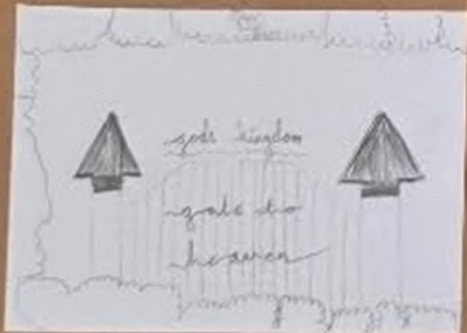
In our year group worship today, we looked at the Wednesday word:

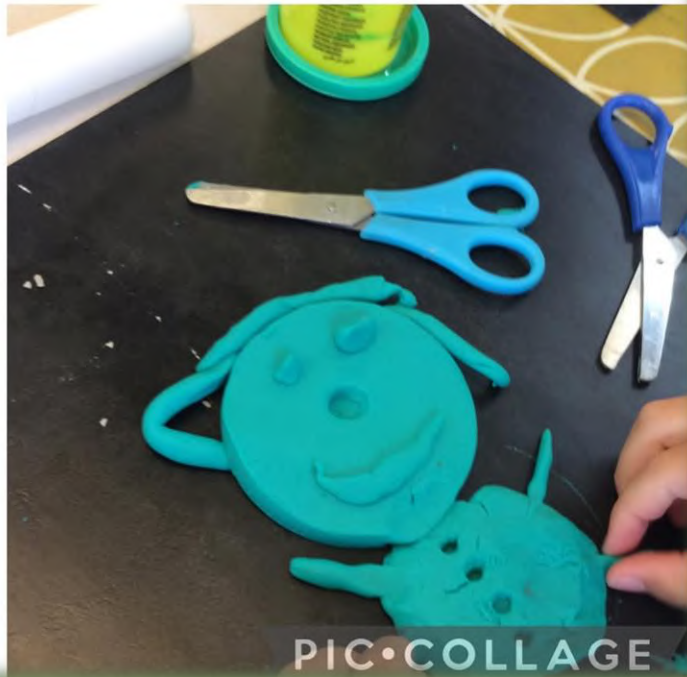
God's Kingdom

We linked this back to our previous learning on the Our Father: 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.' Matthew 6:9-10.

We talked about how God's Kingdom is not simply a place; it is wherever God's love, peace, justice, and mercy are lived out. We thought about Jesus' teaching that God's Kingdom grows through small acts of love, like a tiny seed becoming a large tree. Every time we choose kindness, love, care, forgiveness, peace or justice, we help God's Kingdom grow.

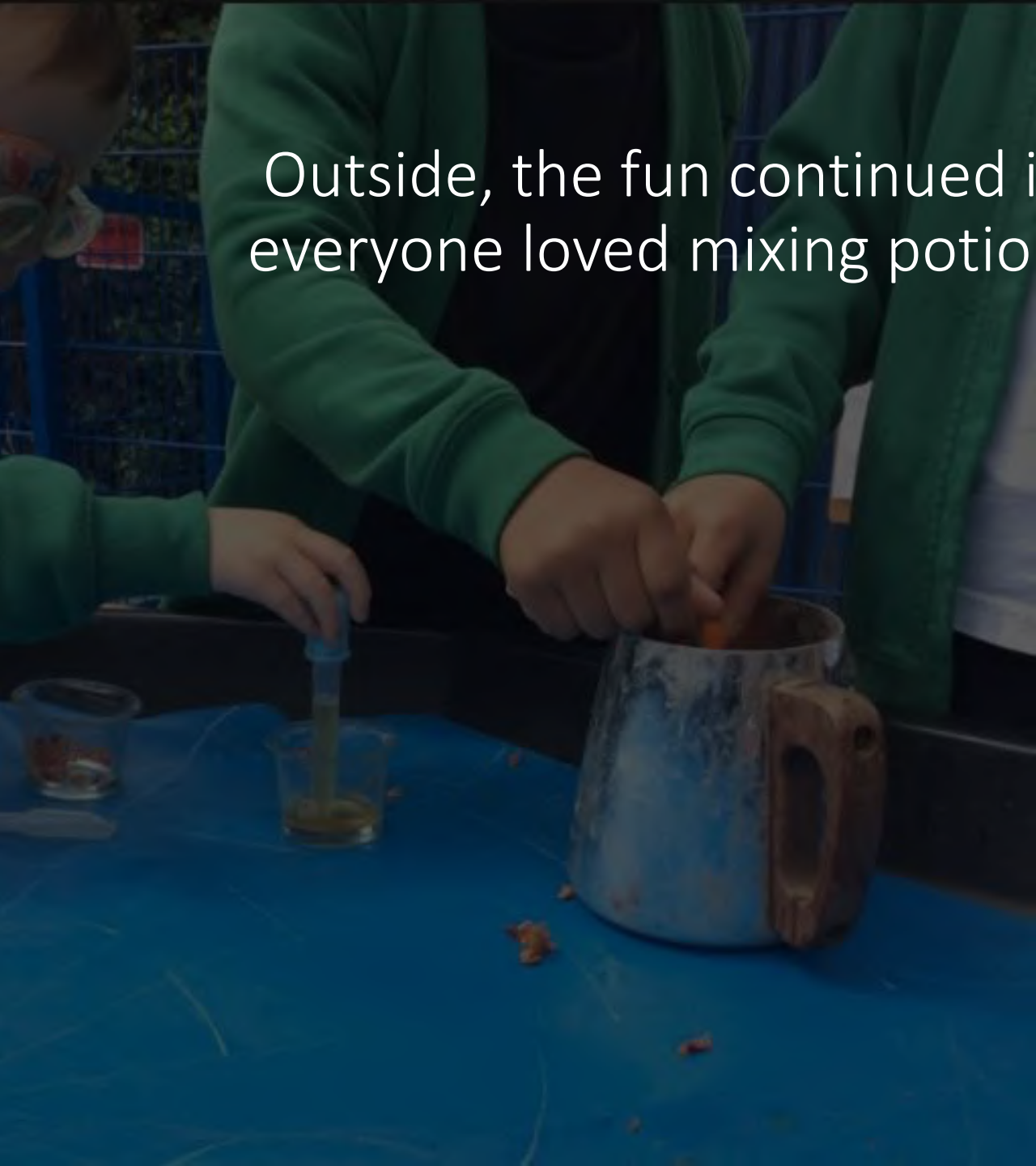
Our reflection task was to draw what we think God's Kingdom looks like.

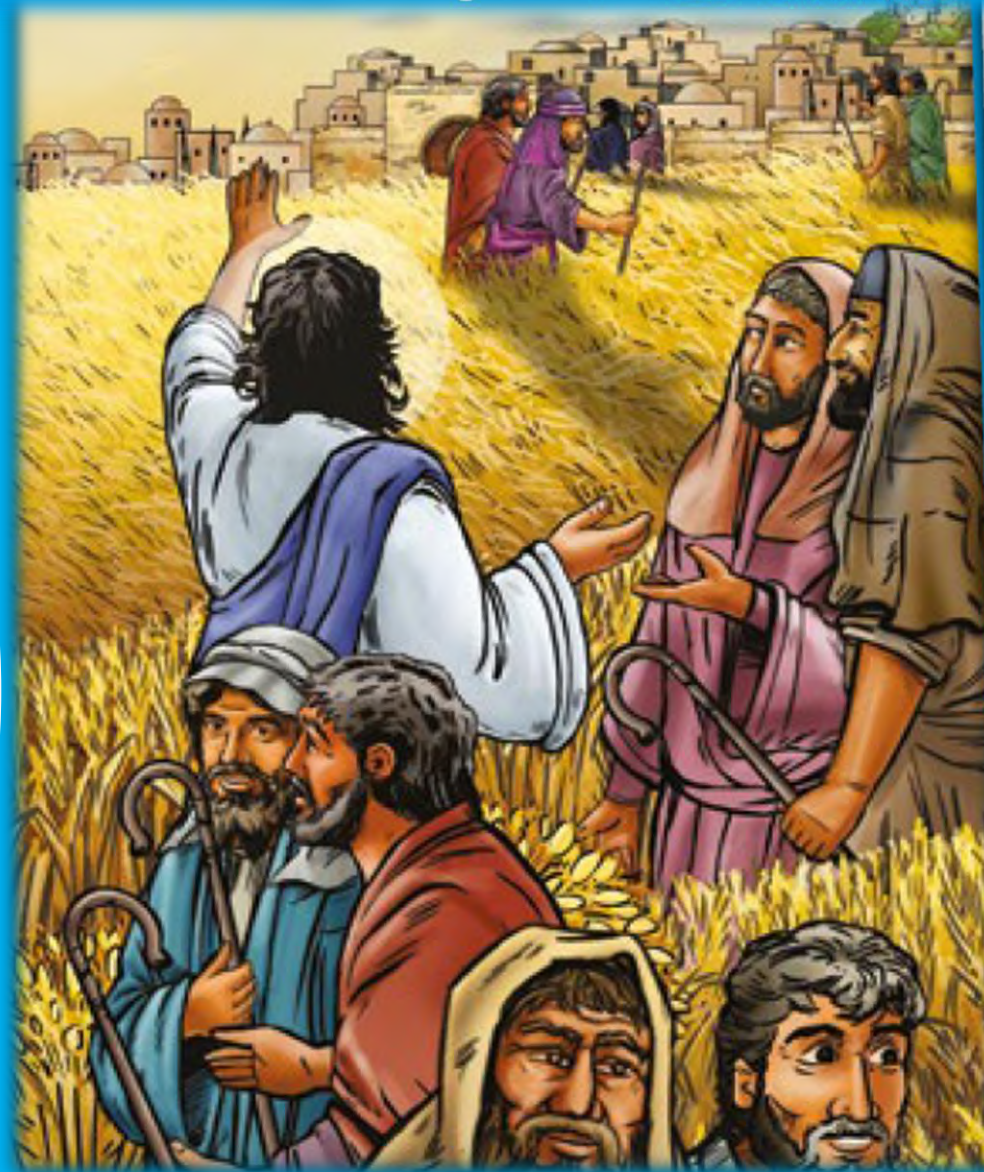
When Jesus saw the crowds he felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd. He said to his twelve disciples, "The harvest is rich but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest." He

then gave them authority over unclean spirits with power to cast them out and to cure all kinds of diseases and sickness. These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James the, son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas, and Matthew the tax collector; James the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, the one who was to betray him. These twelve Jesus sent out, instructing them as follows: "Go to the lost sheep of the House of Israel. And as you go, proclaim that the kingdom of heaven is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils. You received without charge, give without charge."
