One person pretended to be the robot and their partner used directional language to direct them to different places.

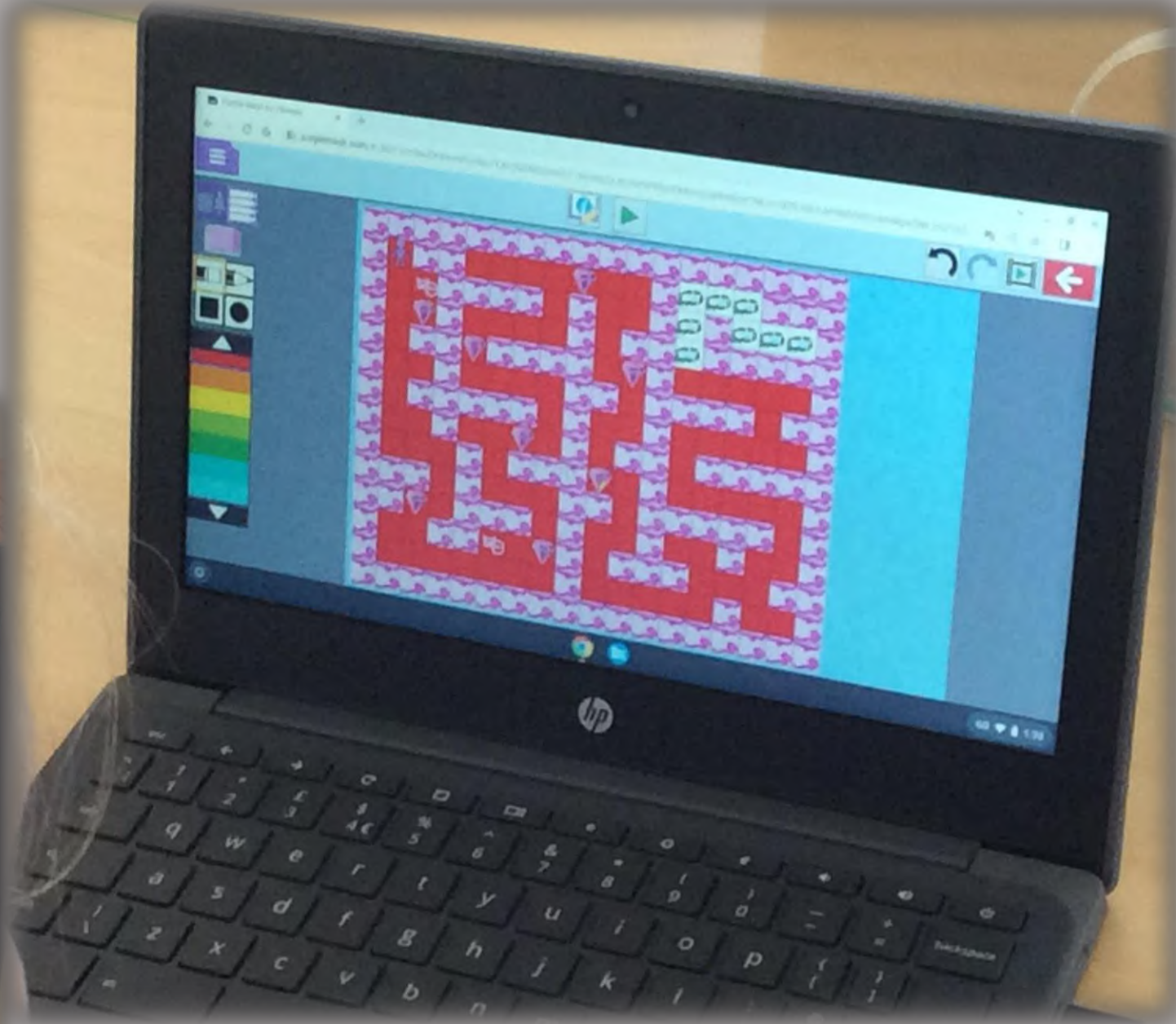
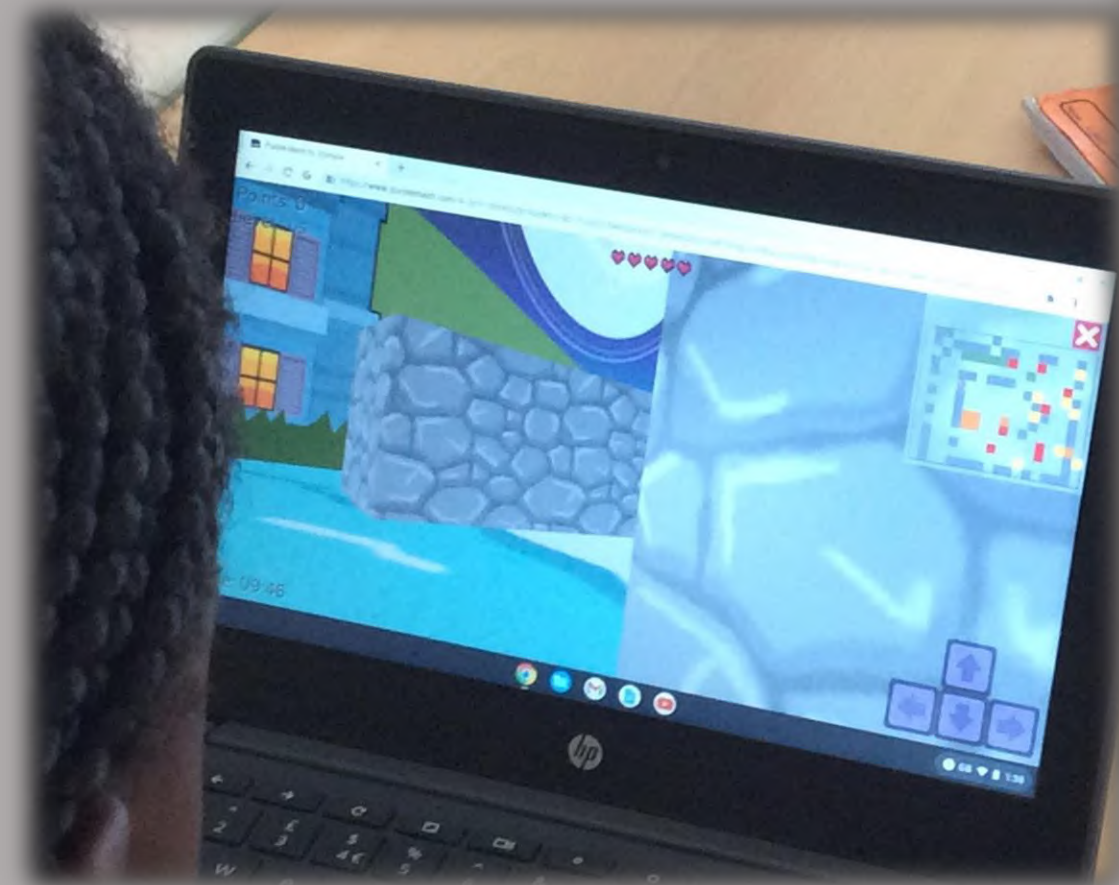


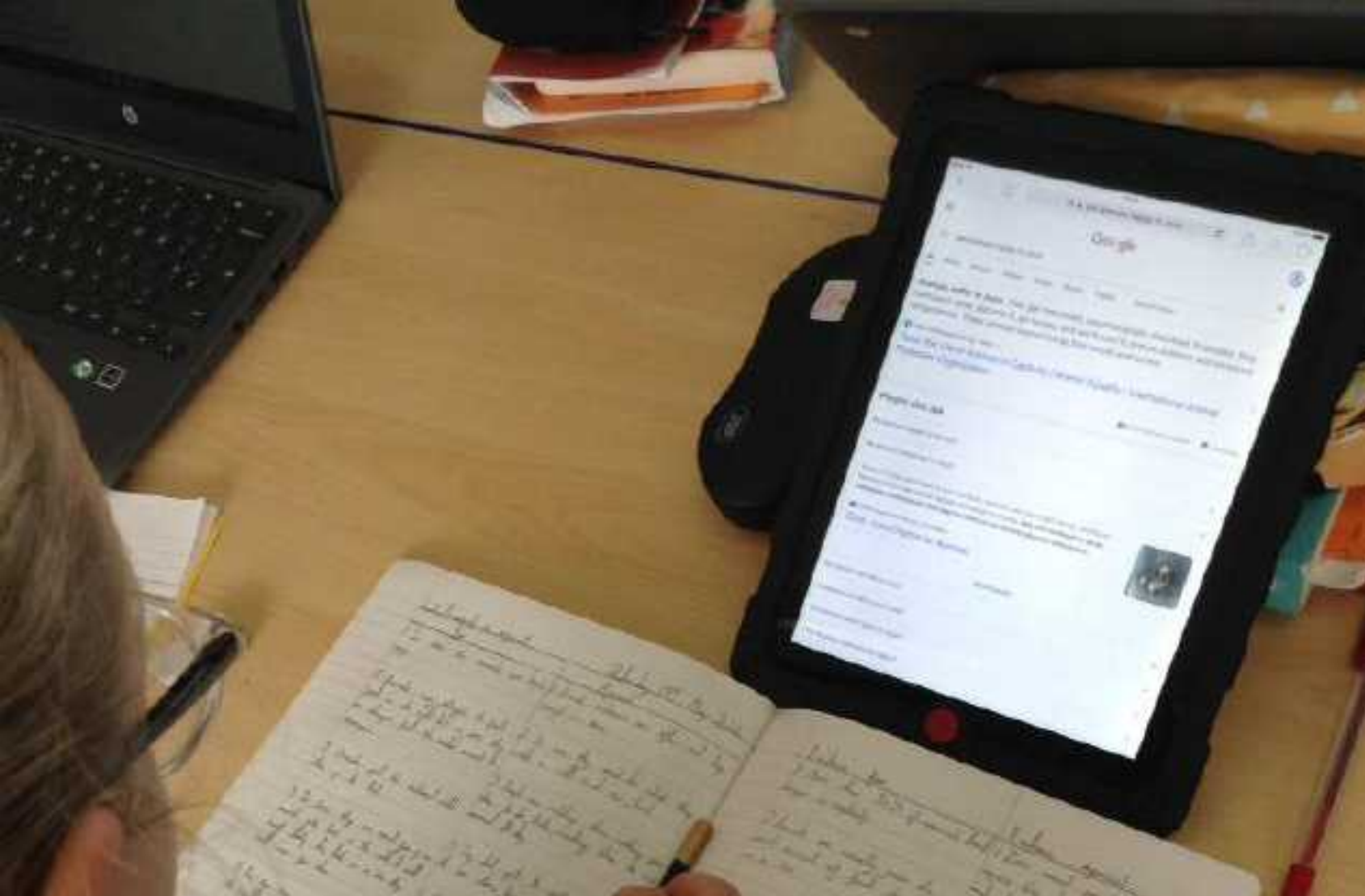


The Year 1 children had a fabulous time exploring the beautiful new resources in our outdoor learning area this week.

ICT.

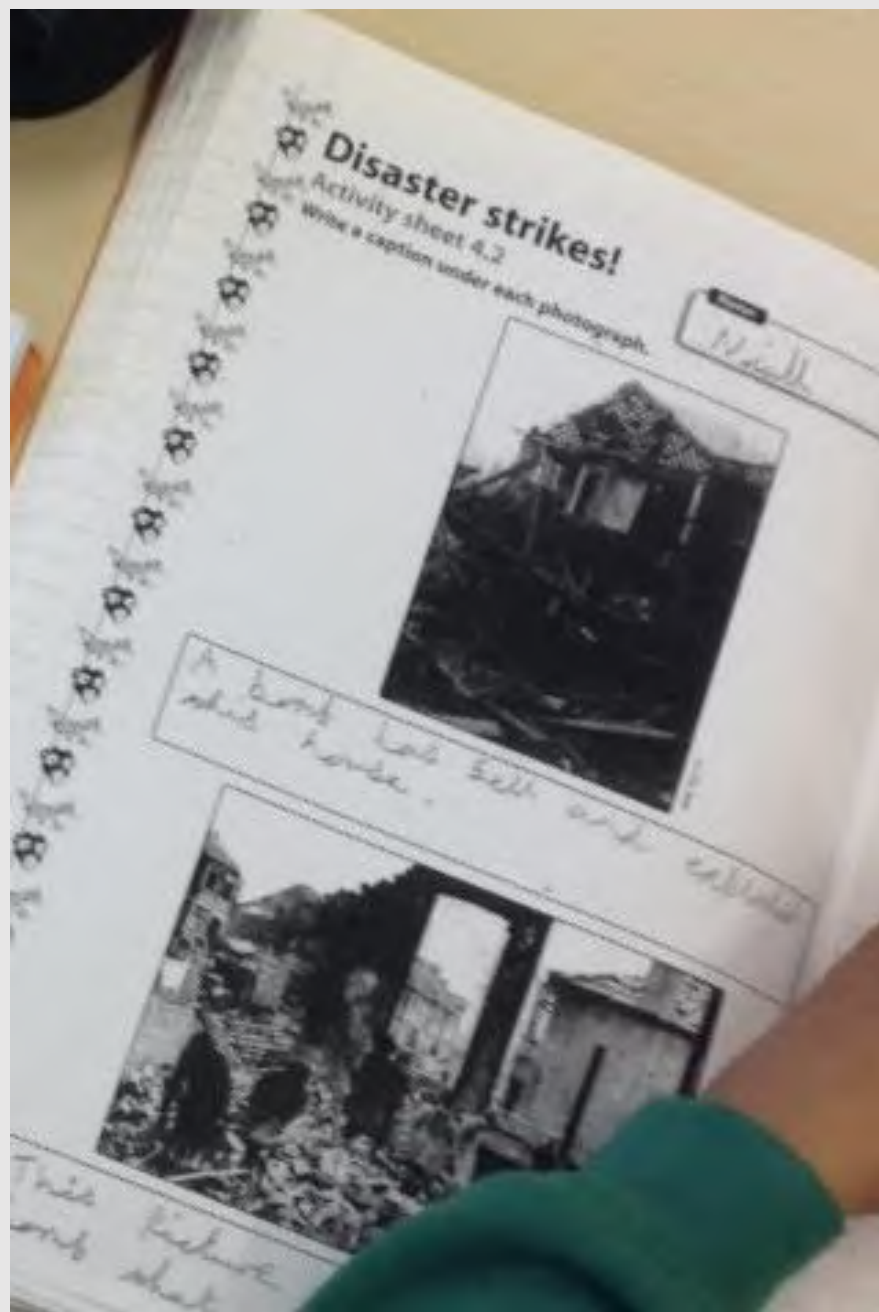




Y6 researched evidence to provide a balanced argument about whether animals should be kept in captivity.
