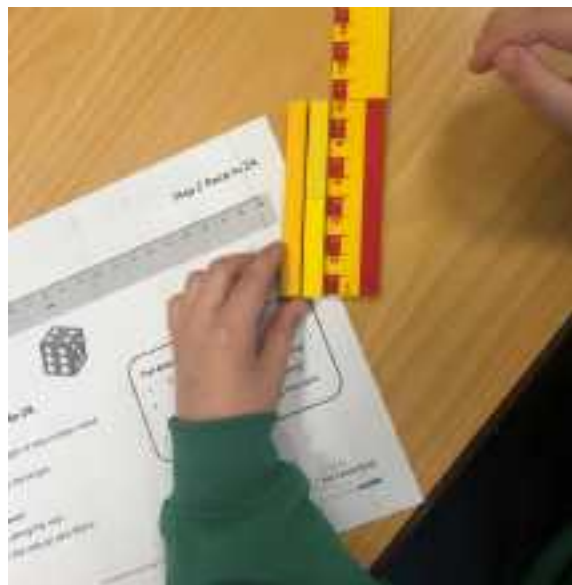
Well done to some of our KS2 pupils who showcased their skills on the flute and clarinet during a music concert. We have lots of talent in St Vincent de Paul School.

hugged a tree!




Year 1 are applying their understanding of instructions to work in Maths.

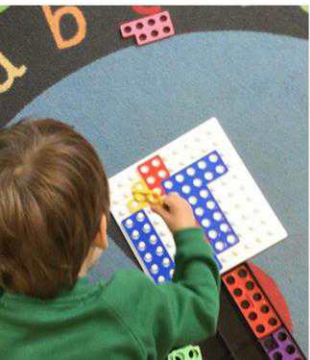
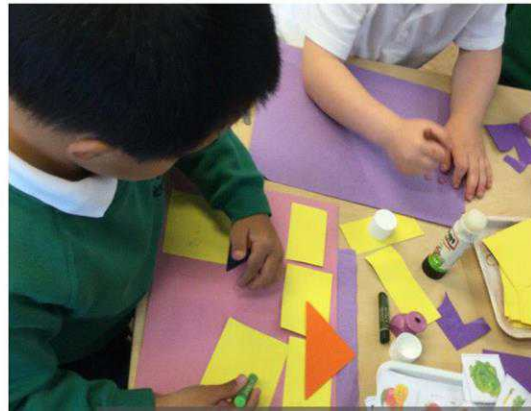

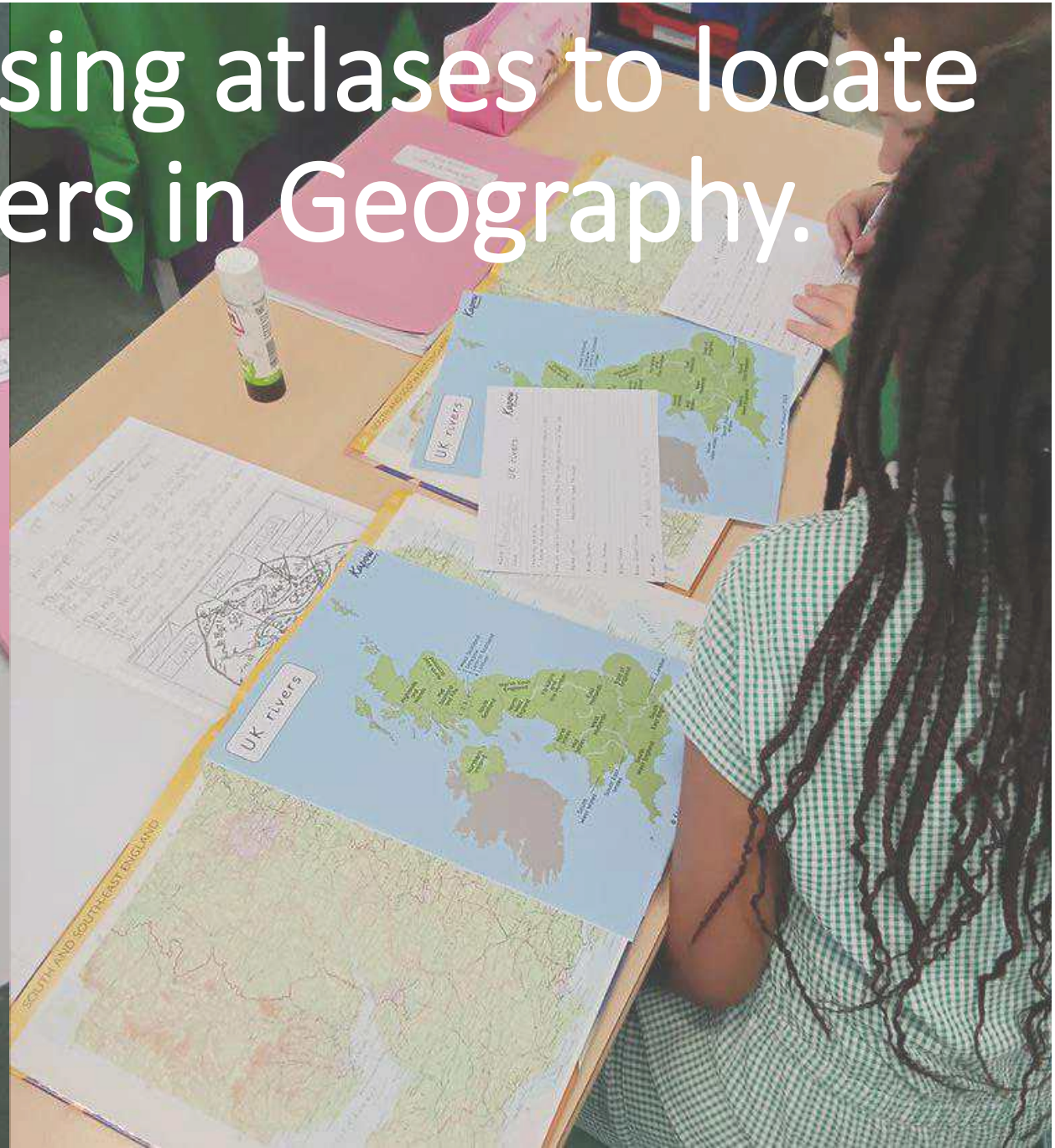
Year 4TB really enjoyed adapting a basic biscuit recipe as part of their design and technology project.

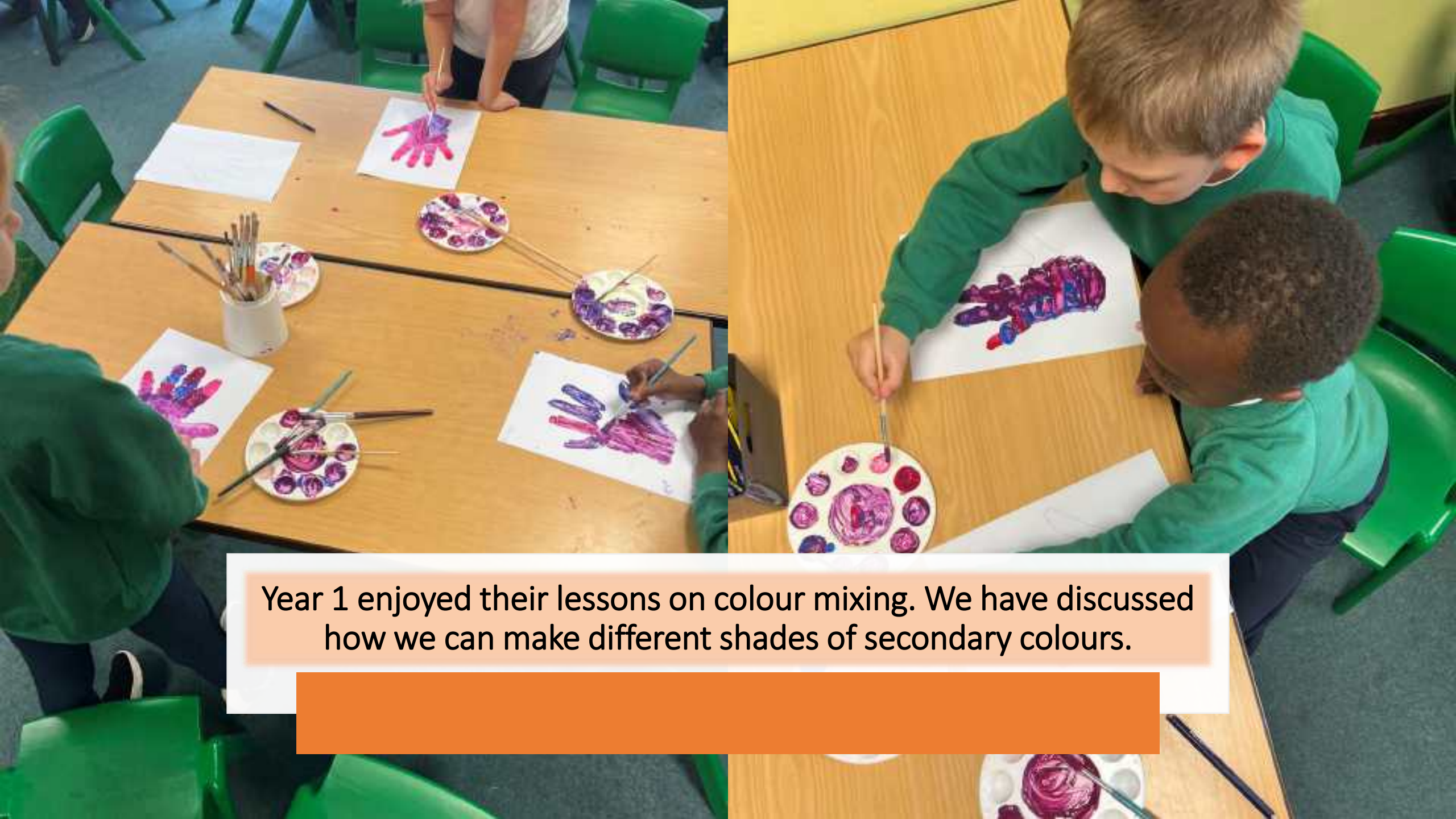

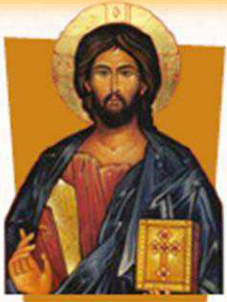

Pope Francis

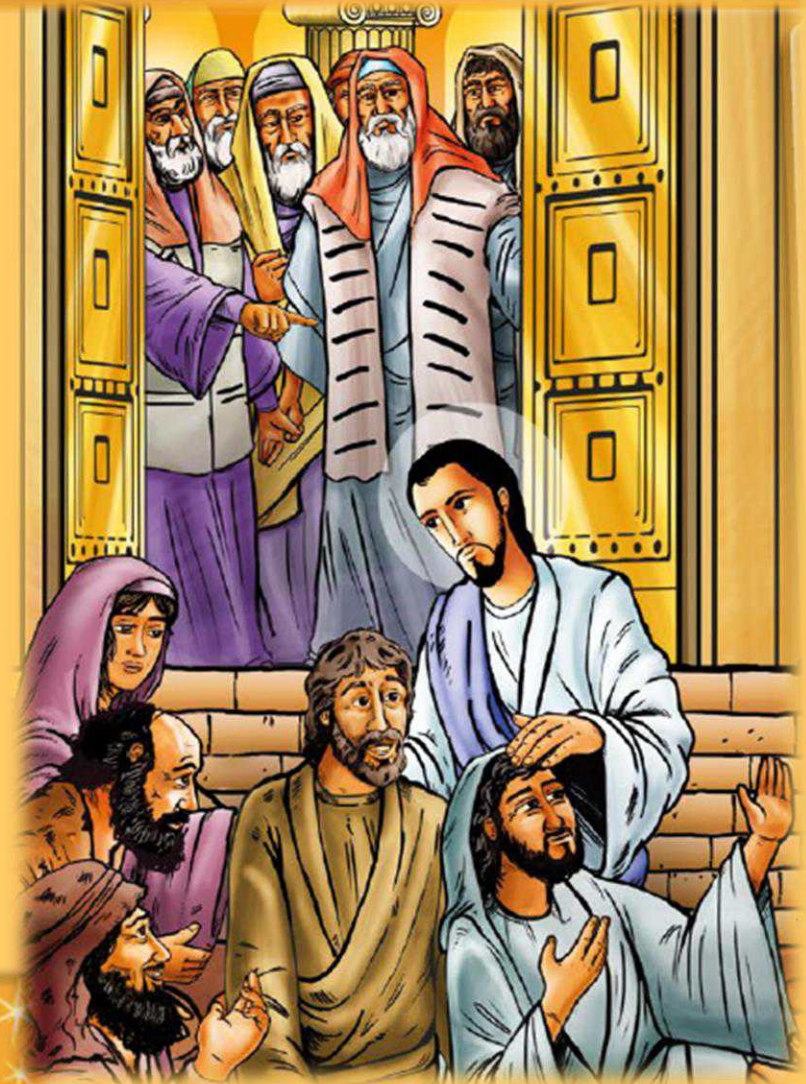
