...and more Science fun in Y6!










We have learned so much in Science week including discovering which creatures live or visit the trees in our grounds.

Years 5 and 6 had a fascinating and insightful virtual session with author SOPHIE ANDERSON (@sophieinspace)


Pupils thoroughly engaged with creating their own island of adventure...and Sophie replied: Brilliant group of young creatives! Thank you so much for hosting me :)



Mr. White and the team are proof reading new materials that we hope will help children in Years 4, 5 & 6 to participate in the beauty of the sacrament in school in a few weeks.






Jesus told the people this story: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard and he came looking for fruit on it but found none. He said to the man who looked after
