



This week the Nursery children have been focusing on counting and matching quantity to numeral up to 10.









Reception have been very busy this week. We have almost finished our junk modelling topic and the class have been thinking about their designs before making their models.





We are learning about caring for our world.

Our Reception children have been excitedly learning about safety when riding balance bikes and are looking forward to having a go on our new bikes next week.






## Phonics Friday Longer Words



Reception children have been working hard to blend sounds together smoothly and build their confidence when tackling **words with more than one syllable.**

We have been learning **how to use chunking to help us read longer words by breaking them into smaller, more manageable parts.** The children have practised **spotting familiar sounds within words and reading each chunk before blending them together.**

**Next week,** we will be introducing a **new set of words to practise at home, including more longer words** to challenge and support the children's growing reading skills.

You can support at home by encouraging your child to chunk longer words they see in books, on signs, or in everyday situations. Remind them to take their time and blend each part carefully.

# COMPASSION


*"Compassion for the suffering is the beginning of holiness."*
