Year 6 worked in groups to create their own athletics track in PE.






















































It's been another busy week in Reception, consolidating all of this year's learning.

It was lovely to be able to share the children's progress and achievements during our final stay and play in Reception.





























Year 1 are enjoying their computing lessons and are improving their keyboard skills!


