
Lots of exciting Christmas themed activities were ready for the EYFS children on Monday morning!















Reception children are learning all about counting this week.


















## Year 5 shared their amazing cardboard creations - fantastic ideas and lots of hard work!

Lots of fun in Reception acting out the Christmas Story.


















Nursery's children are singing in full voice:

of various sizes.















Our School Parliament also spent time preparing the hall for Reconciliation on Thursday; fabulous team effort.










### THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH Sunday 11th December 2022

While John the Baptist was in prison, he heard what Christ was doing and he sent some of his followers to ask Christ, "Are you the one sent by God, or do we have to wait for someone else?" Jesus answered, "Go back

and tell John what you hear and see: the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cured, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life. The Good News is being announced to the poor; and happy are those who do not lose faith in me." As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: "He is the one of whom scripture says: 'Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you'. I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, one greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is."
