



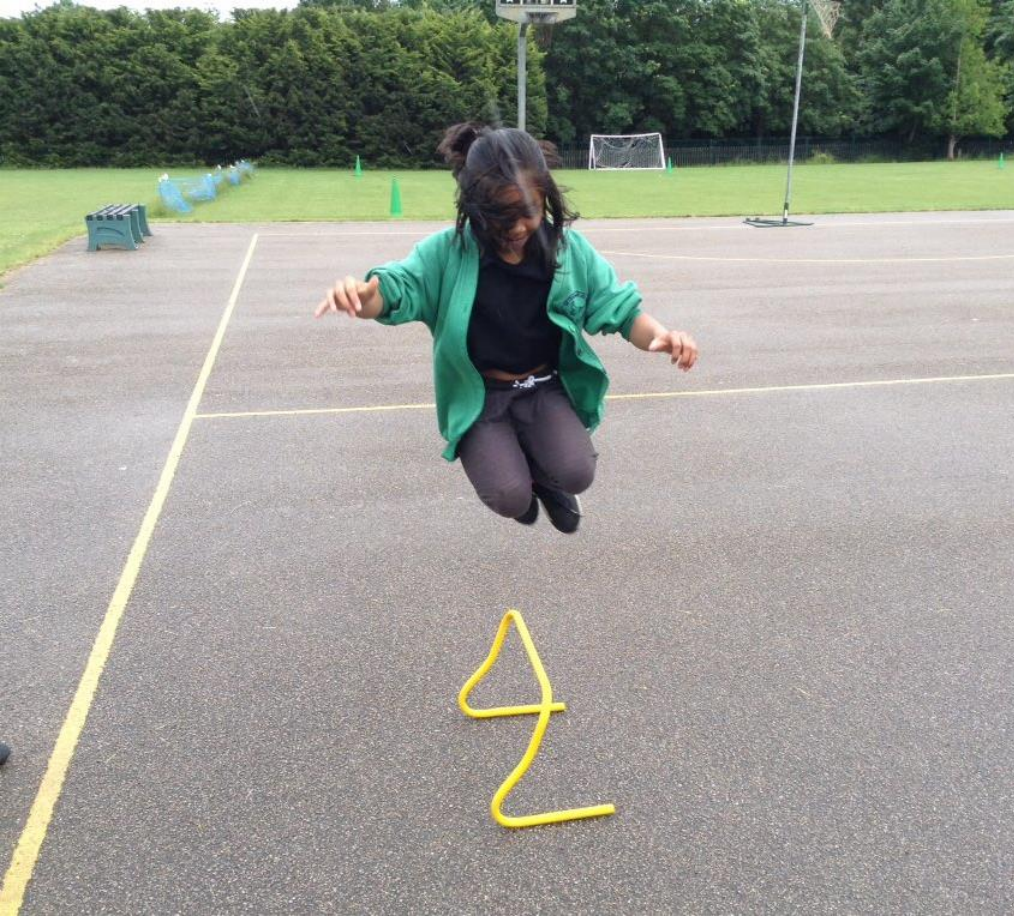

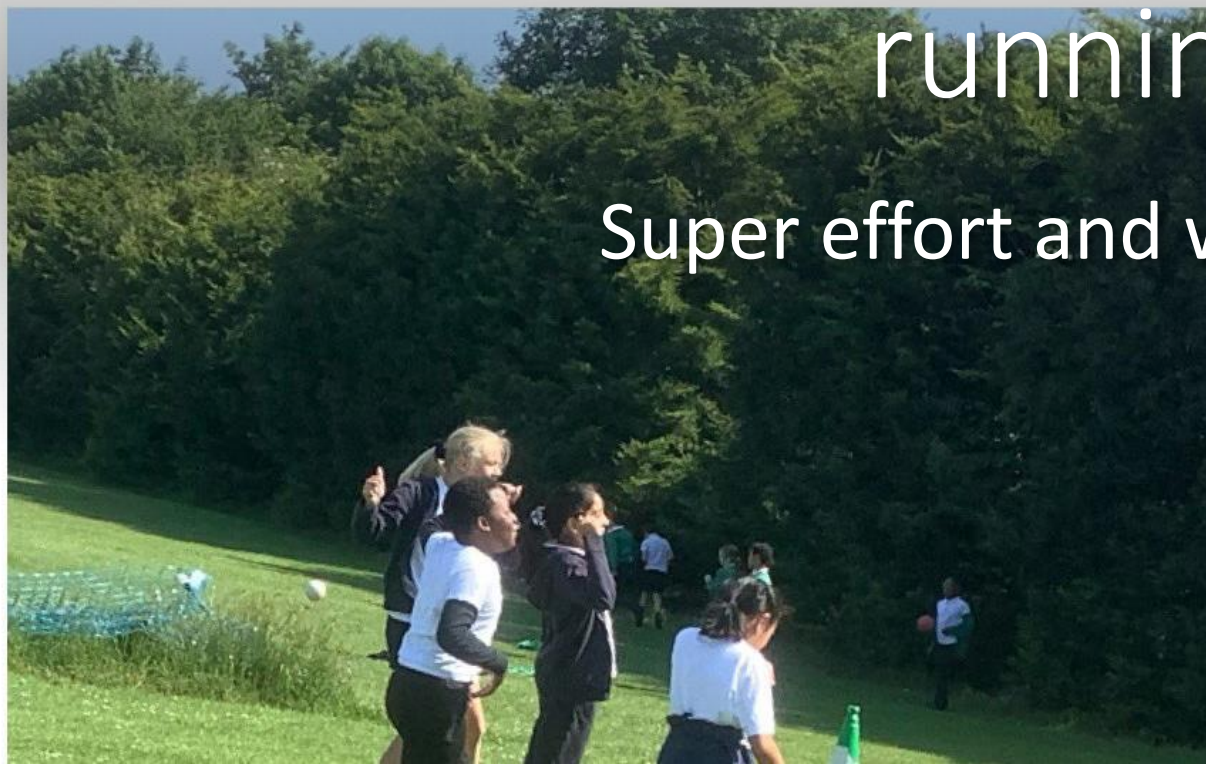

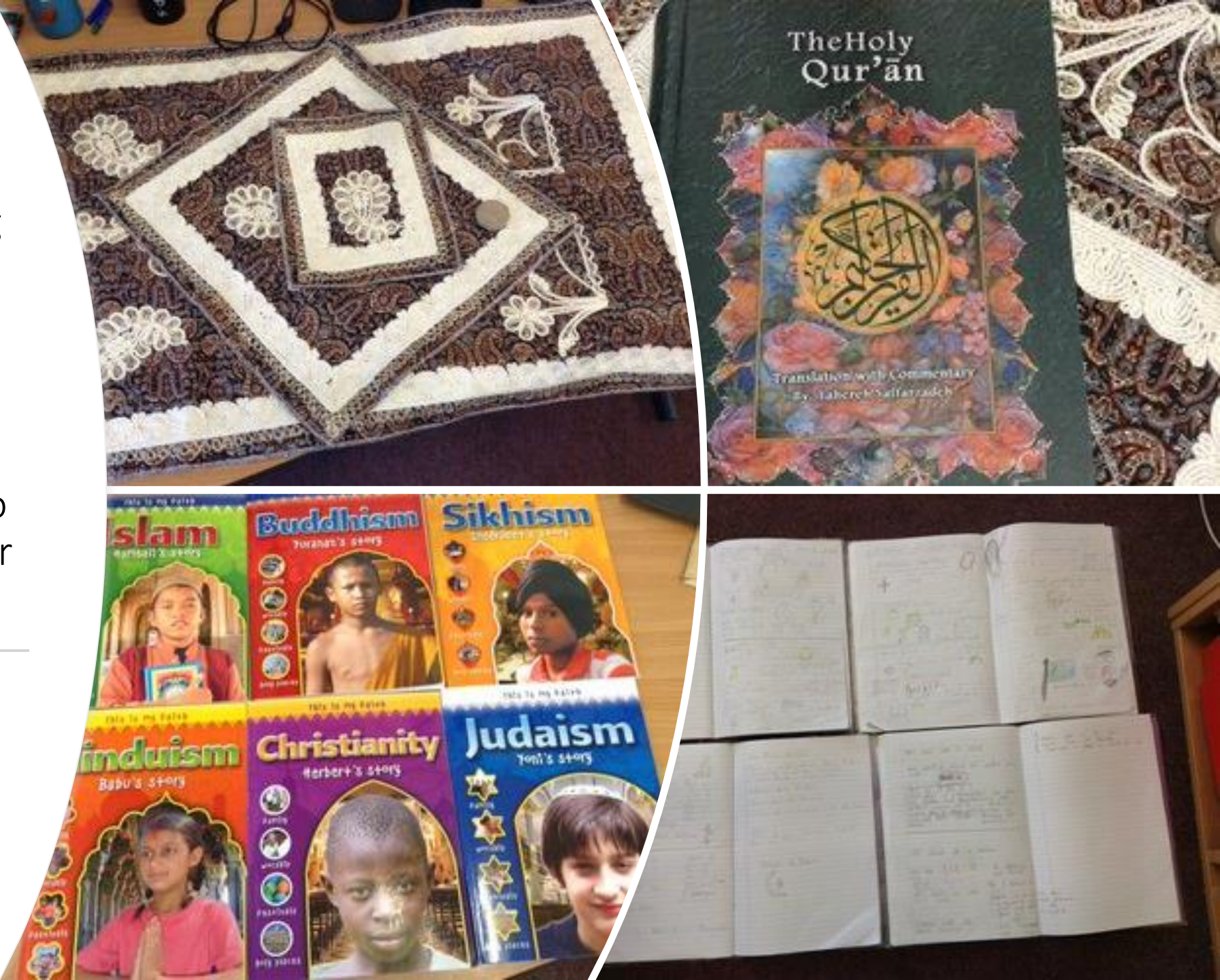

We were lucky enough to be able to look at a prayer mat and the Qur'an too.

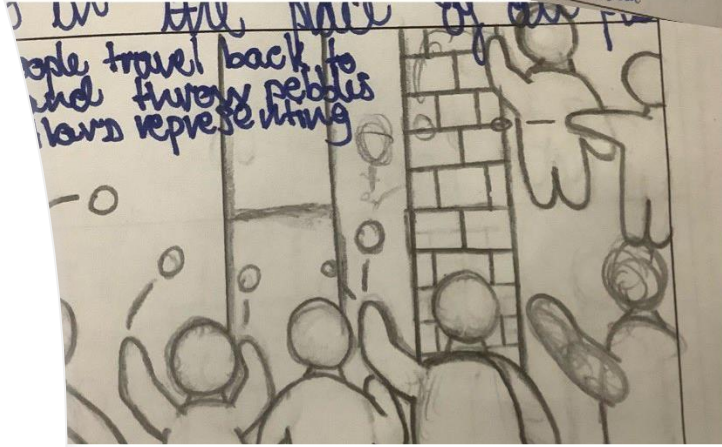


Exploring and finding out about the special pilgrimage to Makkah that Muslims try to make once in their lives, the Hajj.
