




Classes have responded to our St Joseph focus week in so many different ways, each having followed their own theme. Watch out for our **Year of St Joseph** film to follow ...

We said prayers and represented St. Joseph using different media.









Maya clay tiles crafted by Year Six Shakespeare

Year 1 Stein class wrote sentences to describe Pirate Pete! They really enjoyed this story







Reception are busy practising "ar" words. Well done Reception, great phonics work.

as represented by the colours of the five Olympic Rings.








Year 1 then created their very own island for Pirate Pete to visit.


Child Initiated Learning: reading the Bible






Y4 read each other's minds again with this game, learning how to talk in French about sports they play and express opinions.

Oh, there will always be somebody who is better at one of the things you are good at, but no one in the universe can reach the quality of your combination of talents, ideas, abilities and feelings.


Like a room full of musical instruments, some may excel alone, but no one can match the symphony sound when all are played together. You are special. You are rare.



The Library Summer Reading Challenge is here!






This year The Reading Agency has teamed up with WWF UK to inspire our young readers, through working together to stand up for our planet.
