We wanted to find out what helped the children in Reconciliation so our School Parliament gathered some pupil voice.

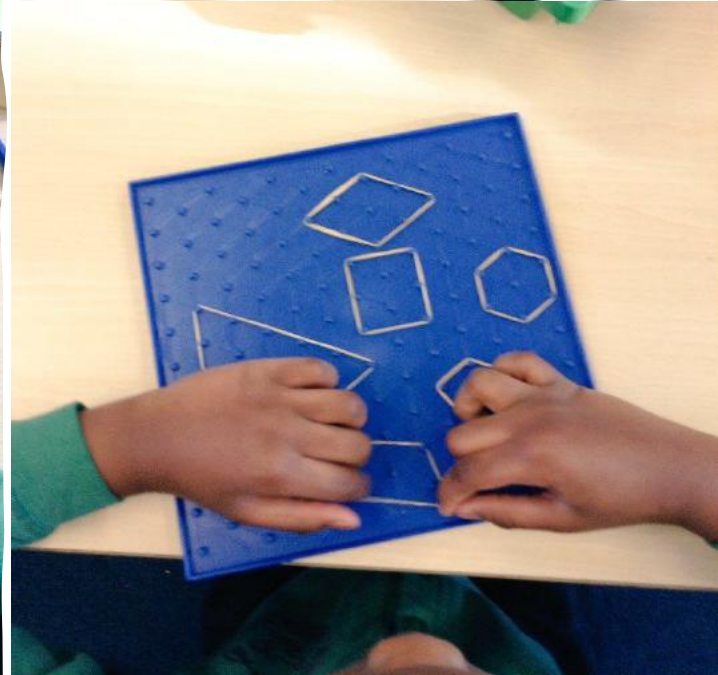
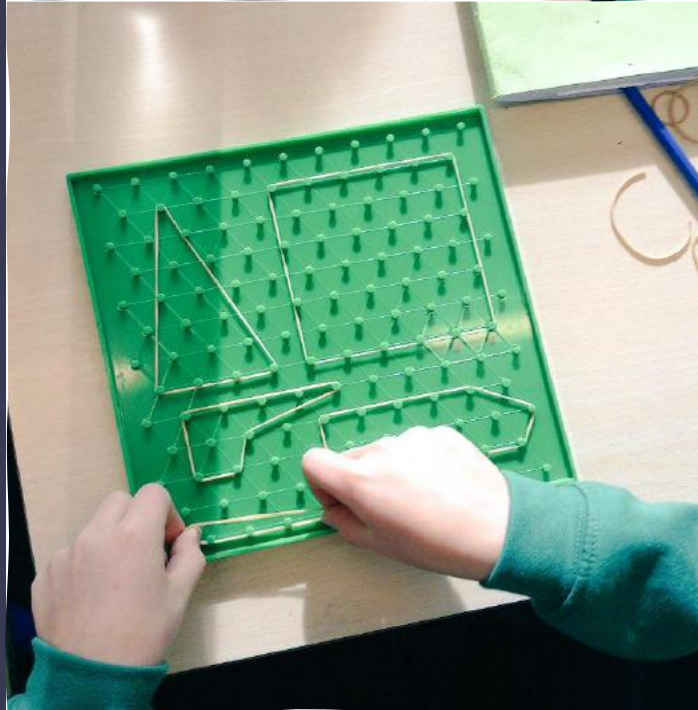
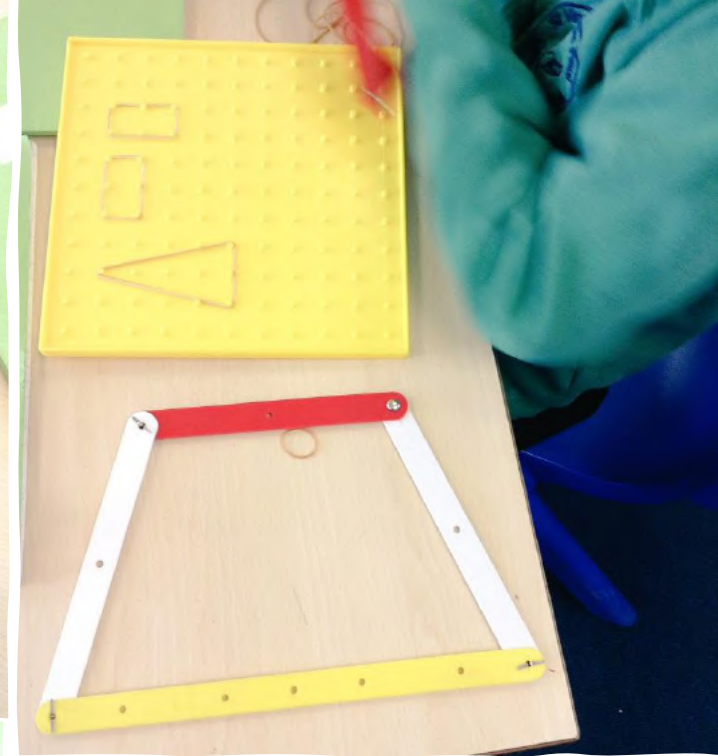
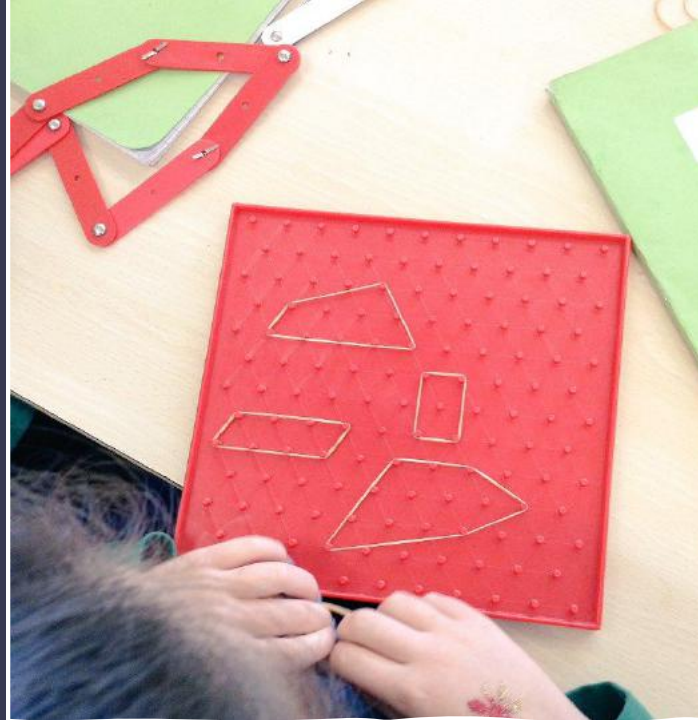
What helped you in your Reconciliation?

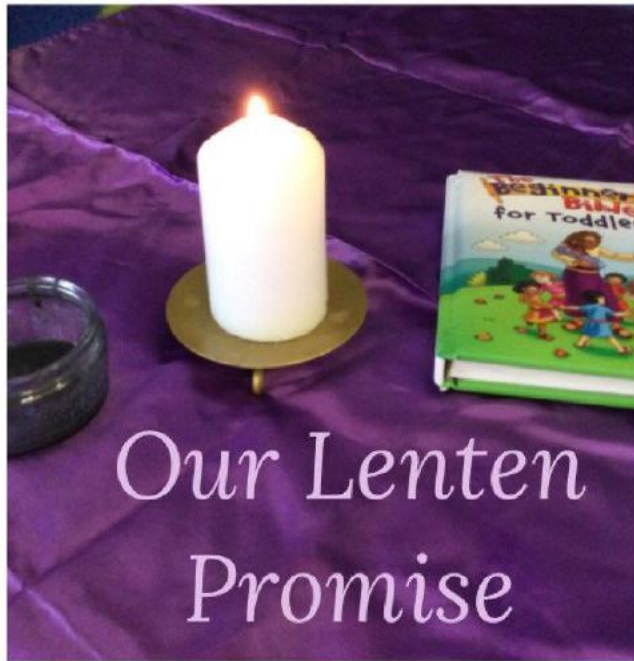
Liked the music	I liked the place to go to with the chairs after	It was good to reflect after and being there as long as you want	It all felt special

Year 3 have been making regular and irregular polygons, connecting the number of sides to the number of angles and vertices.

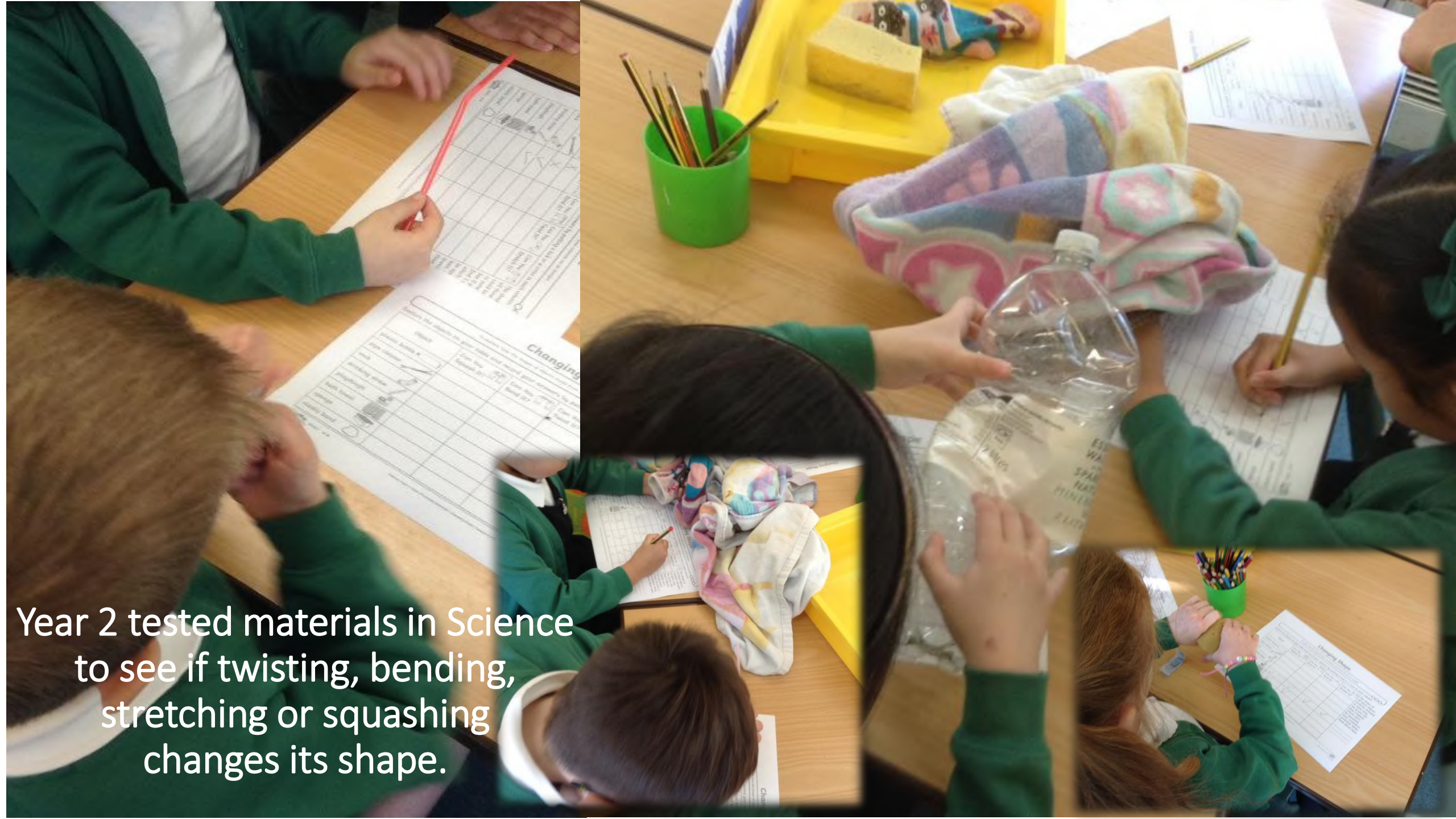

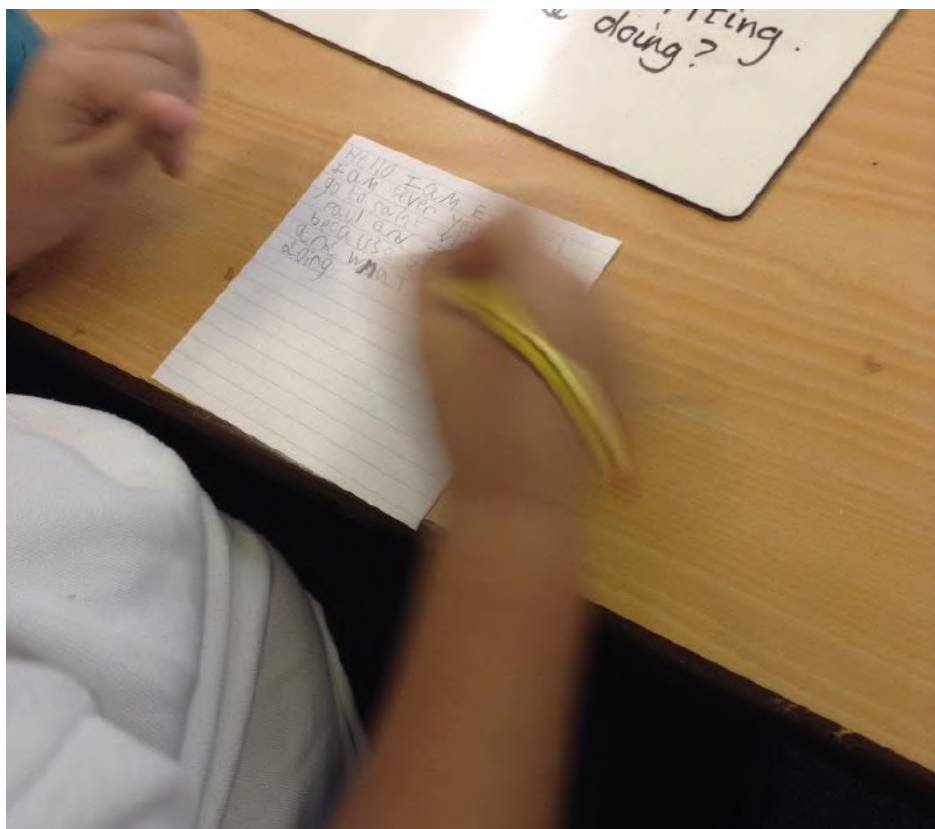
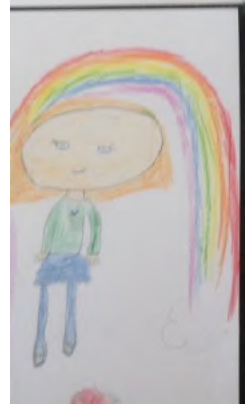




Year 2 tested materials in Science to see if twisting, bending, stretching or squashing changes its shape.

"She felt blue!"

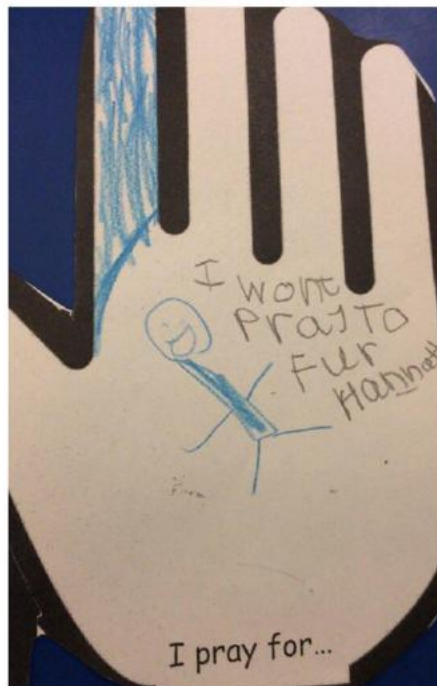
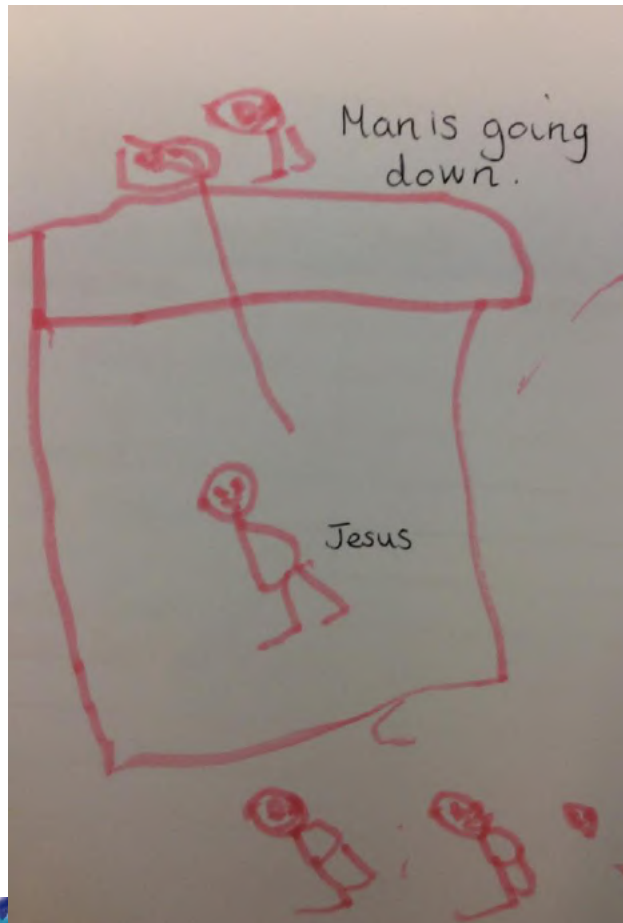
Mother Mary remembered what angel

Venn and Carroll diagrams.

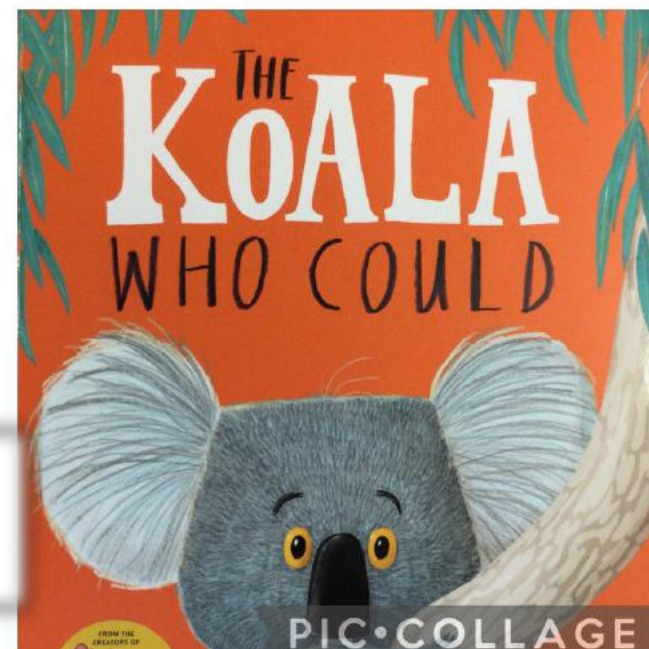
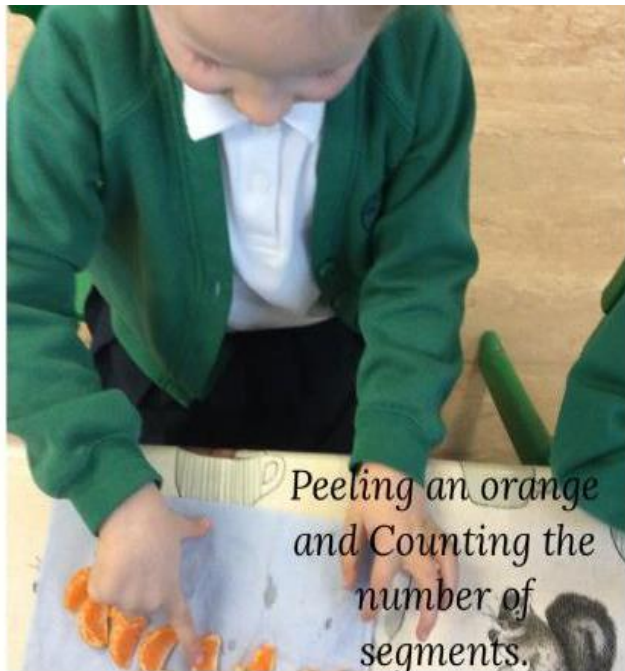

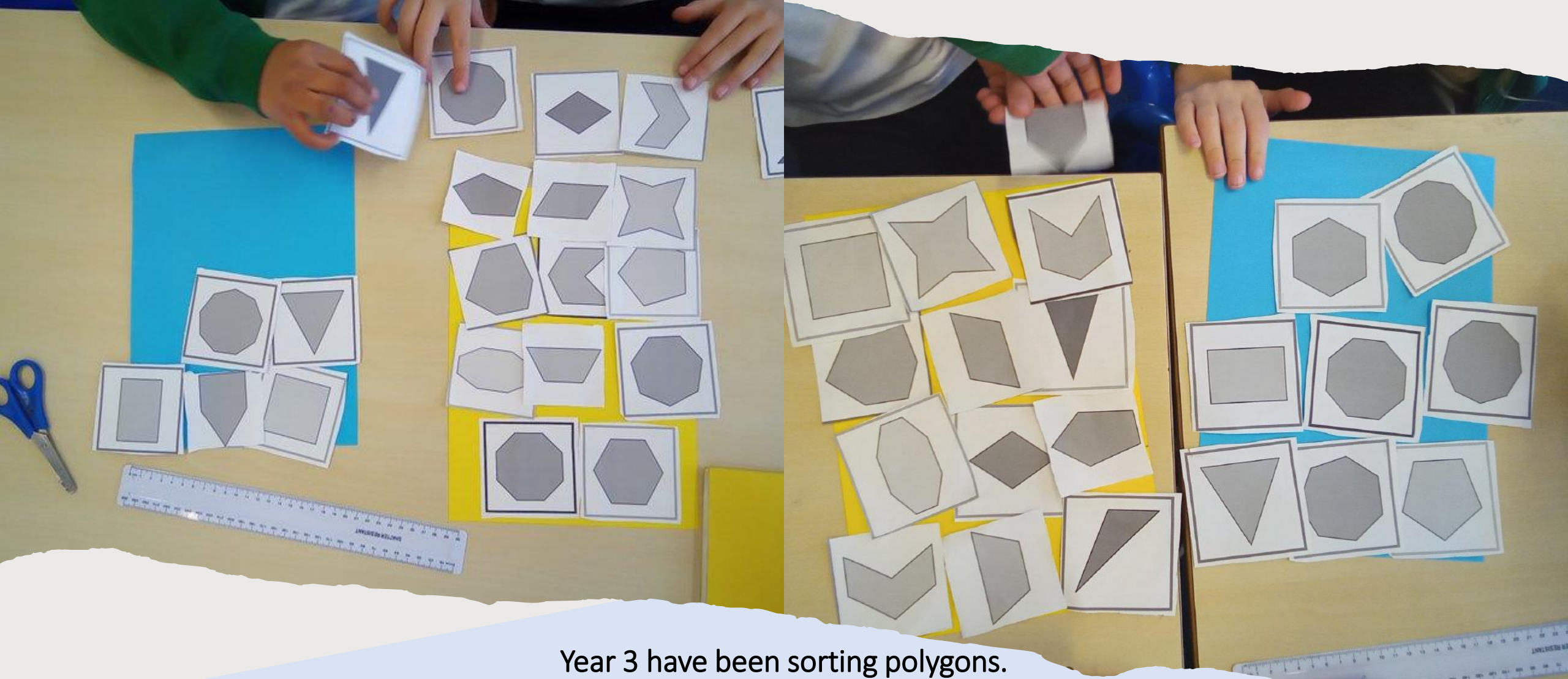
