We hope everyone has planted the wildflower seeds we sent home.


We are looking forward to seeing them "spring" forth!






More Amazonian Rainforest masks designed in year 4. Next DT challenge is designing and making their homes.




The children worked really hard to describe the characters in the story.






Year 3 are looking at the parts of the mass and using their Mass cards to help sort out the different statements about the mass and the Bible readings for each part too.



Investigating the capacity of different containers We are learning lots of new mathematical vocabulary as well.






In year 4 the children started making their own rainforest homes using cardboard. We hope those in our community with links to Ireland had a Happy St Patrick's day





We celebrated St Patrick's Day with great joy, lots of clapping and some spontaneous dancing in our virtual <u>Wednesday Word</u> assembly





Exploring volume in Year Six using isometric paper. Our technical drawing skills are being put to the test! Investigating the distributive law of multiplication.








Beautiful work by Year 3 as they explored their Station of the Cross.





Some cards prepared for a pupil's extremely special relative about to celebrate a whole century of memories! Happy 100 year birthday Mary!




