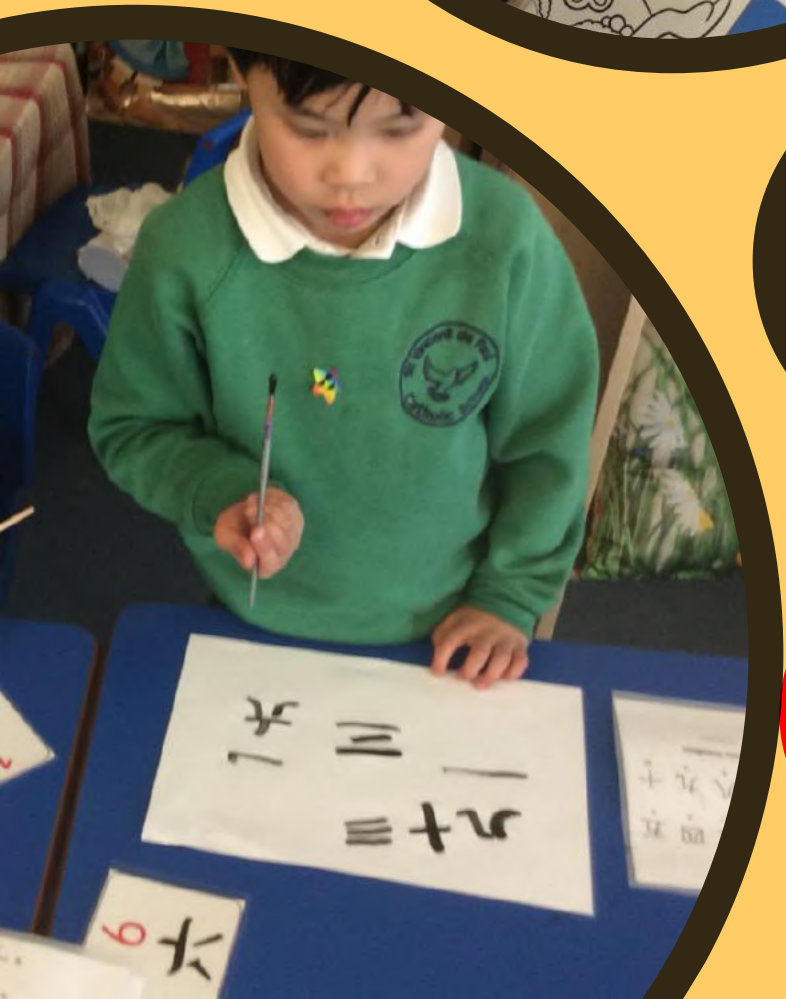
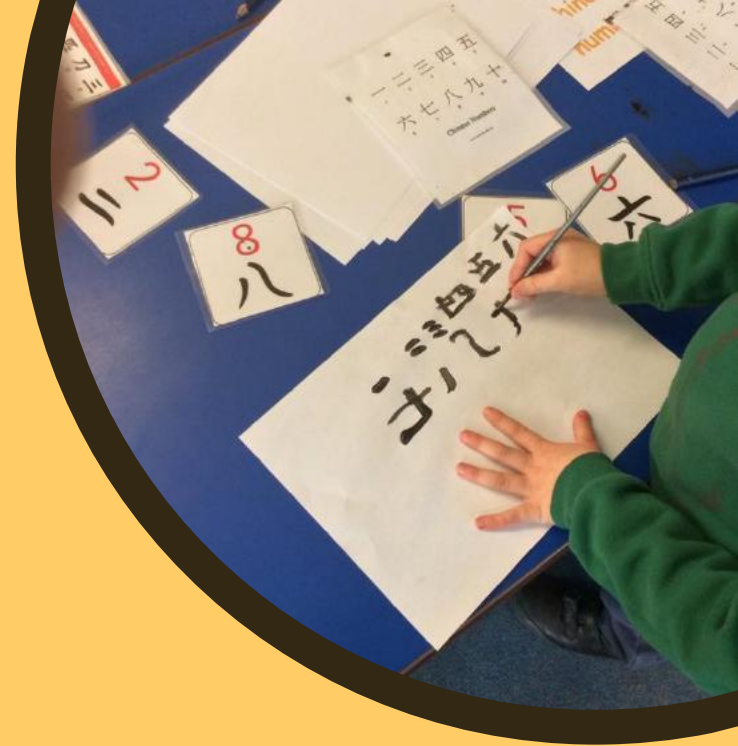
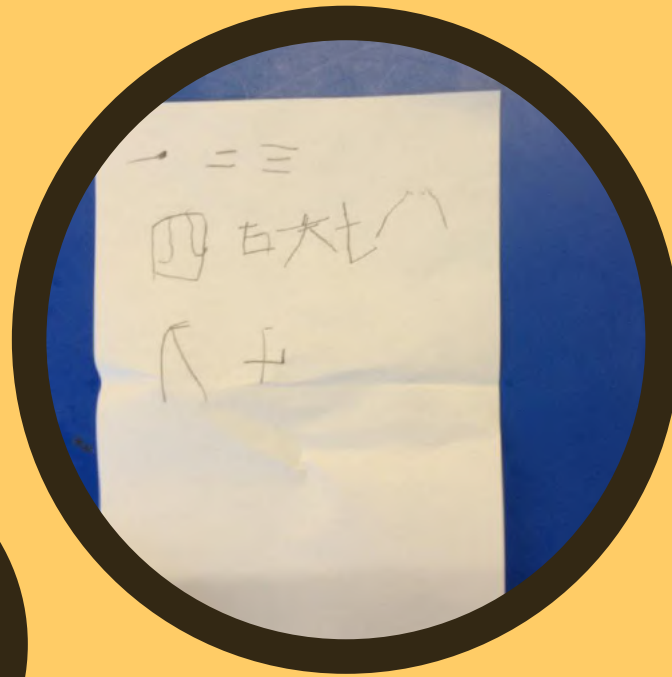


After reading the story "Little Red Riding Hood" two children in Reception acted out the story. The children wrote some food items for Red Riding Hood as an independent Literacy task.



Year 3 are re-telling the story of Fantastic Mr. Fox in the style of a cave painting.





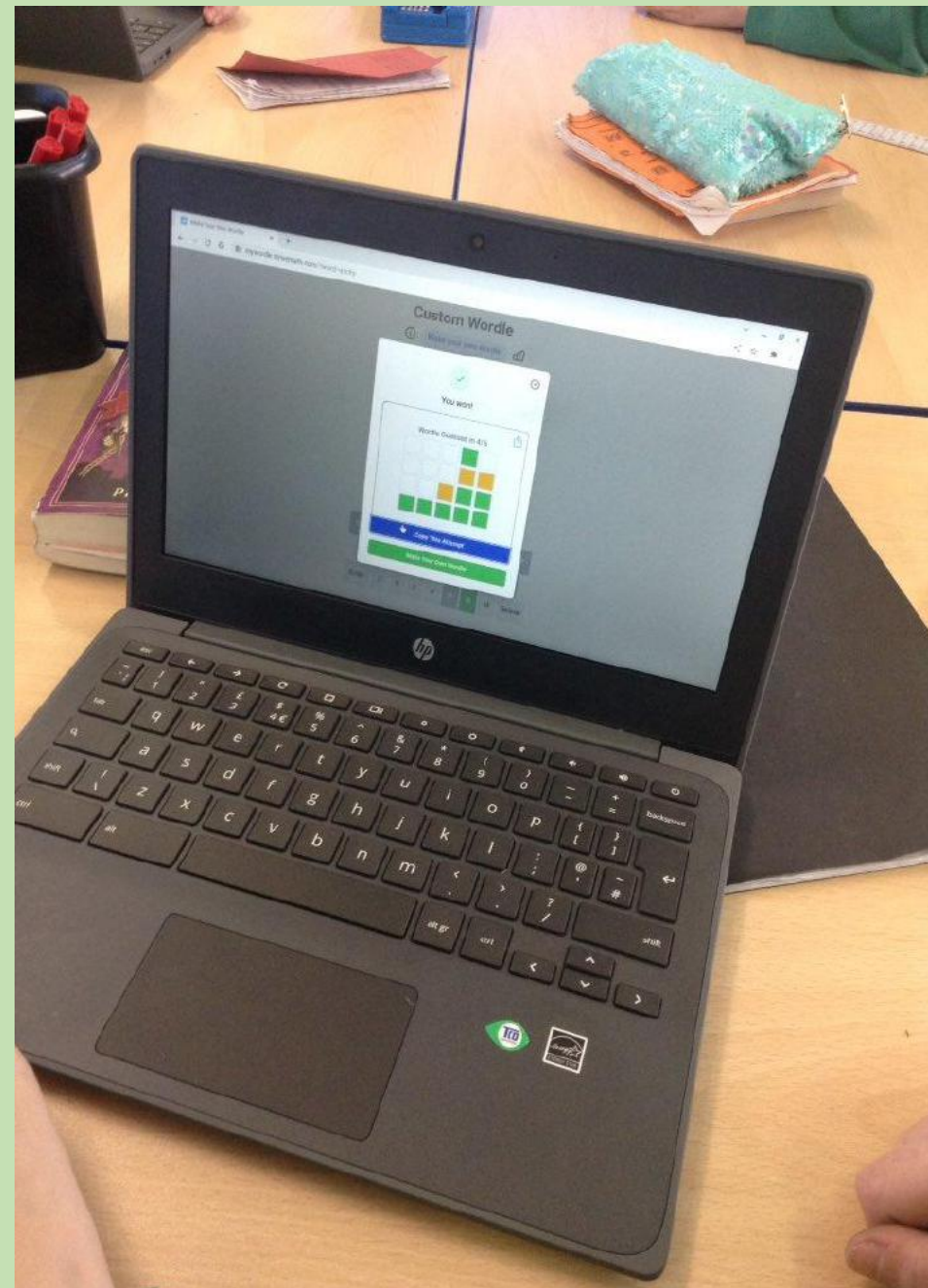
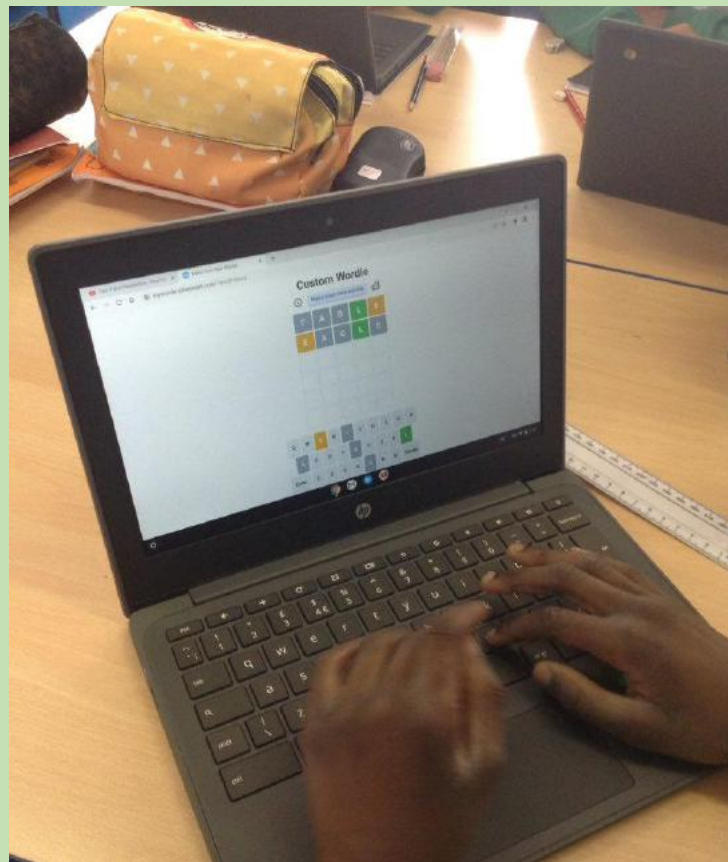
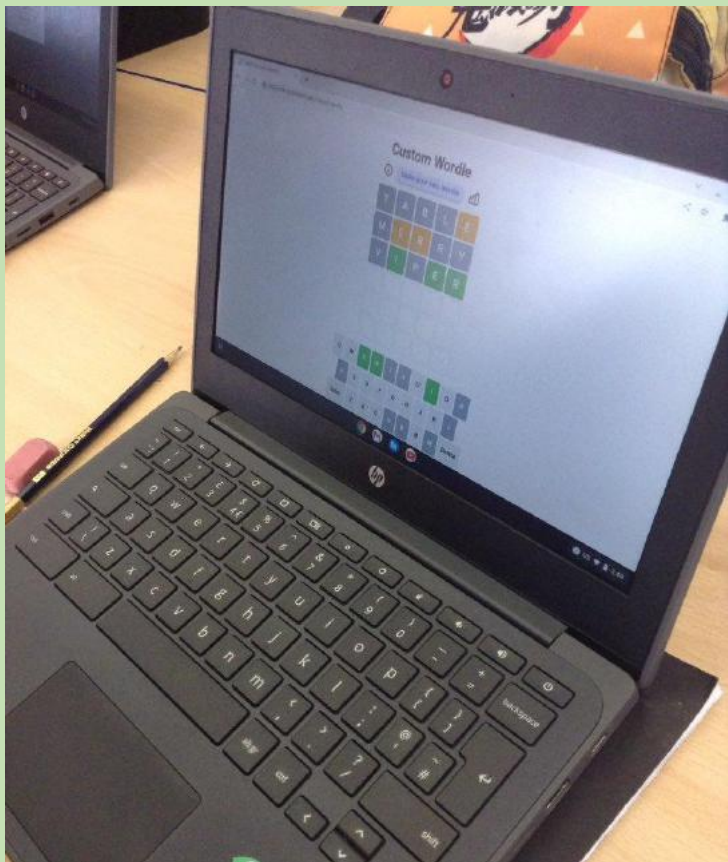

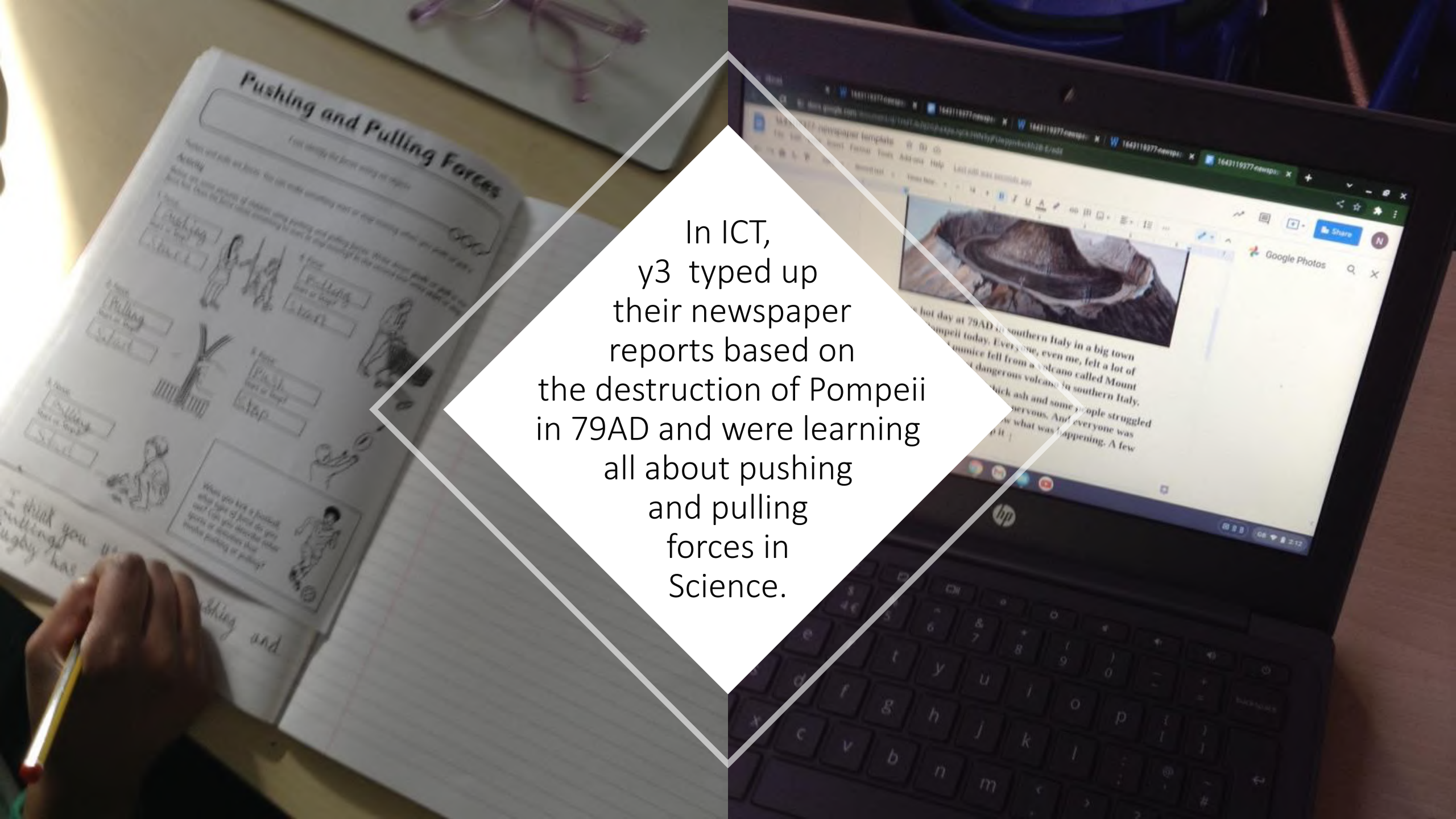
Y6 testing our vocabulary and deduction skills with our very own Wordle games!





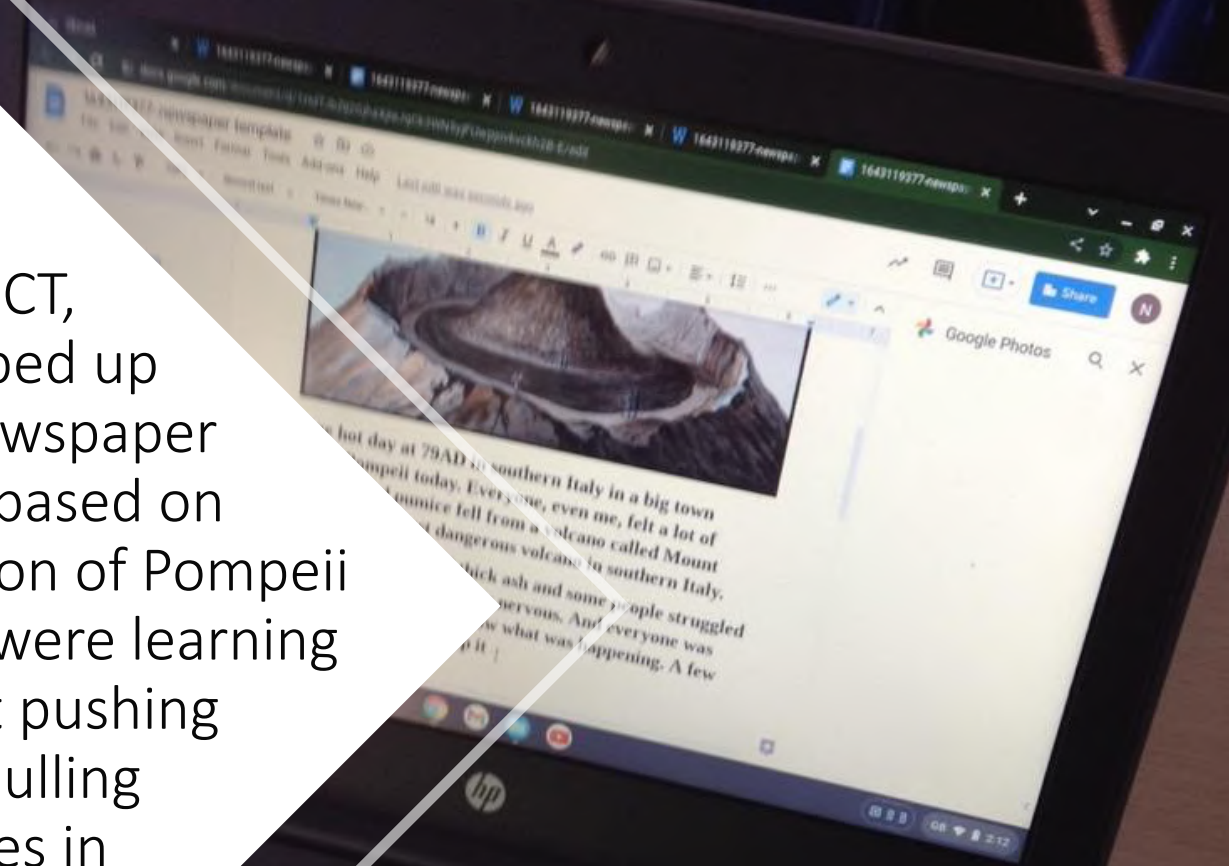
Reception had great fun in PE pretending to be rockets and spacemen exploring space. They also did some great number formation.





Pushing and Pulling Forces

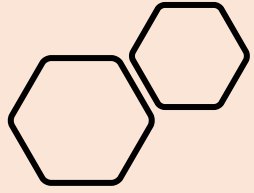

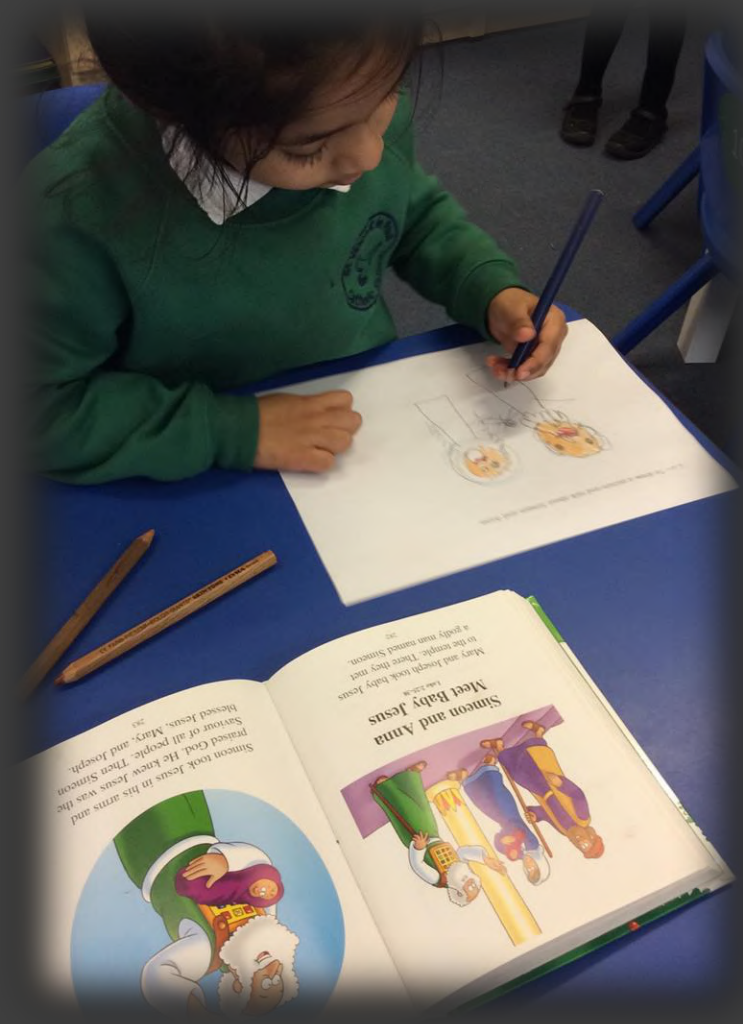


Year 2 made clay flatbreads after learning about The Feeding of the 5000 miracle performed by Jesus.

Jesus being presented in the Temple.



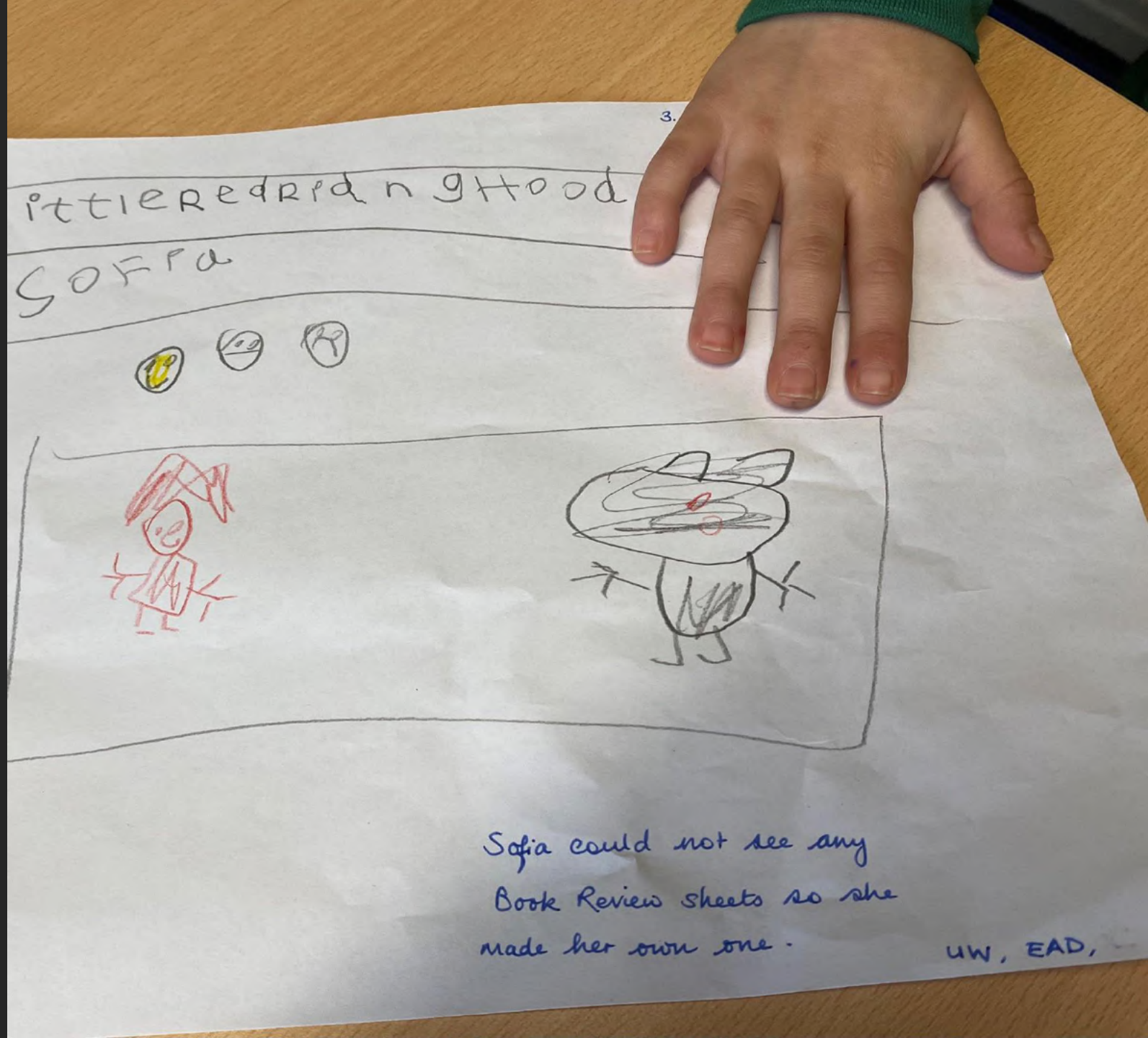


Year One

As part of our weather explorers project, the Year One children looked at, felt and described ice. There was lots of excitement on Friday when it snowed!

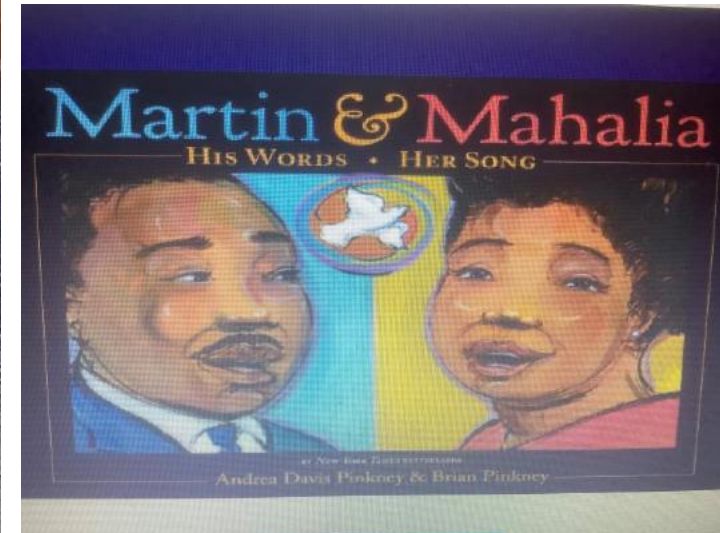
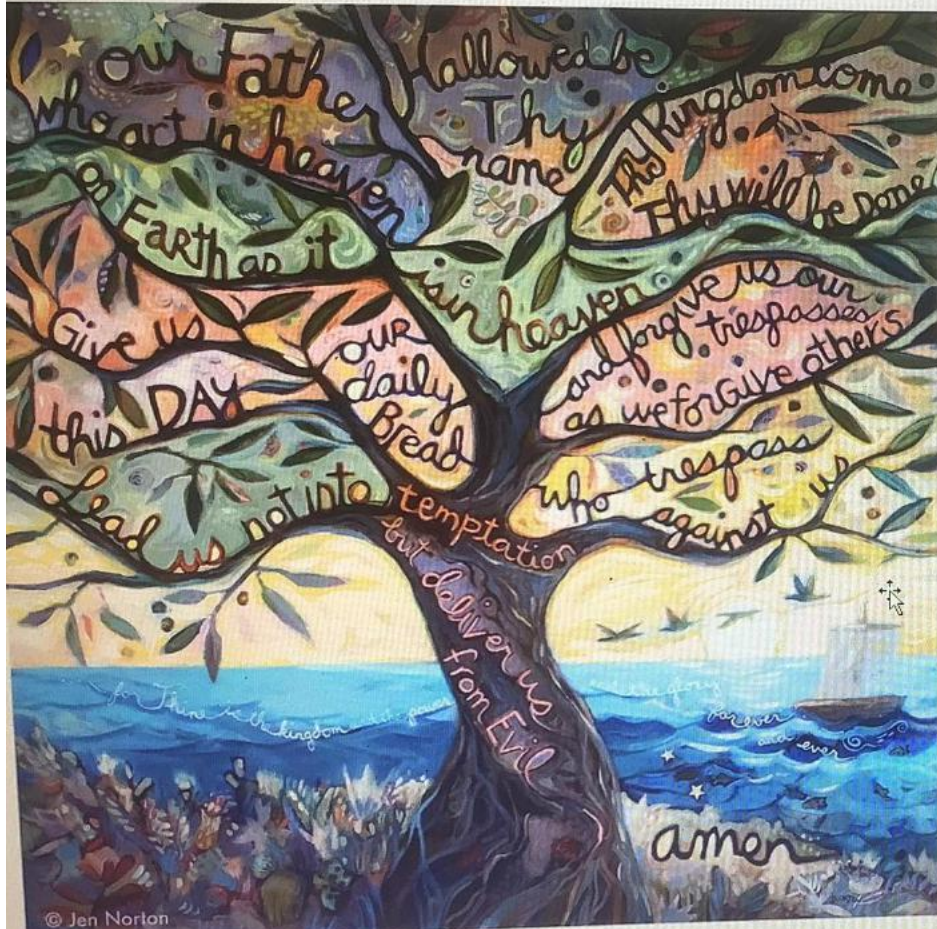

Using puppets to retell the story of the week 'The Gingerbread Man'. Fabulous story voices!

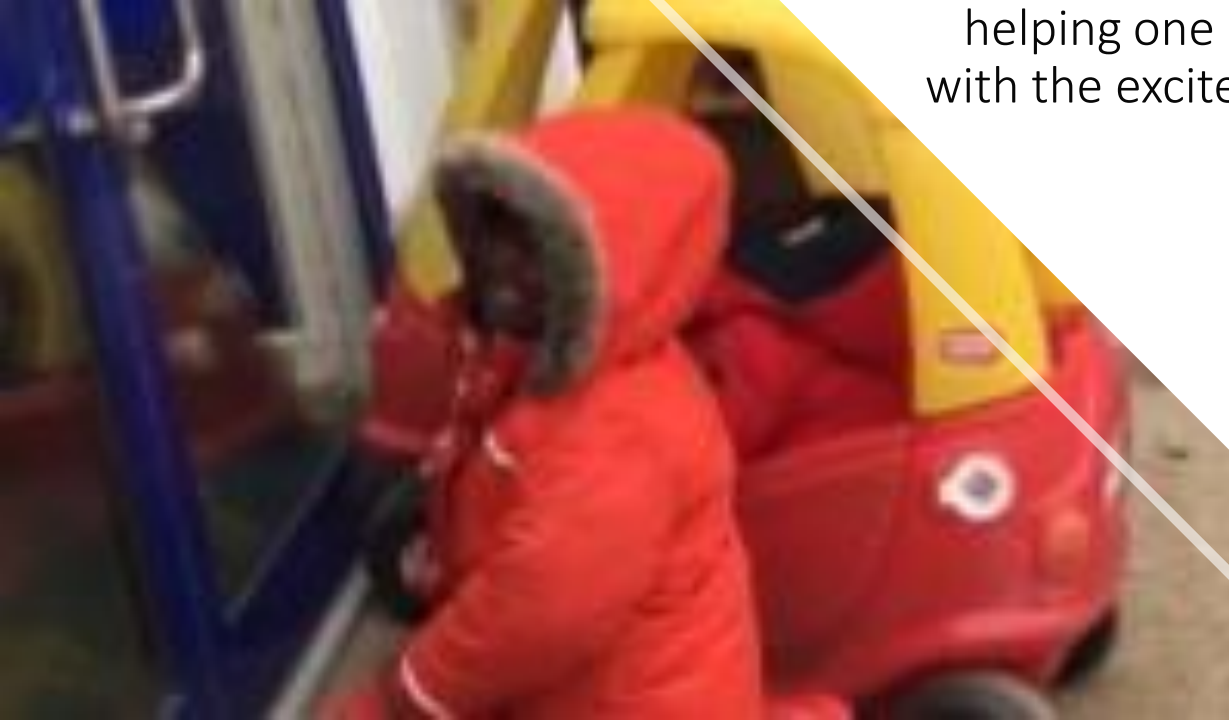


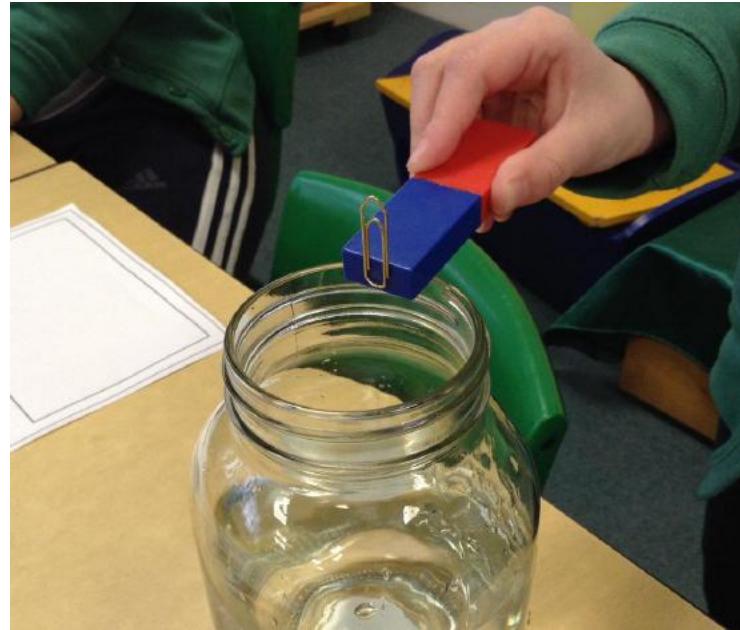

Initiating a game and practising counting 1-10. Well done for helping one another to join in with the excitement of the game.

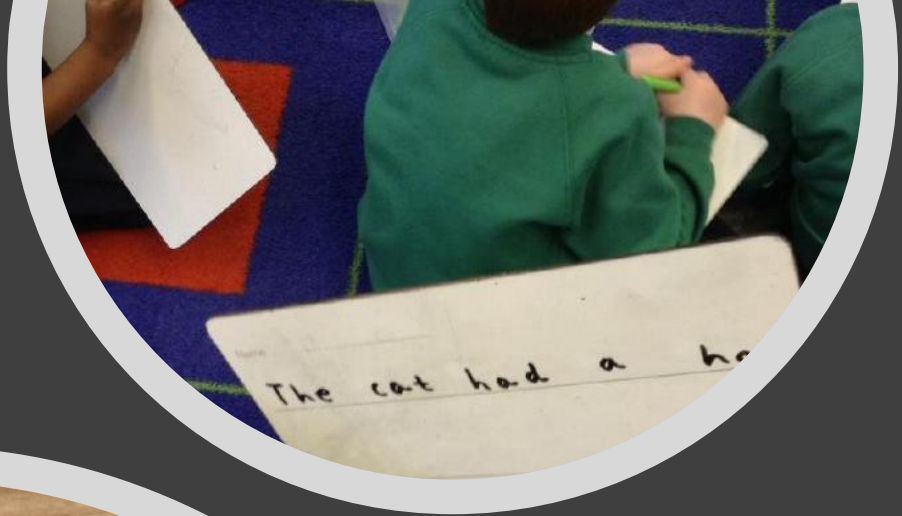

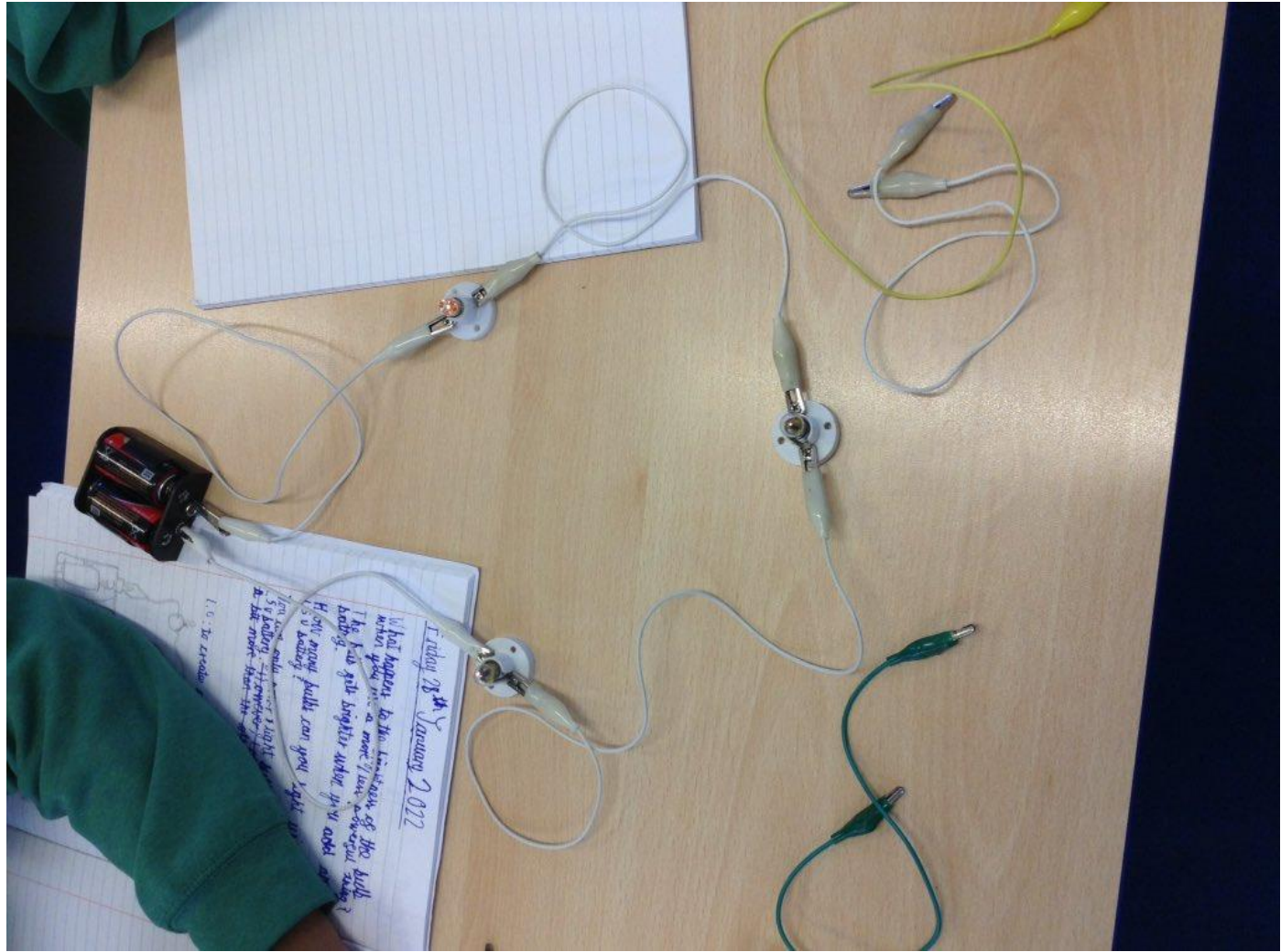

We are practising our cutting skills this morning in Reception Mozart. Making foxes from the Gingerbread man story!





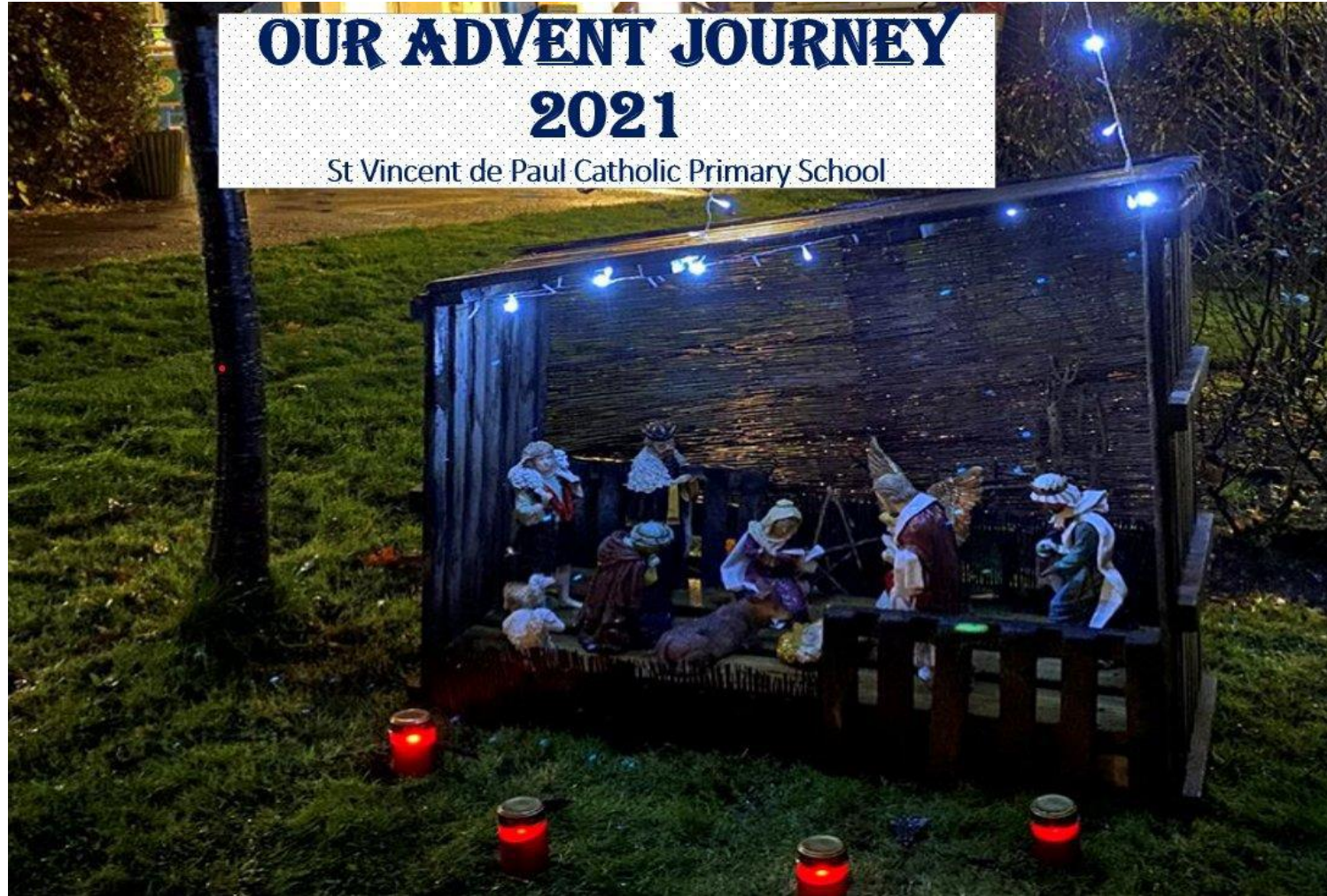

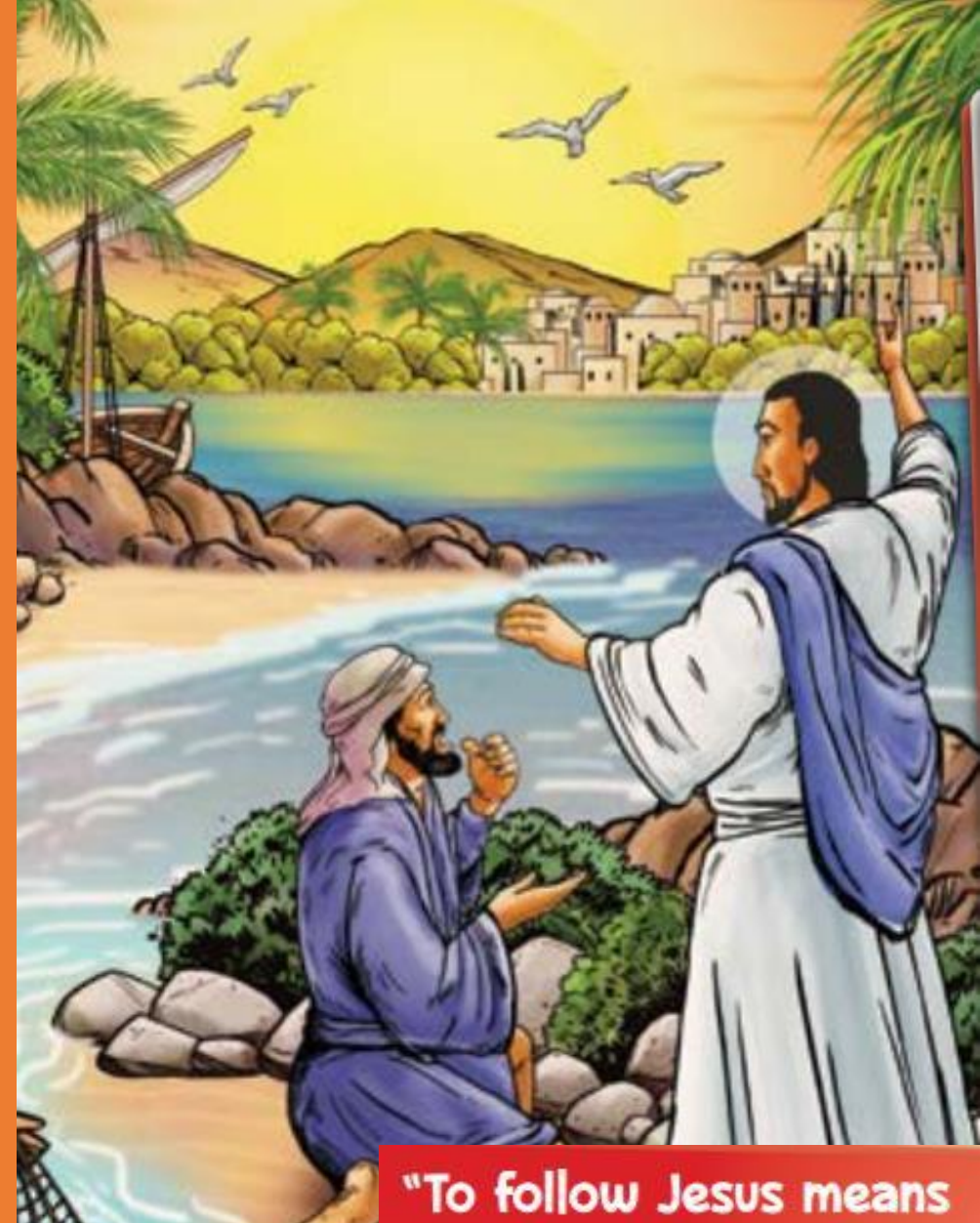
