






In y4 we began planning a new setting for the next chapter based on the Spiderwick Chronicles book we are reading.




Reception watch as their teacher moves the chrysalides into the butterfly habitat.









Year Six were excited to be starting their new book in Literacy










Another great cricket session in year 3 with fantastic teamwork and some great throwing & catching as well as some superb batting.













"This is the egg on the leaf. This is the very hungry caterpillar. A big caterpillar. The cocoon...this is the butterfly."






Year 1 have also been learning about extreme forms of weather in their Geography lesson. They really enjoyed watching the different videos depicting the weather types.



The children in Nursery are enjoying 'Jasper's Beanstalk' by Nick Butterworth and Mick Inkpen. Look out for what comes next!




Year 5 Agnesi with the Cricket coach. Yesterday we did the daily mile, and everyone ran at least one mile.




In year 3 we have been thinking about Jesus' achievements on earth.

We listened to a hymn and said a prayer.







