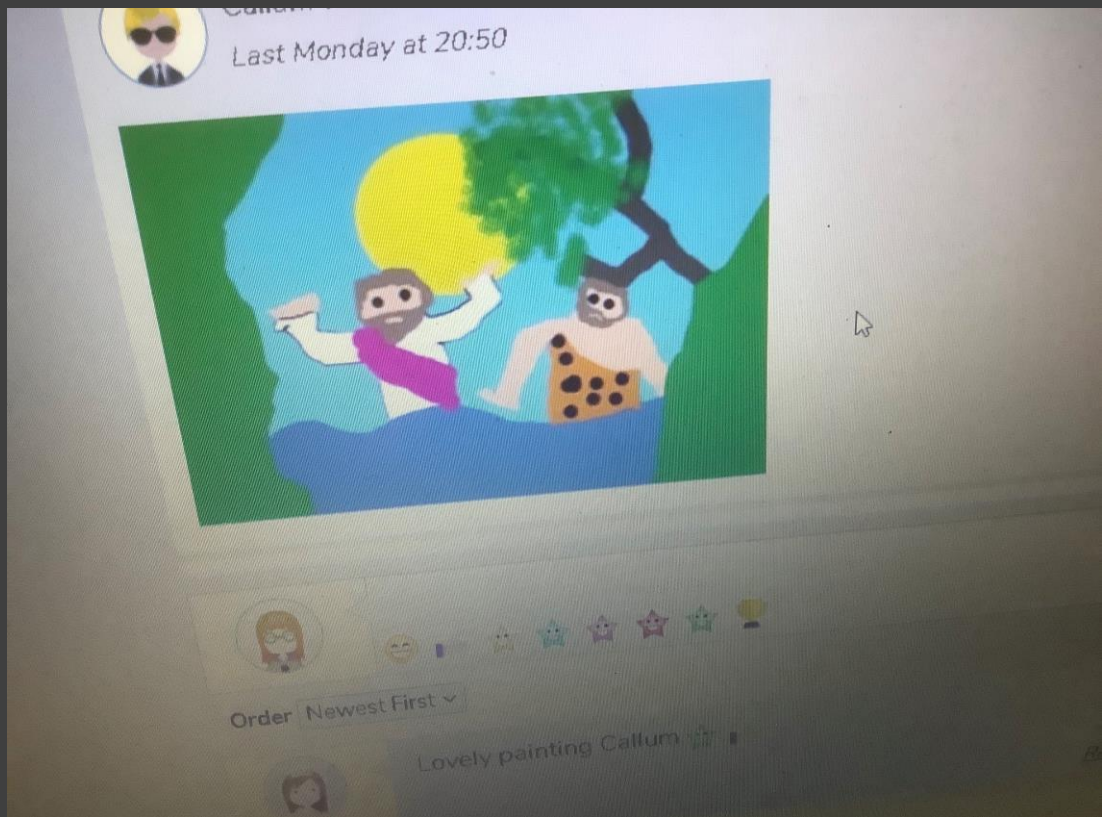
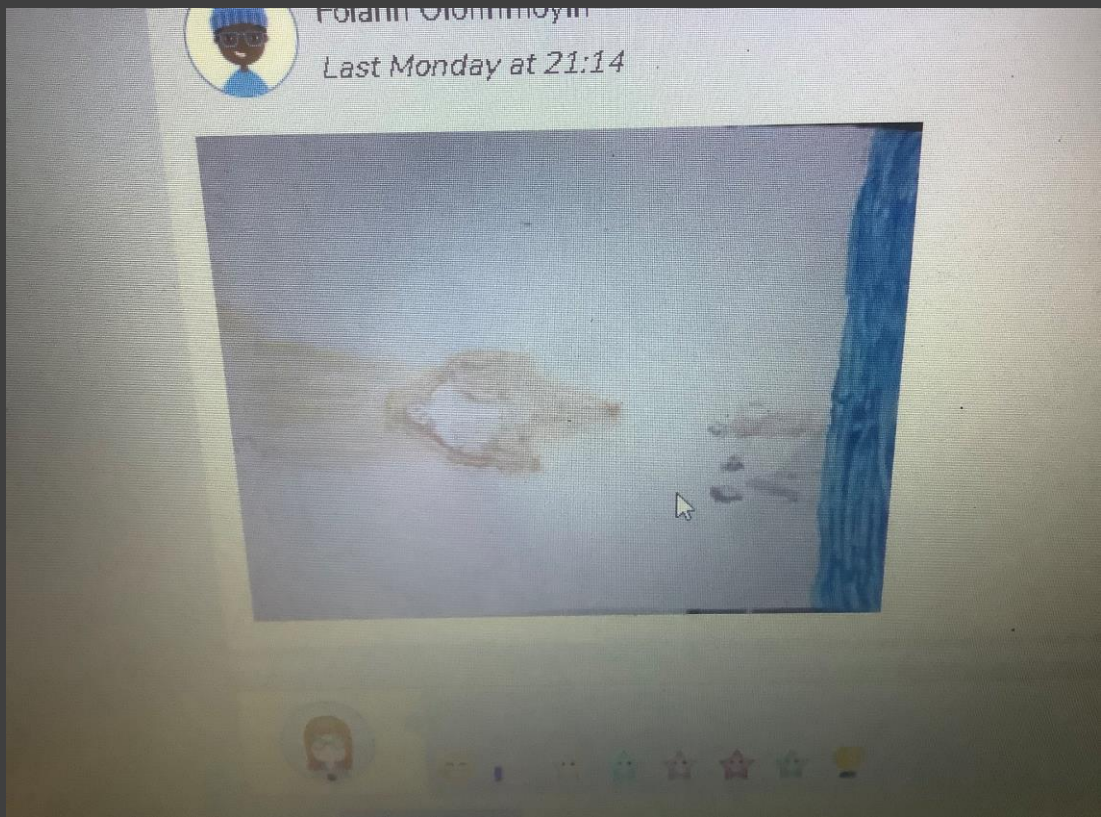
Year 5 have been learning about John the Baptist as we celebrated the Baptism of Our Lord last Sunday

The children did some great work comparing and ordering 4-digit numbers using place value.

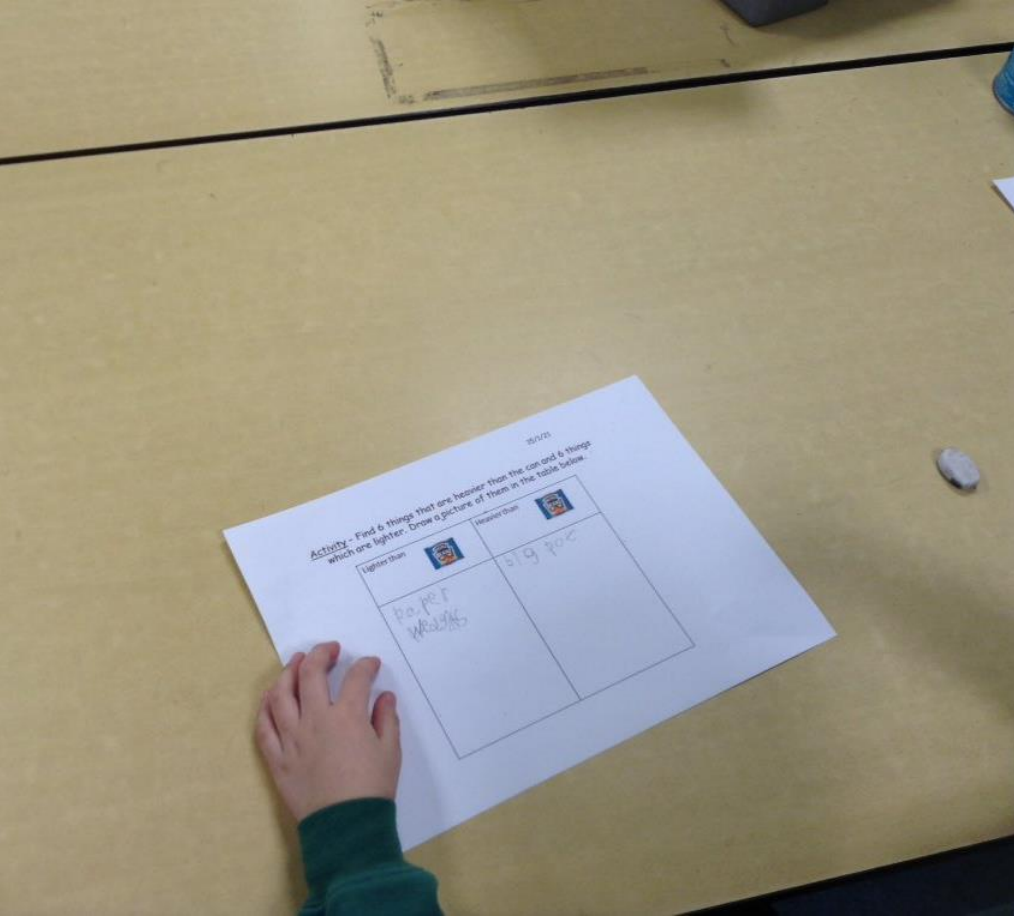




The Nursery children are using construction bricks to stack, vertically and horizontally to achieve their goal.

The children loved joining in with some 'Just dance'.

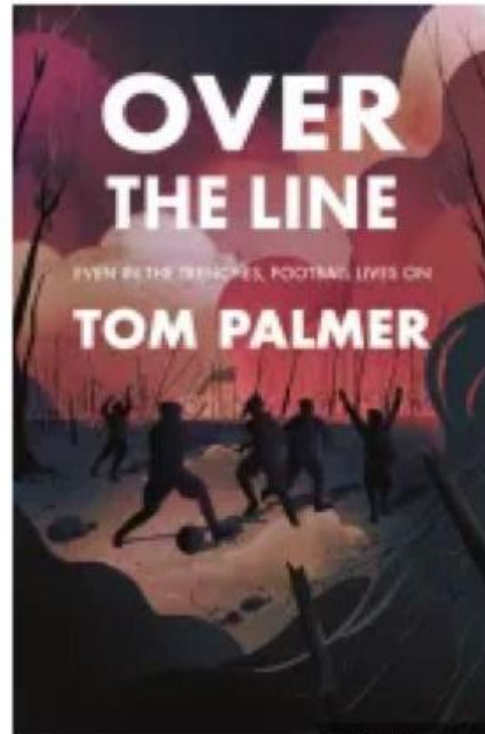
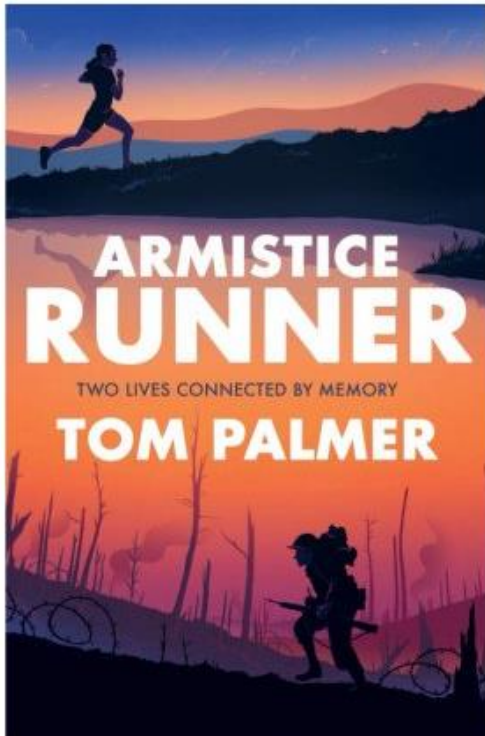
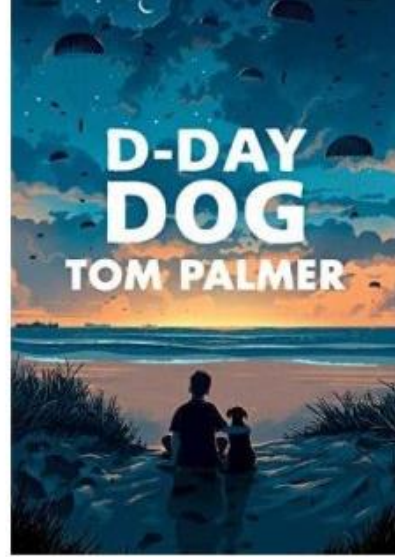
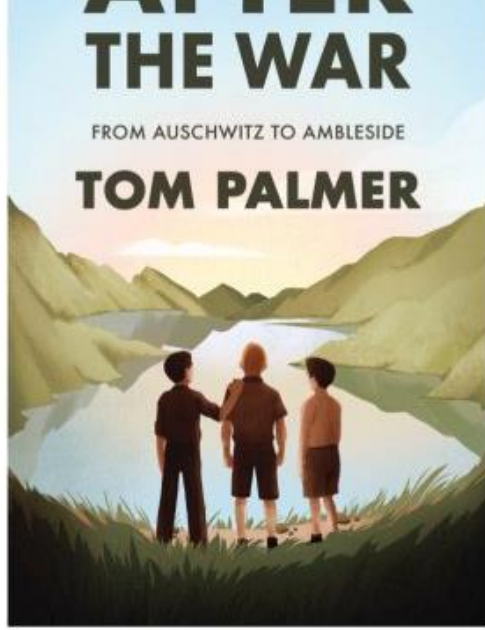


Year 3 are investigating shadows. They are trying to find out what makes a big shadow and what makes a small shadow and investigating how and why they change.



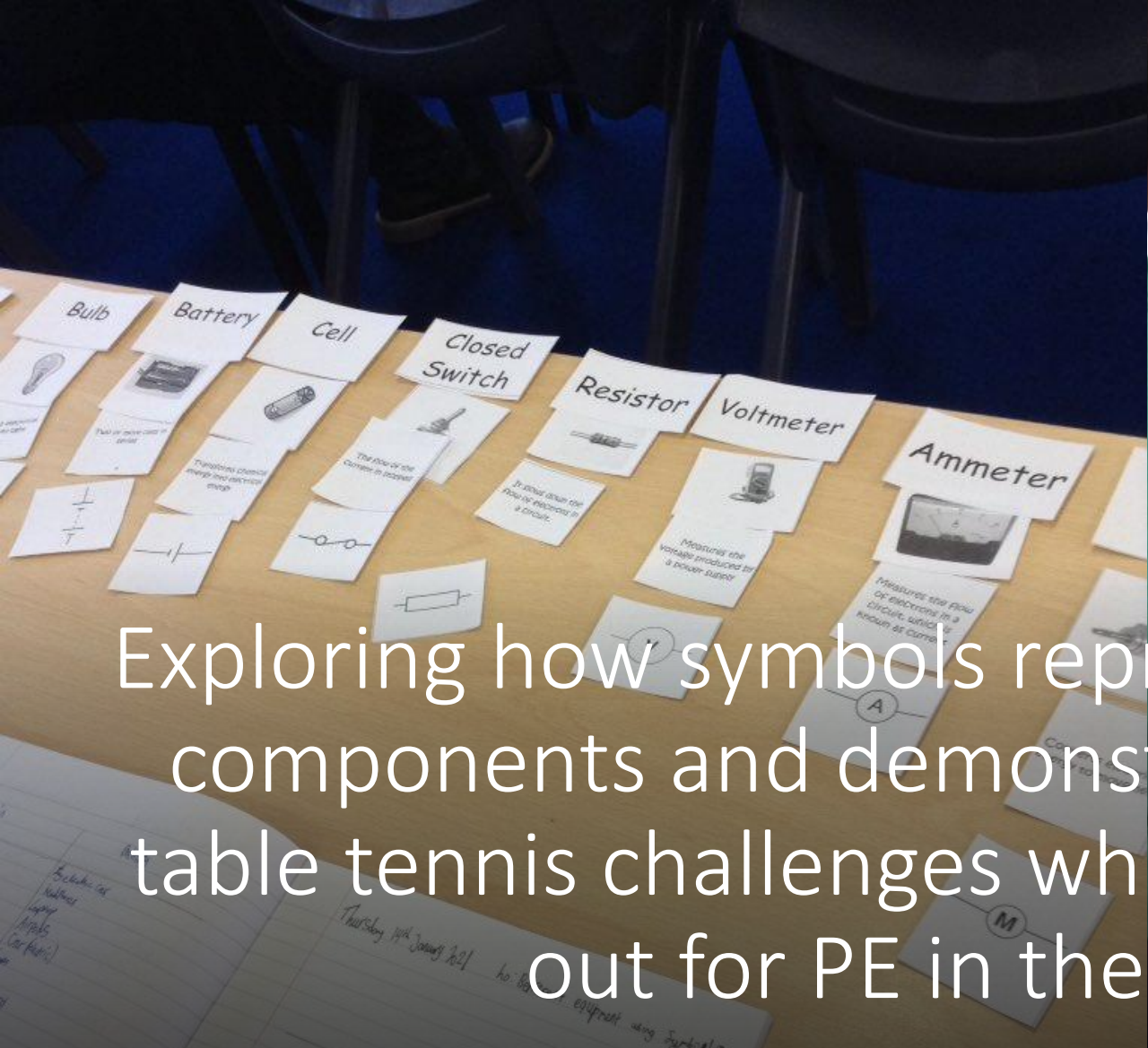
Then there was fantastic home learning shared. We hope they had as much fun as we did in class making shadows. Well done.

They are thinking about different ways we can travel. *“We are going to the beach on an air balloon!”*

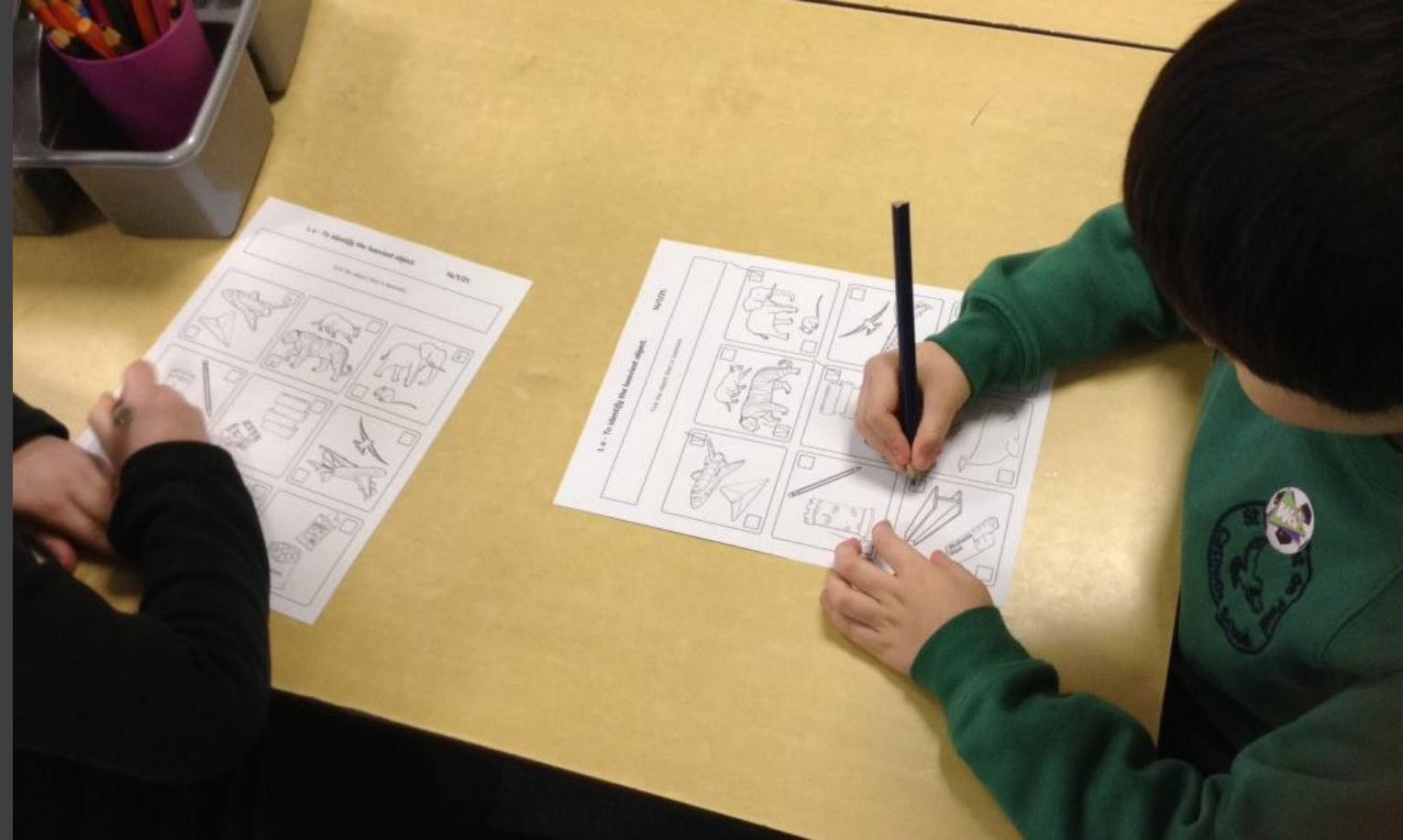


Year Six joined everyone in our Zoom assembly on Wednesday and in the afternoon created picture frames for their new art display board.

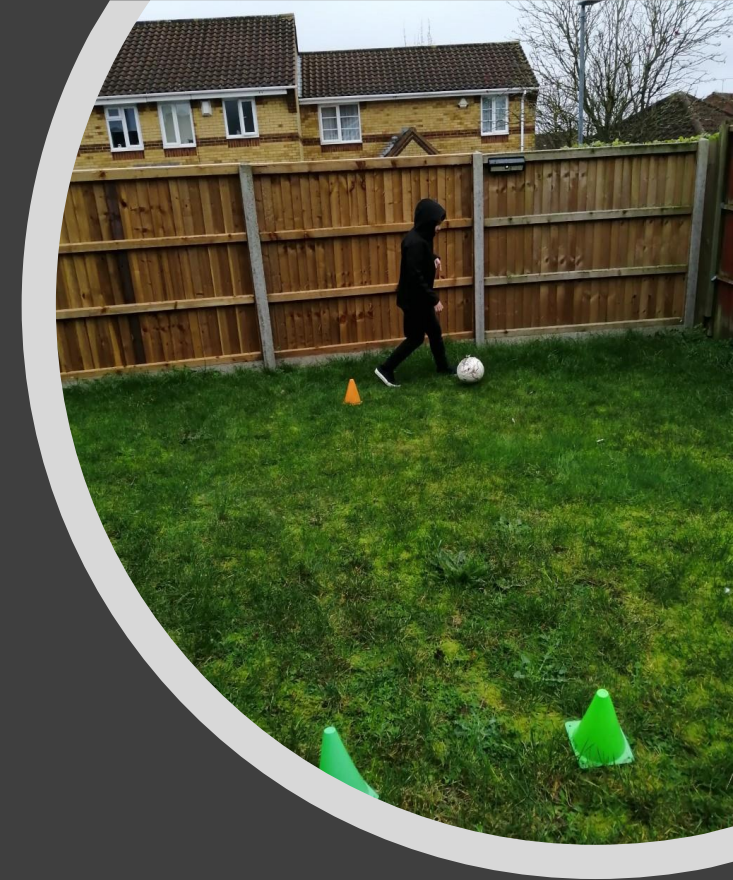
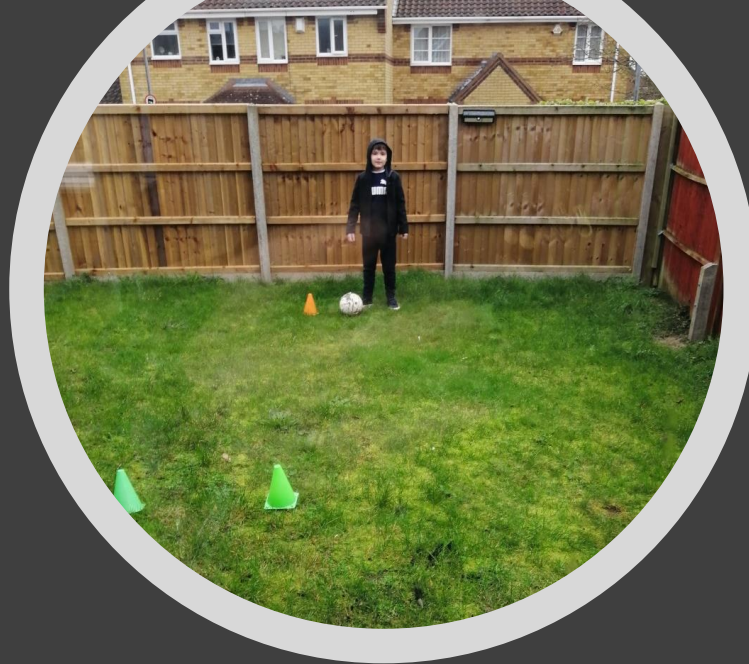
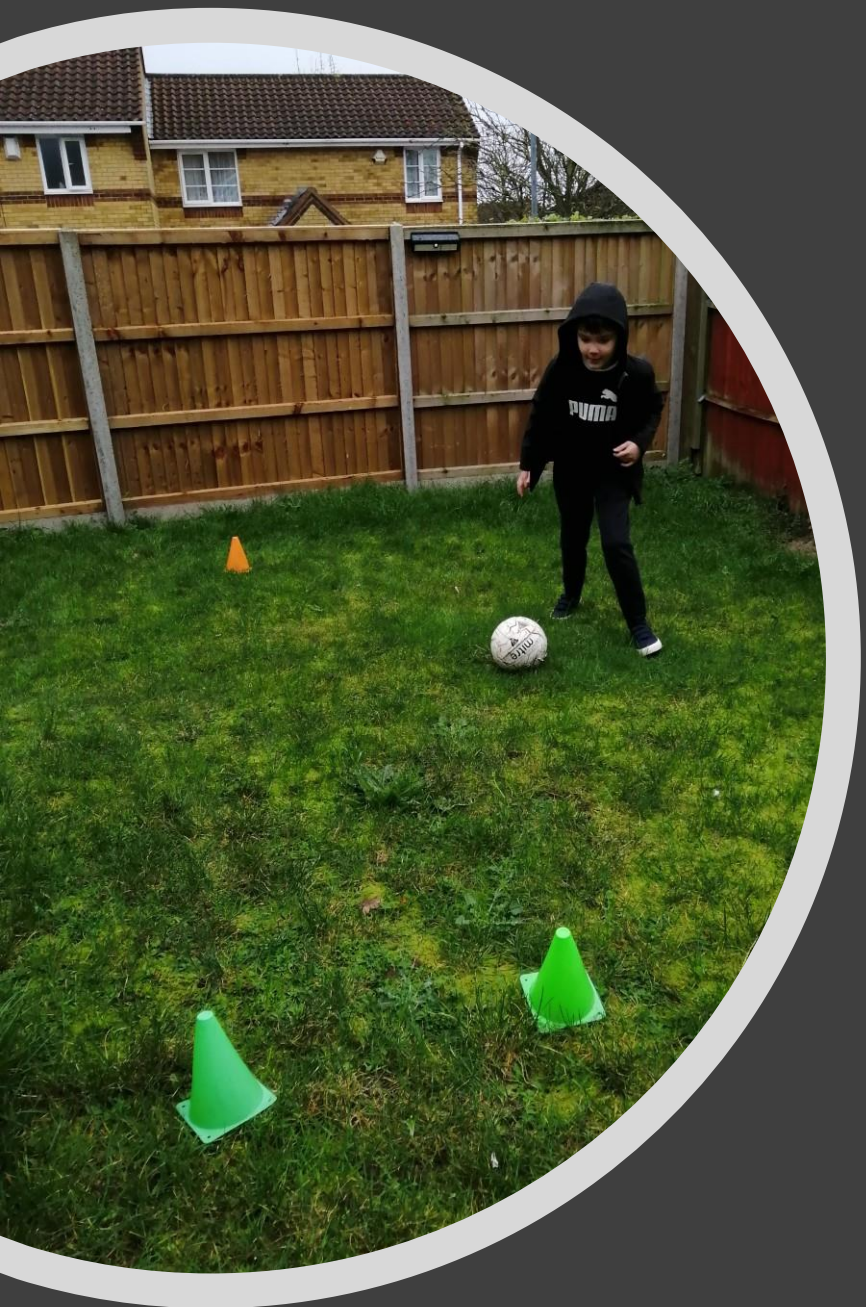

He had the inspired idea of wearing a swimming mask to protect his eyes.

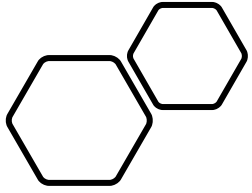




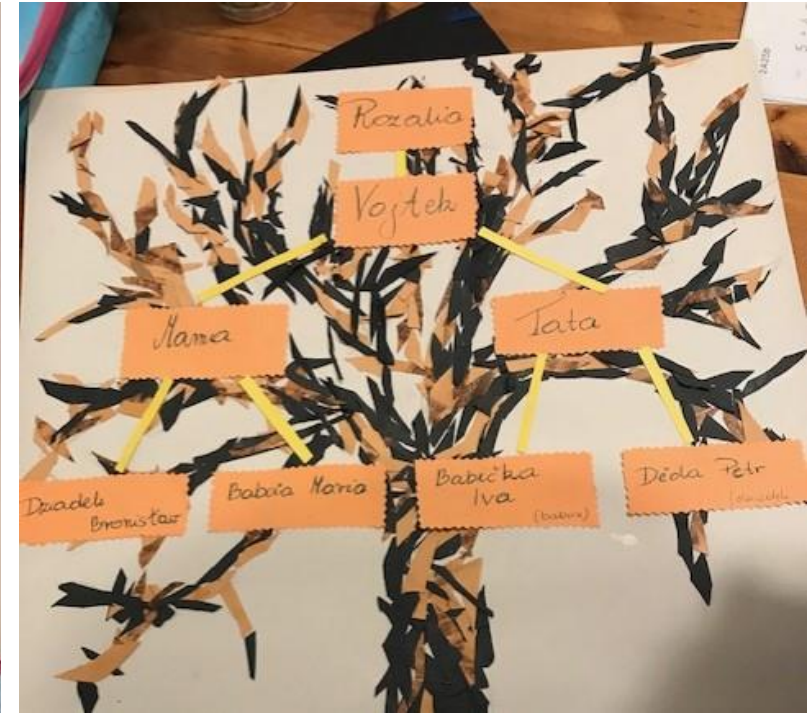

THE GOSPEL IN CHURCH

Sunday 17th January 2021



As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, "Look, there is the lamb of God." Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, "What do you want?" They answered, "Rabbi," - which means Teacher - "where do you live?" "Come and see," he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour. One of these two (who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said) was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him, "We have found the Messiah," - which means the Christ - and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked hard at him and said, "You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas," - meaning Rock.
