Year 3 have been making their Advent promises. They have been learning about the Advent wreath and focused their promises on how they would be loving, peaceful, hopeful or joyful. fine .

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


# Year Six have been exploring parabolic curves.










The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaiah: "Look! I am sending my messenger ahead - he will prepare your way. A voice cries out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way

of the Lord, make his paths straight." And so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. People from the land of Judaea and the city of Jerusalem came to him and, as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan, they confessed their sins. But John said, "There is someone else to come – someone who is more powerful than I am. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit."
