

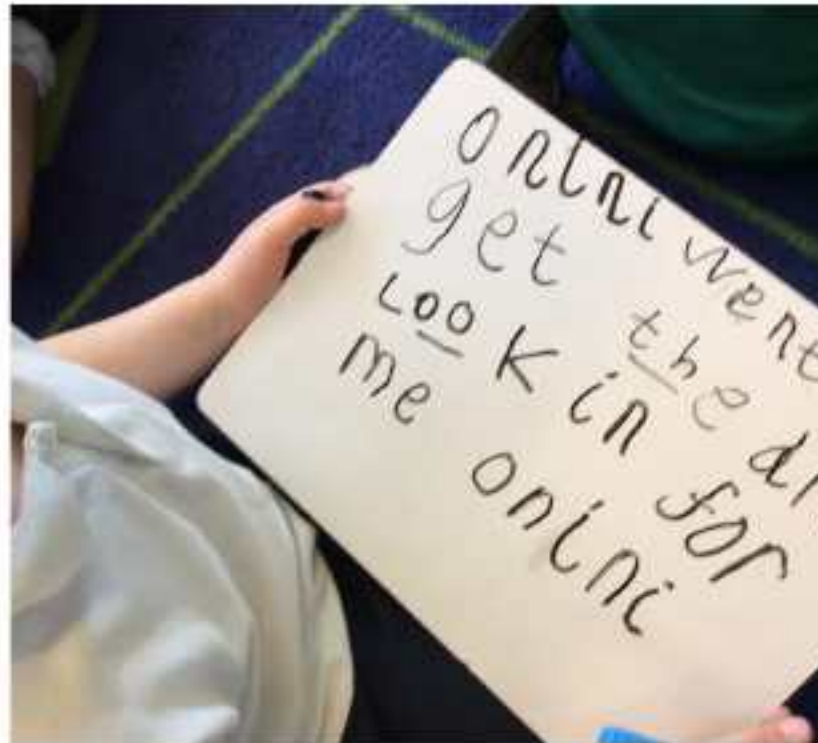
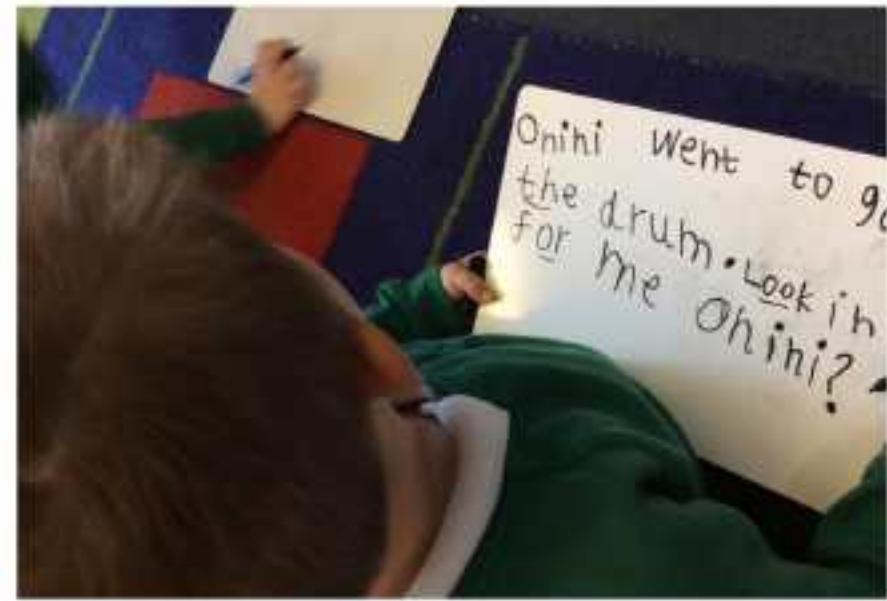
Reception Mozart really enjoyed making African necklaces on Monday.

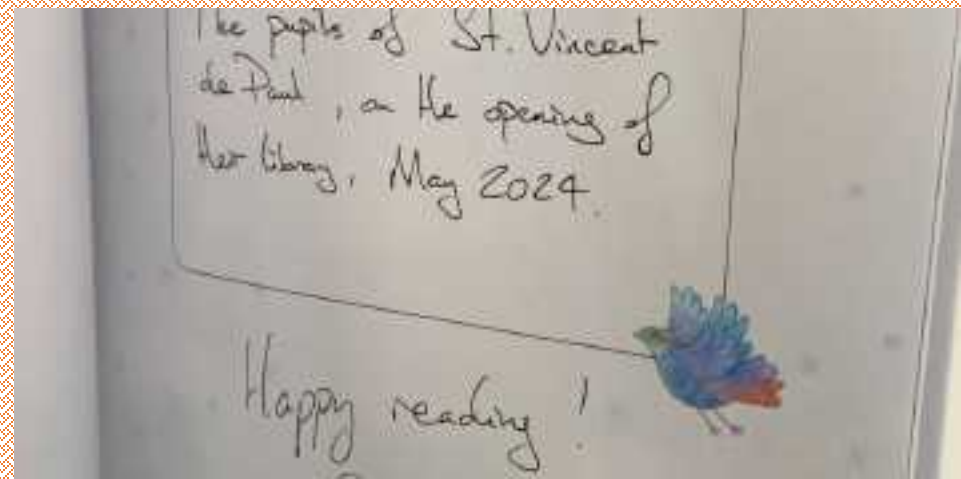


What a great afternoon celebrating our love for reading.

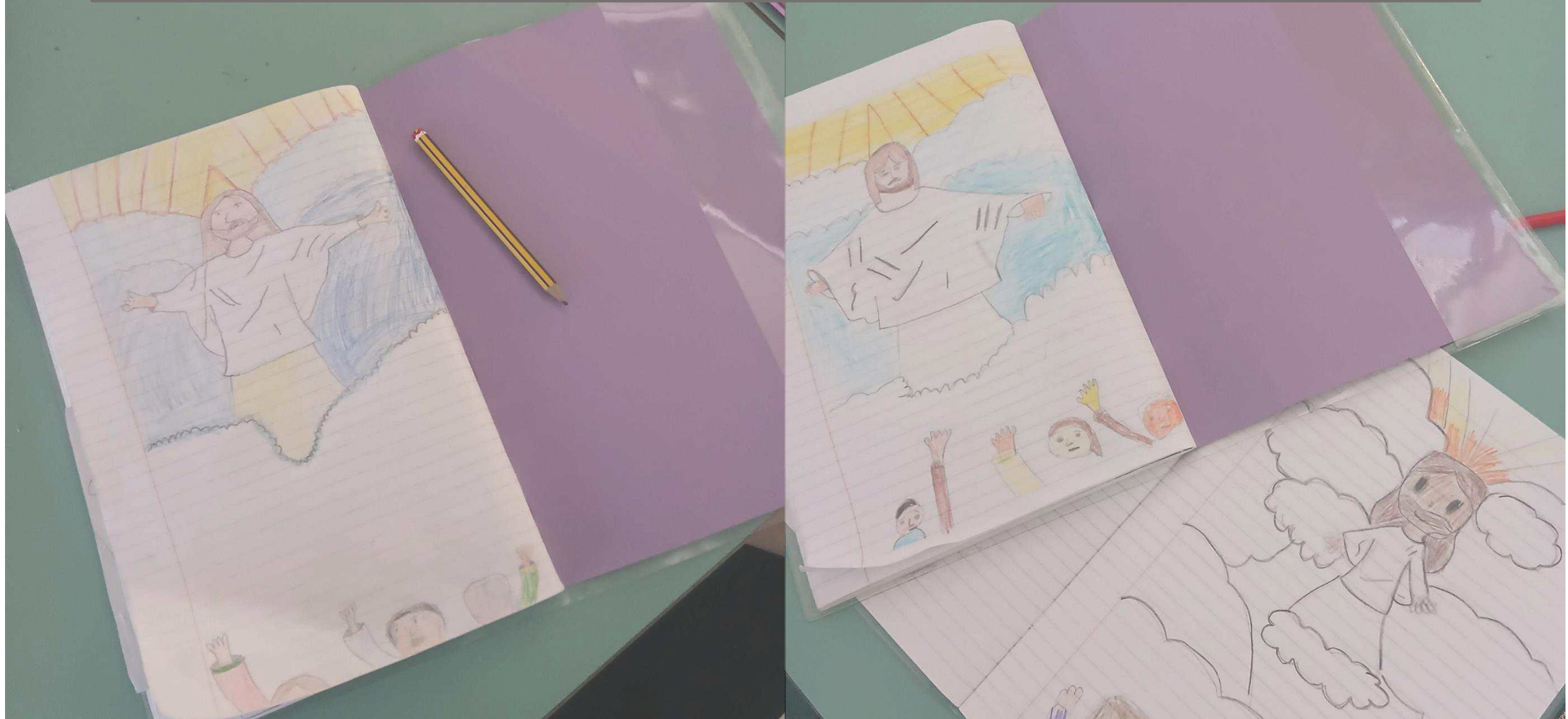

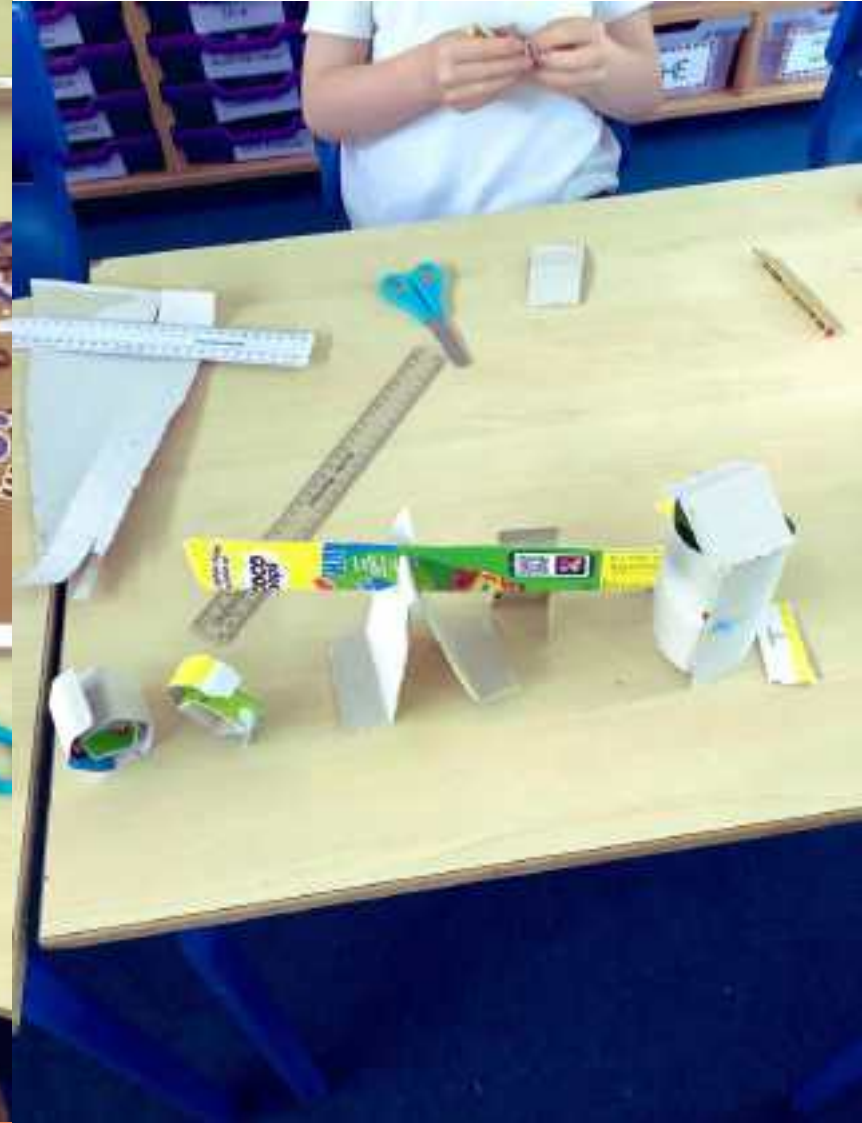

our common home. Above all, take care of people in need."

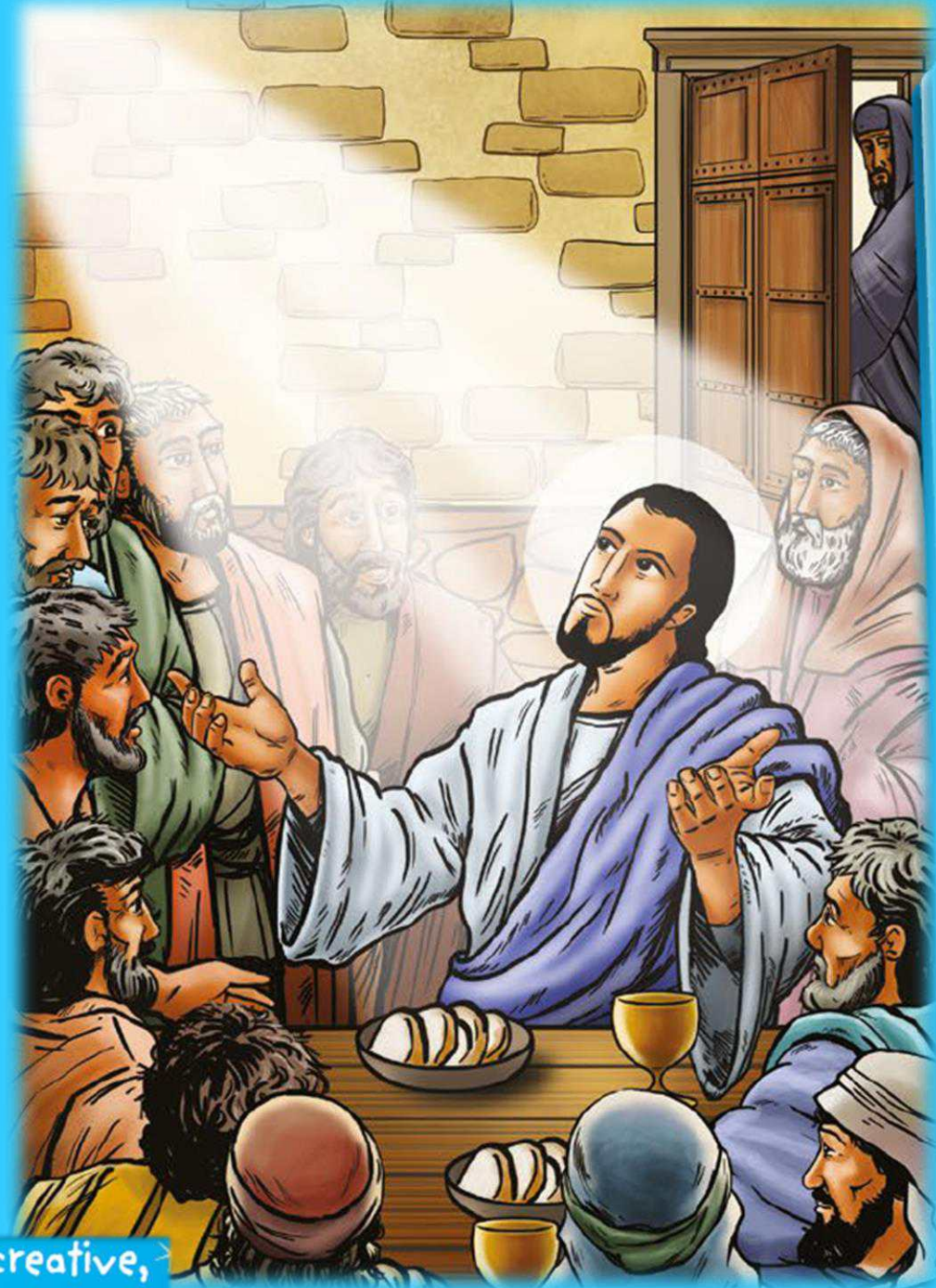
