Reception really enjoyed going on a bug hunt












Reception were super excited to start our new topic of minibeasts!


Watch out for the next big question - what will go inside?!

Year One were exploring number bonds to 20, working methodically, using a tens frame.





The Nursery children have been exploring colour and shape: "Red and yellow makes orange!"

Year 5 has been learning how to use the count of 4 to keep our beat in time and Year 3 investigated statements about nutritional values from food labels.






Great number writing in Reception.

CHAPELLE SAINT-VINCENT DE PAUL

Fondateur à Paris des prêtres de la Mission et des filles de la Charité (1581-1660), venu à Montmartre se ressourcer dans la prière.

Elle nous rappelle qu'Alexandre Legentil (1821-1889) et Hubert Rohault de Fleury (1828-1910), initiateurs du Vœu national, furent des membres actifs des conférences de Saint-Vincent de Paul, fondées par Frédéric Ozanam au service des pauvres. Elles soutiendront en 1870 le projet de la construction d'une église votive à Paris.

CHAPEL OF SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL Saint Vincent de Paul founded the Congregation of the Mission and the Daughters of Charity in Paris from 1581-1660. He came to Montmartre to renew himself in prayer.

This chapel reminds us that Alexandre Legentil (1821-1889) and Hubert Rohault de Fleury (1828-1910), initiators of the National Vow, were active members of the Conferences of Saint Vincent de Paul, founded by Frédéric Ozanam in the service of the poor. In 1870 they supported the construction of a votive church in Paris.

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
