Year 3 came back with a spring in their step, a smile on their face & plenty of things to share with each other.


It was great to see you all back & wonderful to hear the chitter chatter.

This afternoon in our PSHE lesson we have been thinking about our dreams for the future, things we are looking forward to and things that make us happy.


We created ' Jars of Dreams'.

Yr2 pupils sequenced a story with their partner. The captions tell the story.








We practised our colour mixing skills by painting Spring flowers.










Yr 4 artwork in their version of Tiger in a Rainstorm by Henri Rousseau

WELL DONE EVERYONE, pupils and staff alike!


We were all ready for the weekend but it has been amazing to have a full school this week; a brilliant 99% attendance each day - that's just superb!



THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 14th March 2021



Nicodemus, a teacher of the law, came to Jesus one night. Jesus said to him, "The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. Yes, God

loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost but may have eternal life.
