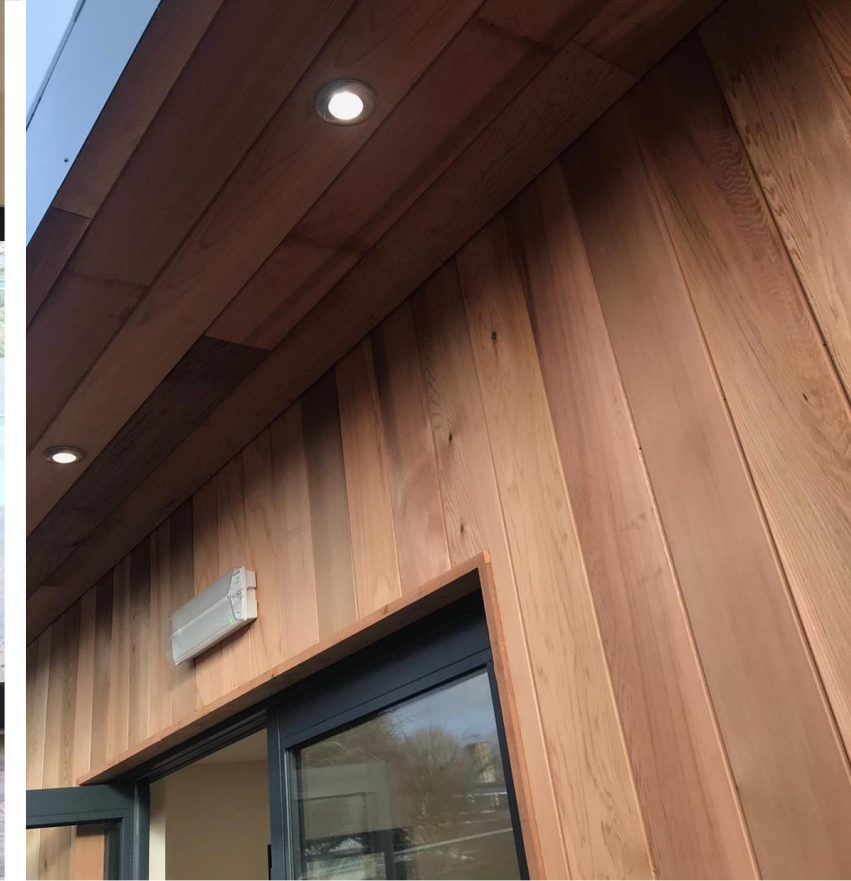
Mr. Innes shared this fact:

“Many Polish families celebrate ‘Fat Thursday’.

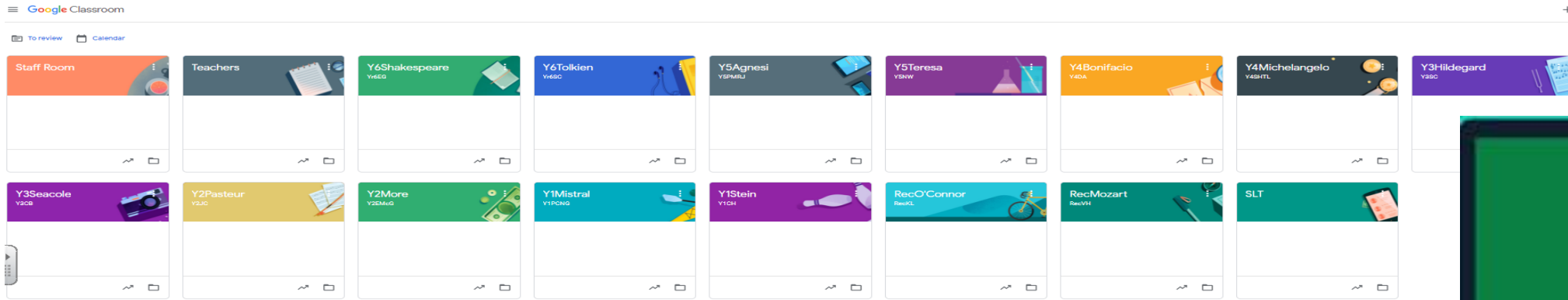
This is very similar to Pancake Tuesday when traditionally families used up fats and sugar before preparing for Easter.

To log in please go to www.classroom.google.com and follow the instructions in the guide that was sent to you.

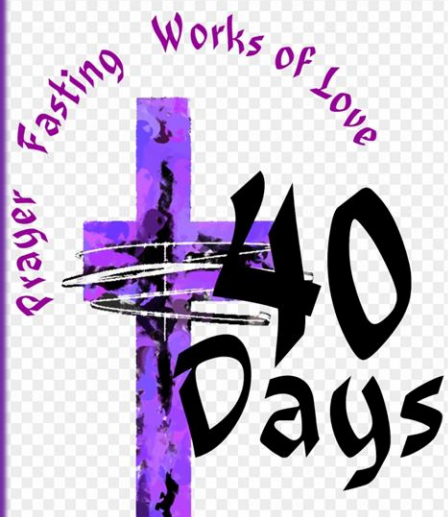

Pray for one another.

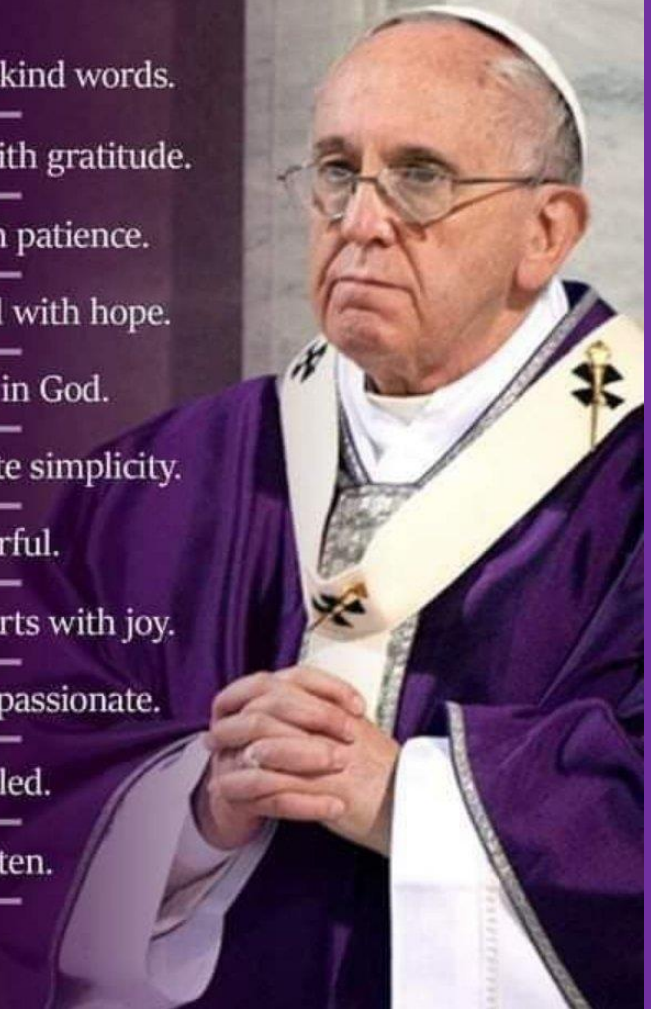

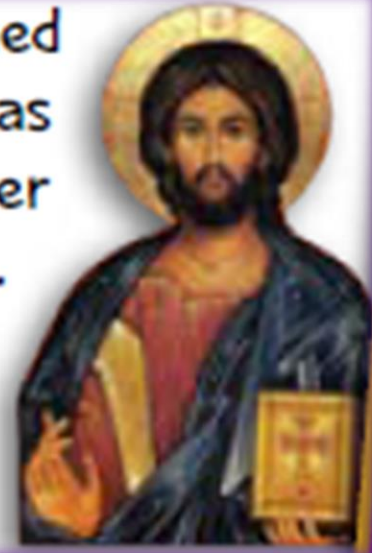
DO YOU WANT TO FAST THIS LENT?
