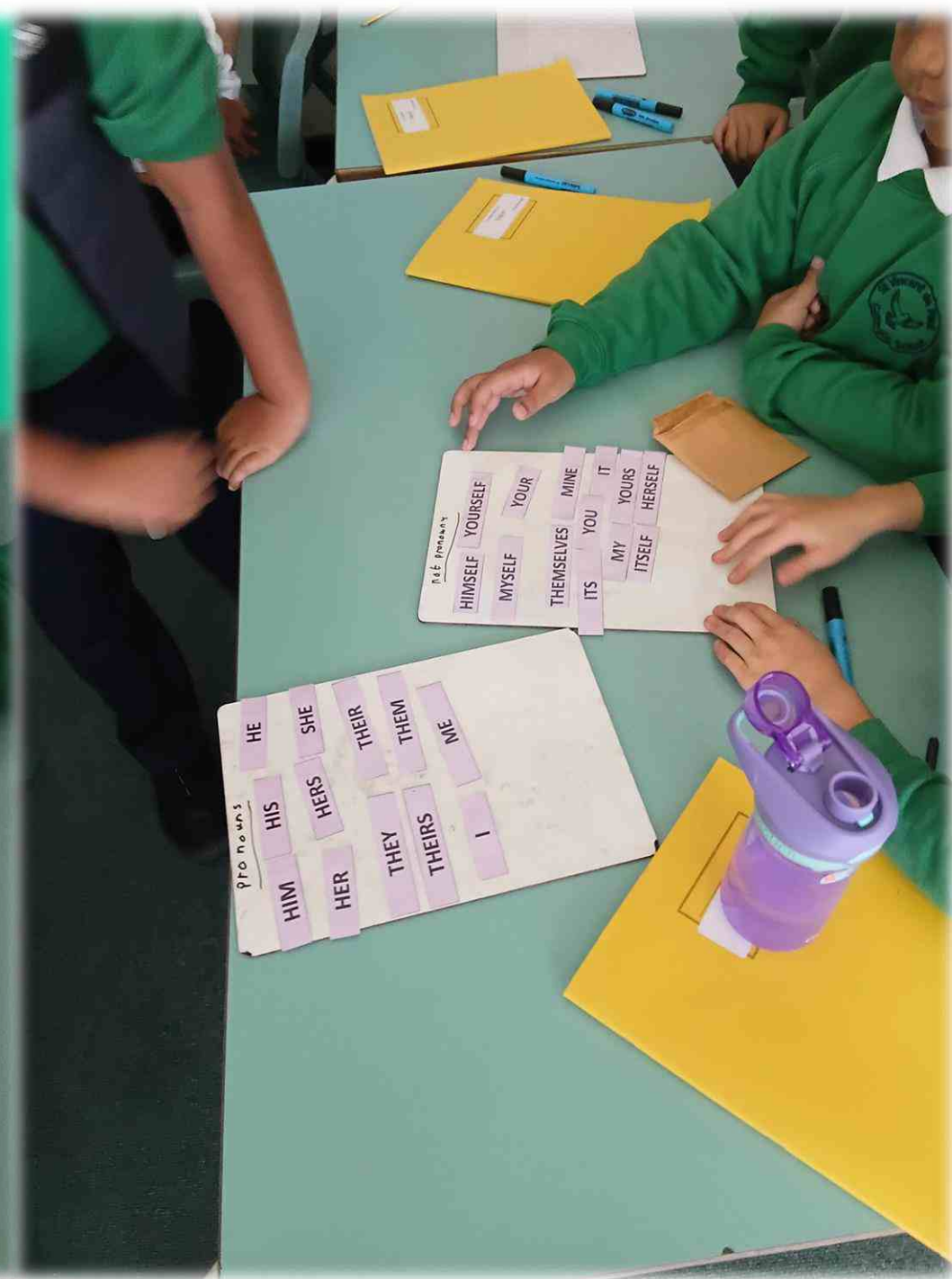
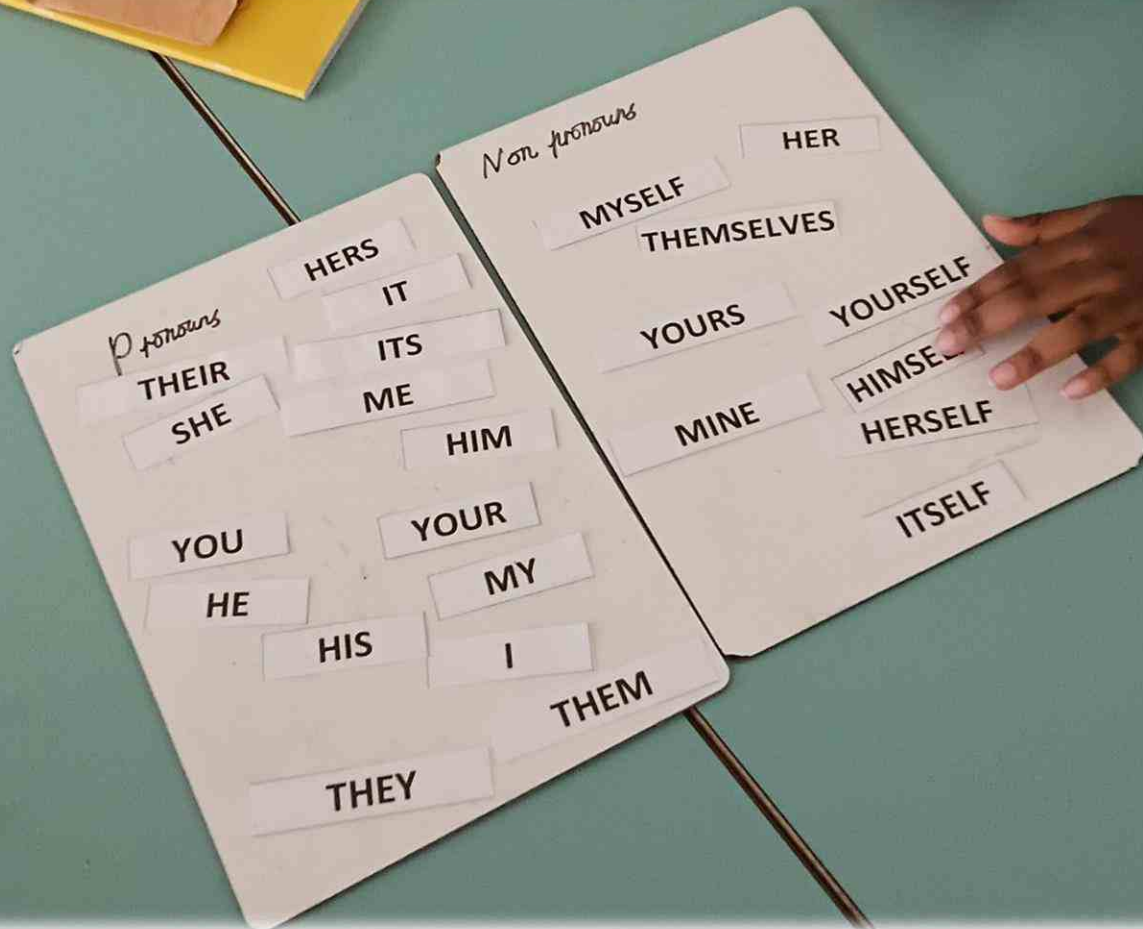


Zola the therapy dog was a big hit in Reception classes. The children loved petting her and playing with her in the outside area.

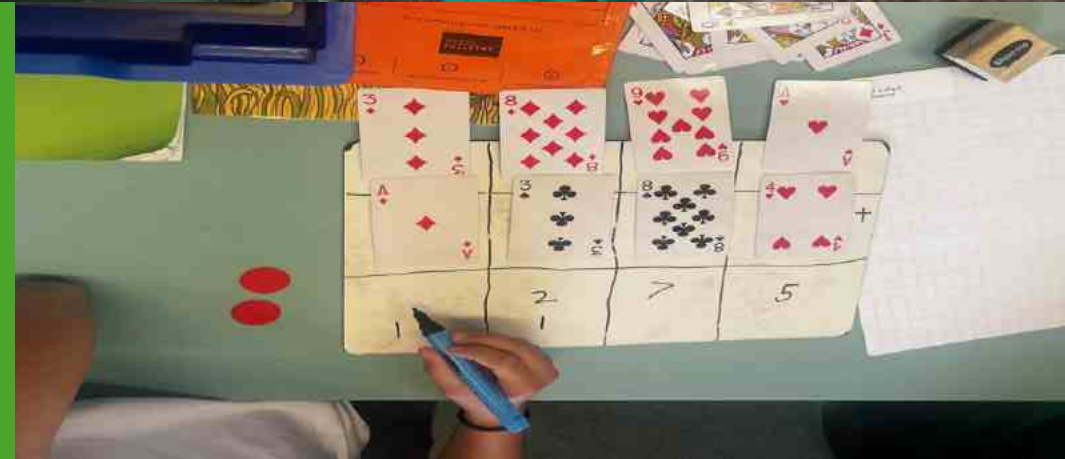
A busy day in Nursery

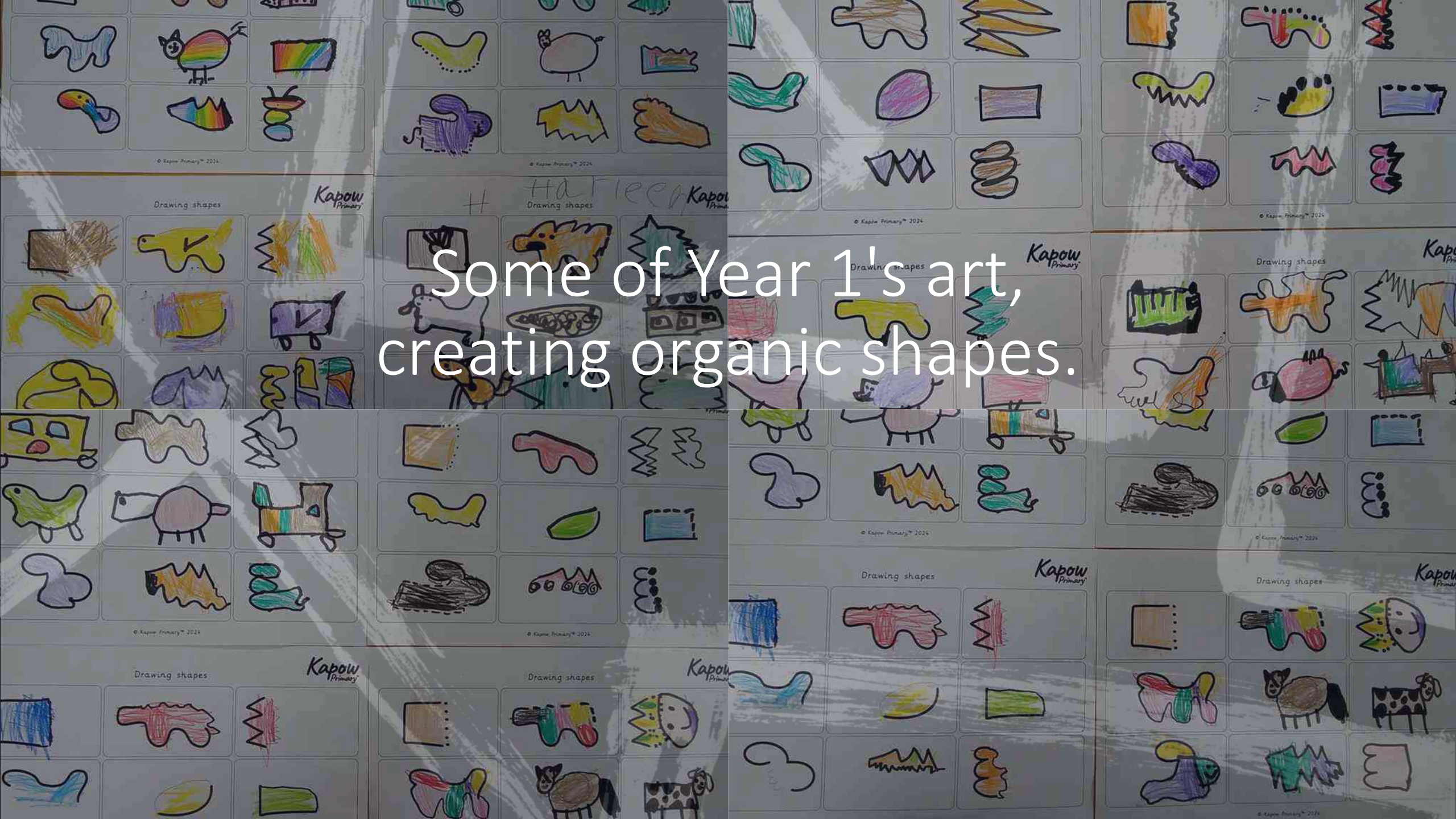

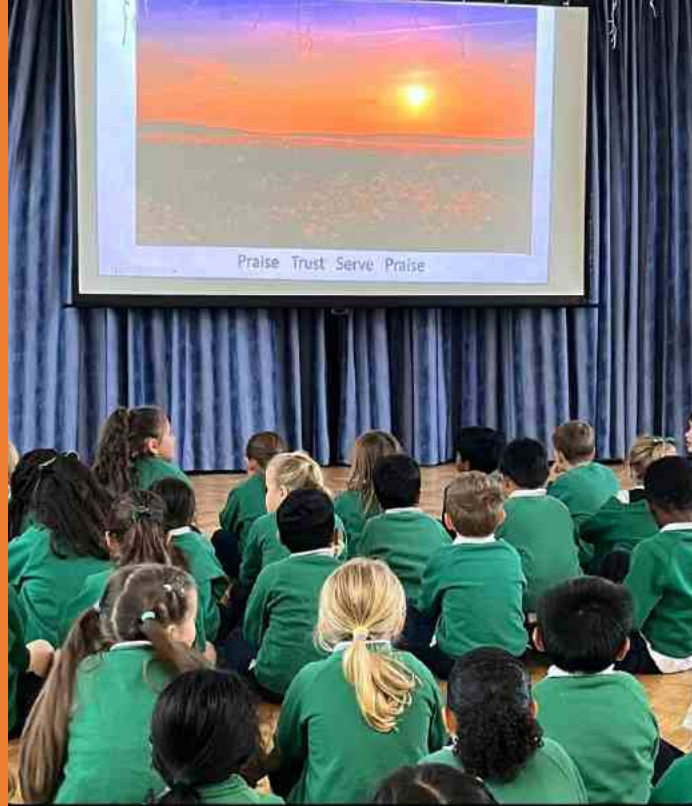
