Reception class settled back quickly and enjoyed making firework paintings, Rangoli patterns and exploring waterproof materials!










Year 1 enjoyed sharing books in the library, a highlight of the week.







Shakespeare have been exploring mental strategies in maths.

In Science, the children were looking at how to recognise how electrical appliances are powered.




















Nursery have been learning about good choices and not good choices. **Guy Fawkes** didn't make a good choice!

Reception O'Connor children have enjoyed playing schools in our role play area, taking it in turns to be the teacher.


















Y6 Shakespare have been making beautiful origami poppies for Remembrance Day on Monday.




