


Y5 Agnesi have done an amazing job creating their self-portraits using mixed media.





Year One has been busy exploring teen numbers this week. Well done guys!













We are rediscovering kindness and team work in Mozart class. We span a spider's web of kind words to our peers and worked as teams to create our new display.

The children in Nursery class have enjoyed using play dough to create the different stages of a caterpillar's life cycle.





























In RE, Year 4 were trying to place the events of St Paul's life in chronological order.

They spotted a variety of beautiful flowers and were excited to see potato plants as well!






















It won't be long before we're ready to harvest our own potatoes we are praying for a bountiful crop!
