




Year 6SC were exploring how we see using torches, pieces of string and Mr. Crump's favourite cuddly toys!





We were all ready for a fun day of learning and friendships on Tuesday!


Linked to our story, Jabari Tries, the Reception children have been learning about things that fly.




This week in response to the story Happy Birthday Maisy the children counted a number of presents.


Jesus said to his disciples, "When the time for the end of the world is near, many things will happen. In those days they will see the Son
