Year 3 have been thinking about expanded noun phrases to describe some vegetables. It's all about advertising. *Can we tempt you?*

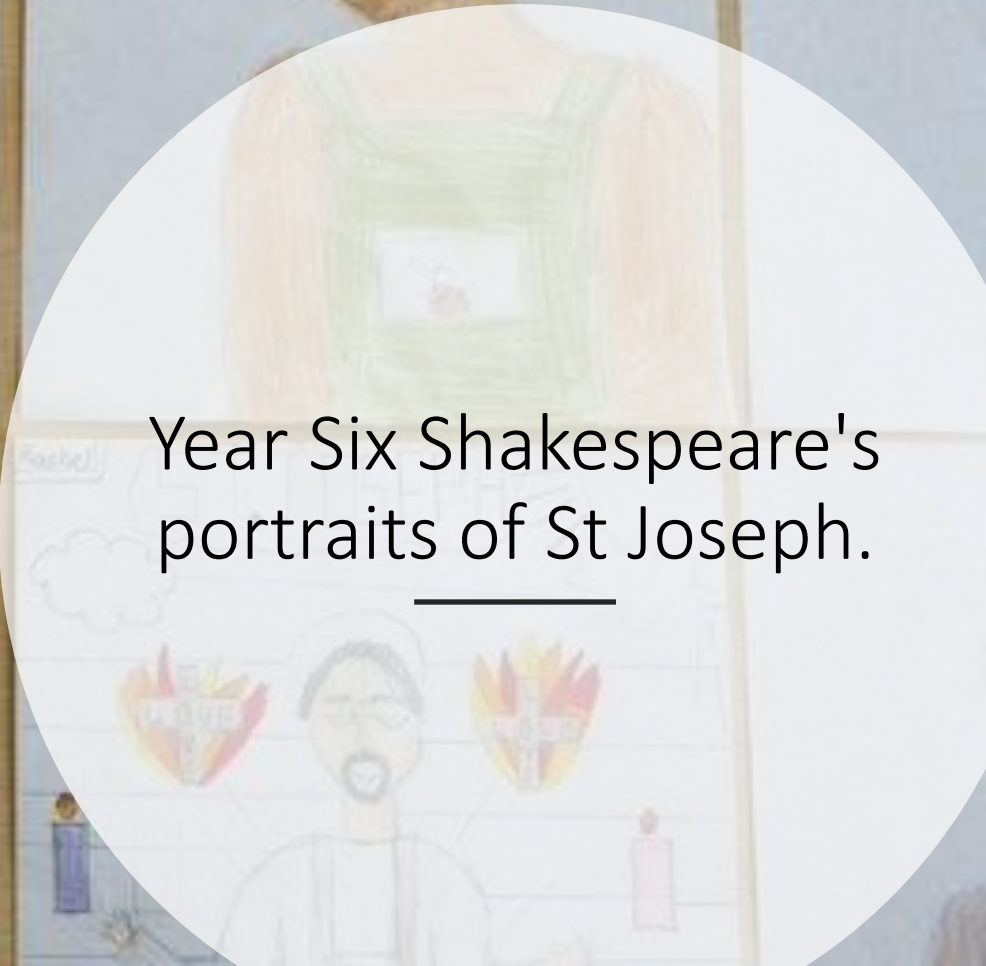


They continued with some observational vegetable drawings using the veg we used in English to do lots of drawing studies.
