

A Lift-the-Flap Fairy Tale

Reception were excited to listen to their new fairy tale this week- The Gingerbread Man. Nursery listened to 'The Three Little Pigs' by Nick Sharratt and Stephen Tucker.

"The big bad wolf came and blew he houses down." (All of them?) "No, not all of them, two actually!" "The brick house was too strong!" (How was it too strong?) "Because, it didn't blow down!"....

The children concentrated well using joining techniques, showing perseverance and determination to complete a task. "I got two pigs." (How many pigs are in the story?) "Three!" (You have two pigs, how many more do you need?") "I need one more pig!".

They also used props to retell the story

Reception pretending to be sea creatures in their dance lesson this week and being super creative!








Year 3 have been learning about blogging on Purple Mash. We reminded each other how we stay safe when using the Internet and how important passwords are.

Year 5 made weighing machines, in connection with their science topic on forces.





(replicating the brick pattern) "This is the table...these are the pictures on the wall."

Year One formed an orchestra this week. We enjoyed exploring instruments and changing the tempo!






Year 2 scientists investigating the absorbency of different materials. The room was buzzing with excitement.




Another busy afternoon in Year 5, creative collaboration with milk cartons. Thank you to the great helpers for washing & preparing all those cartons this week!








Y6 exploring series circuits and investigating how they can be constructed in different ways

Dear Lord Jesus, please help our family to grow in your love and to • share your love with others through the way we live our lives. Amen.




