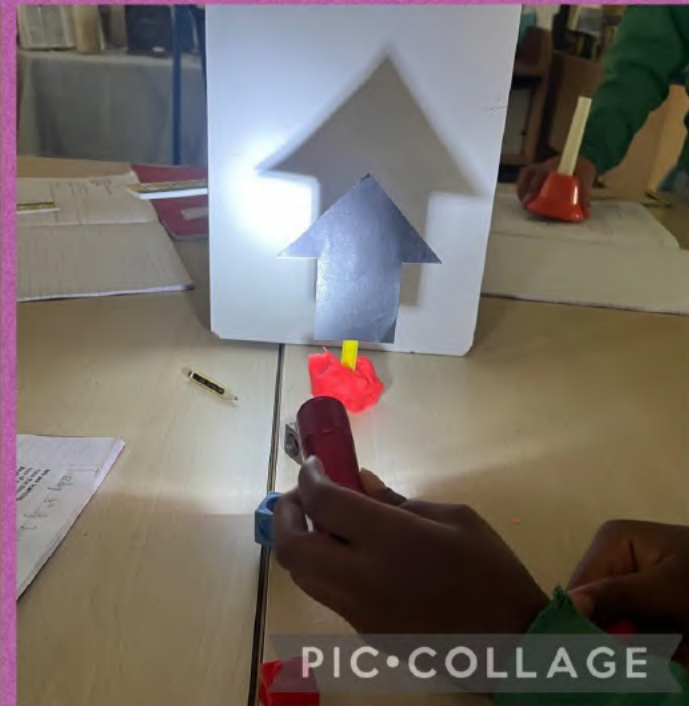
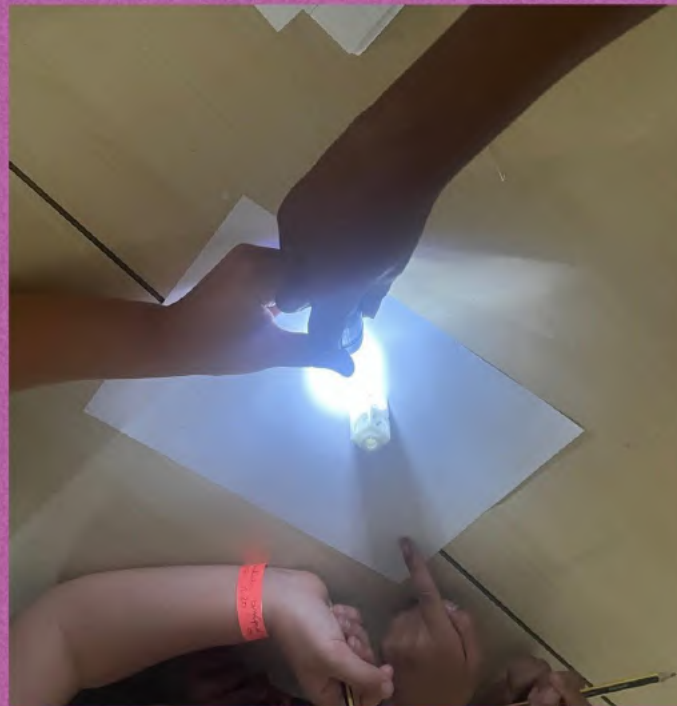
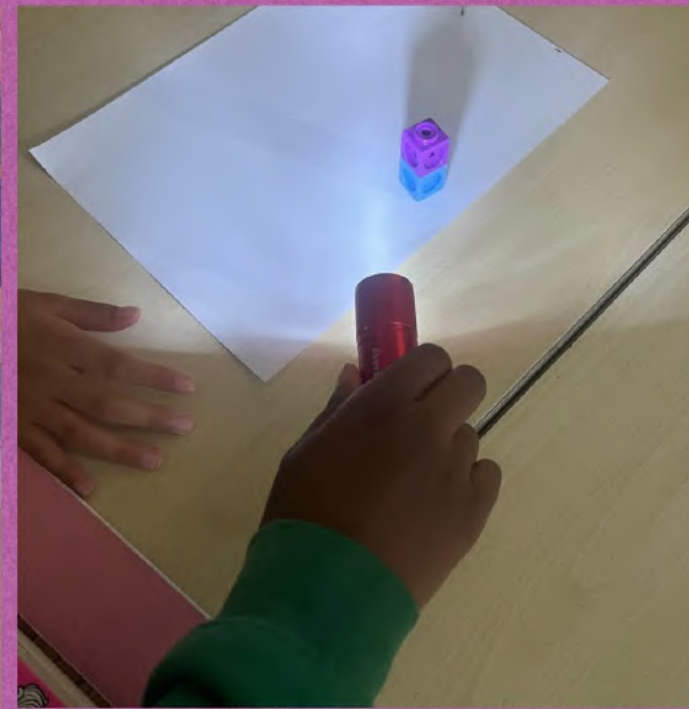
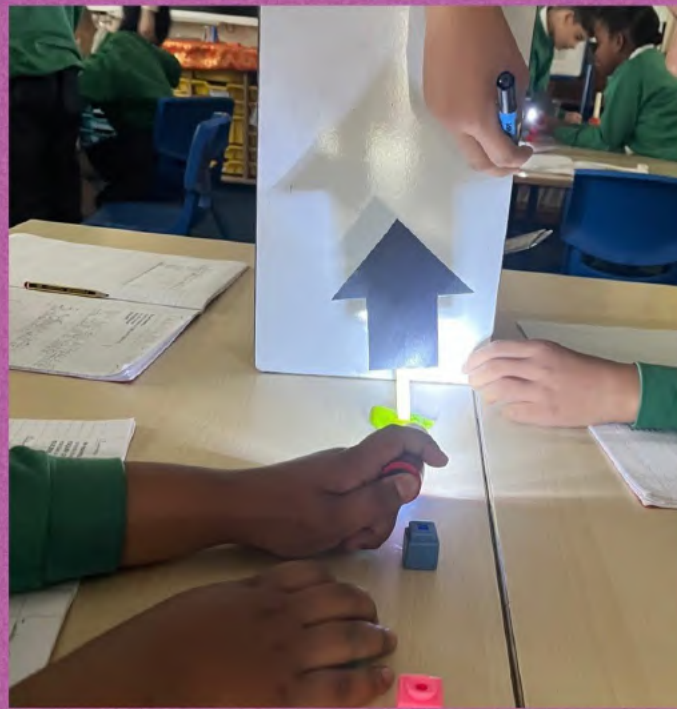
We were delighted to welcome everyone to our art and RE exhibition: 'Faith in our Future, Hope in our Future.'



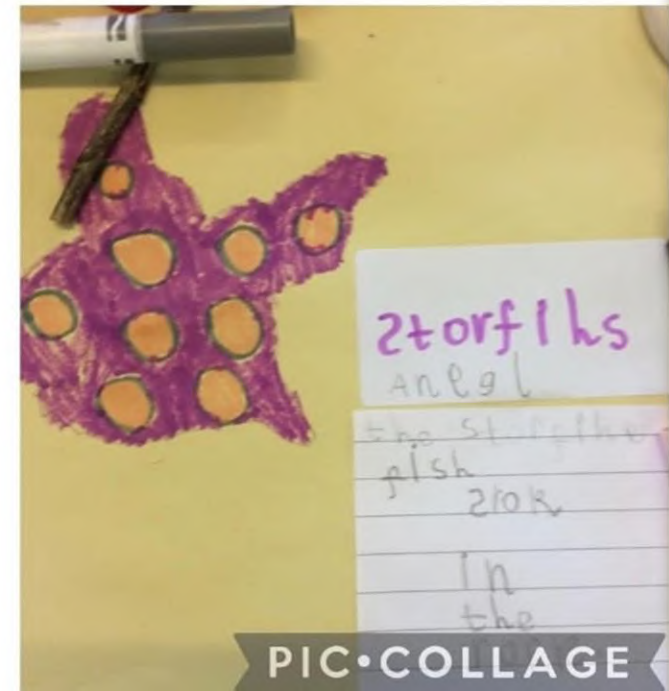




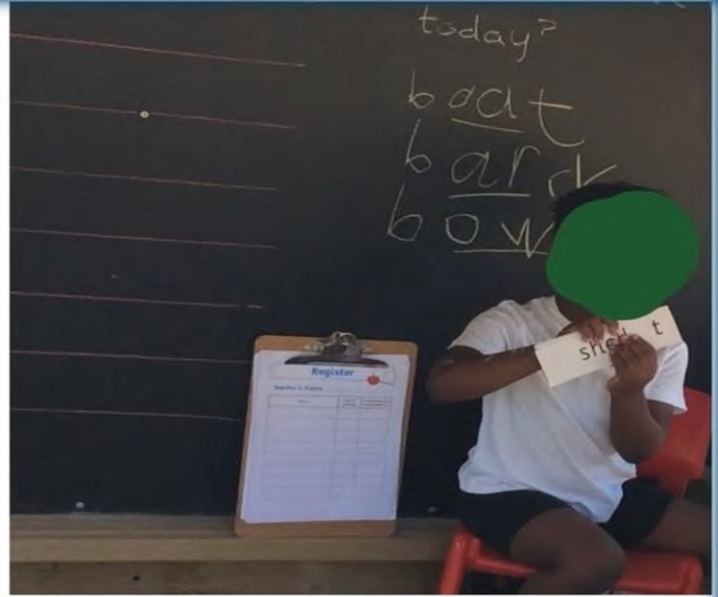
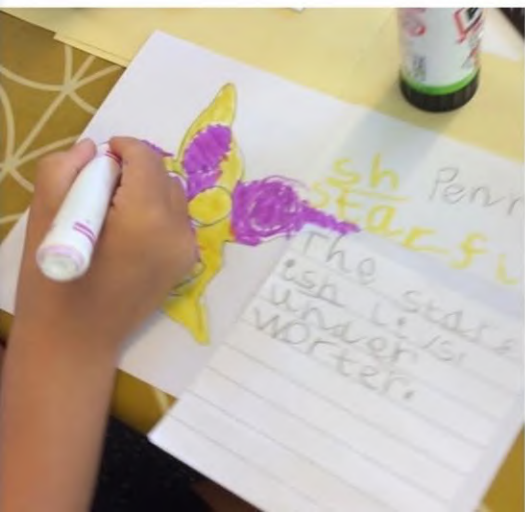

They also enjoyed creating stories inspired by their learning and making the most of outdoor exploration opportunities.

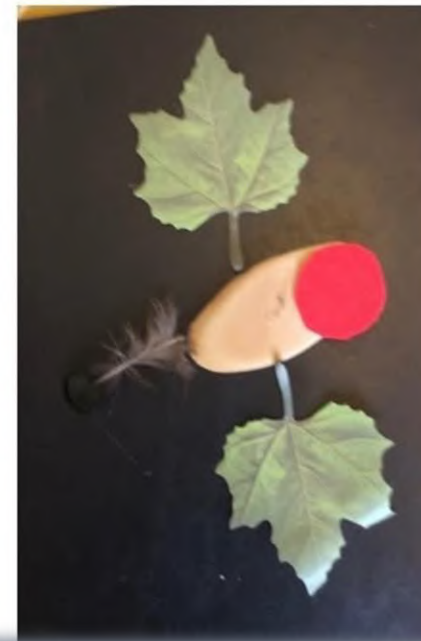


Using our underwater theme inspired by **Billy's Bucket**, Reception Mozart have been exploring their creativity through transient art.

We're looking forward to seeing where our underwater theme takes us over the coming days.



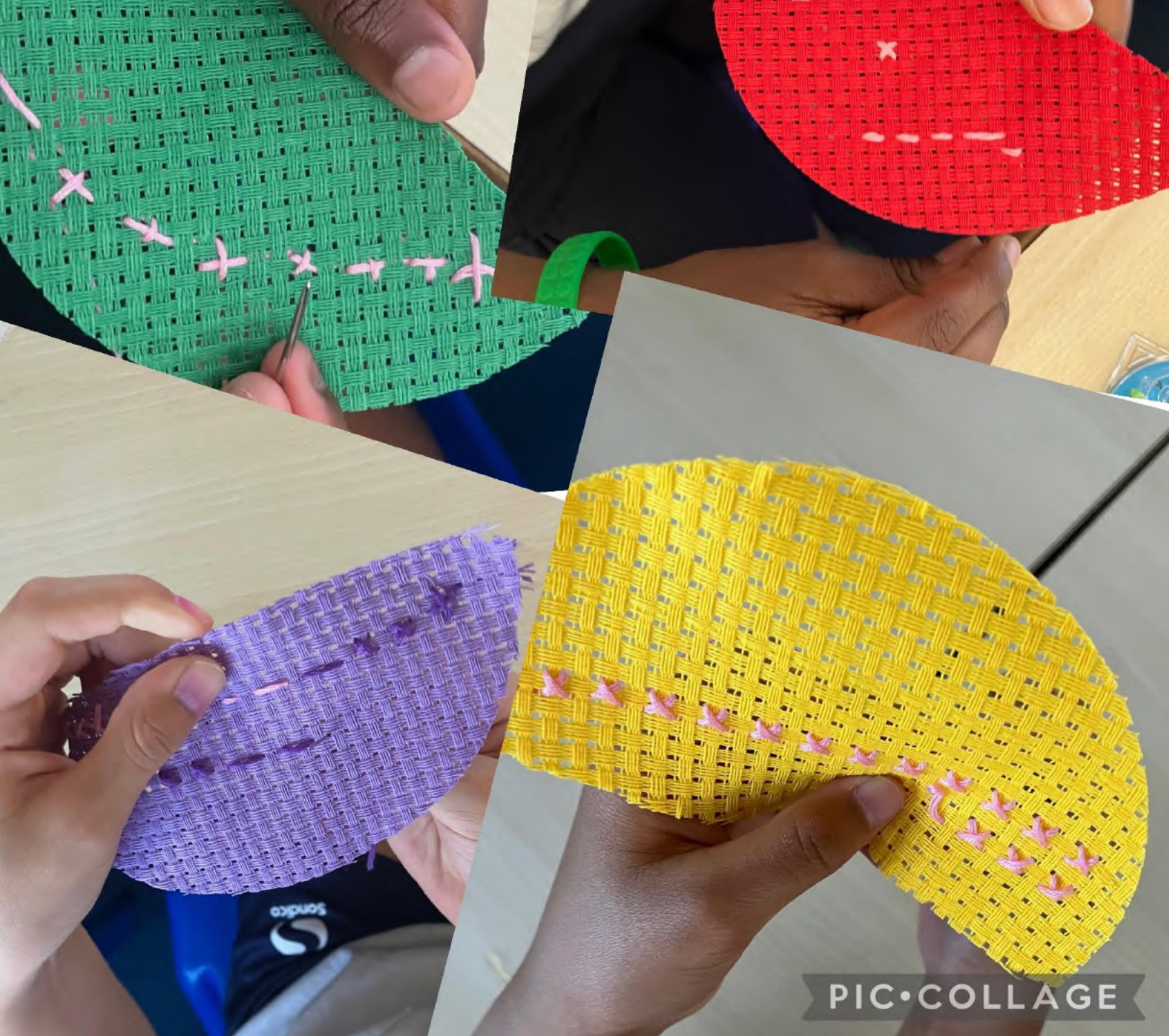

This week, Reception Mozart have been busy being **'little scientists'** ! We have been exploring magnets, investigating which objects they stick to and which they don't.

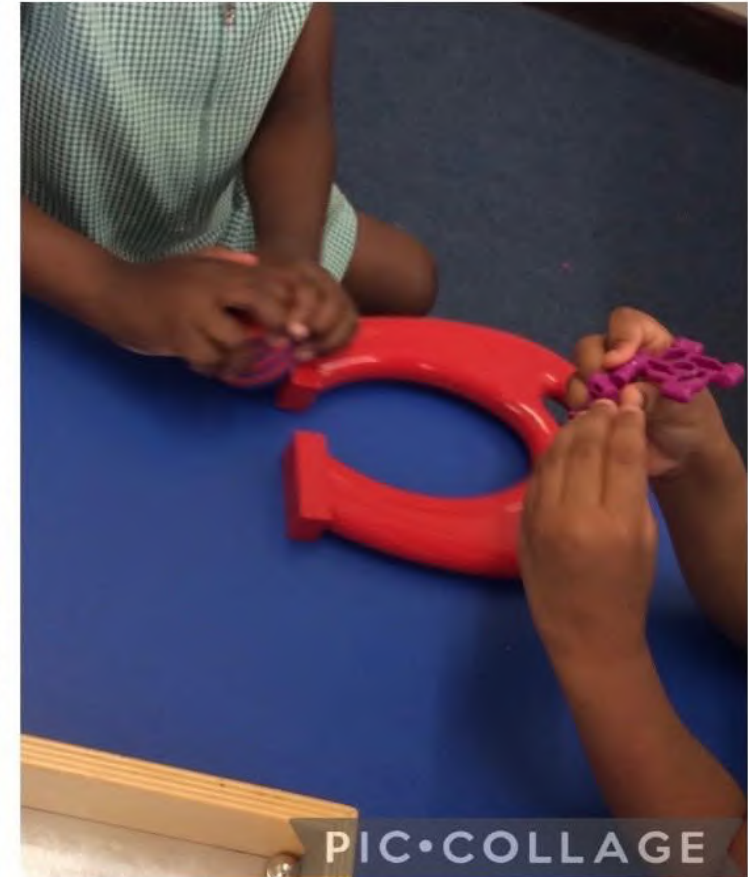
The children loved making predictions and testing their ideas!



We also put our sense of smell to the test, matching mystery scents to the correct pictures – there were some fantastic guesses!

Reception O'Connor have had a busy week. In science, the children explored magnets, testing a range of objects to find out which were magnetic. They also carried out a smelling investigation, using descriptive language to compare different scents and discuss what they noticed.



In art, the children used printing techniques to create underwater scenes, experimenting with pattern, shape and colour to produce some thoughtful pieces of work.





In maths, we focused on doubles and not doubles by building Numberblocks. The children explored which numbers could be divided into two equal parts and explained their thinking using the models they had created. It has been great to see the children becoming more confident in asking questions, sharing ideas and explaining their learning.



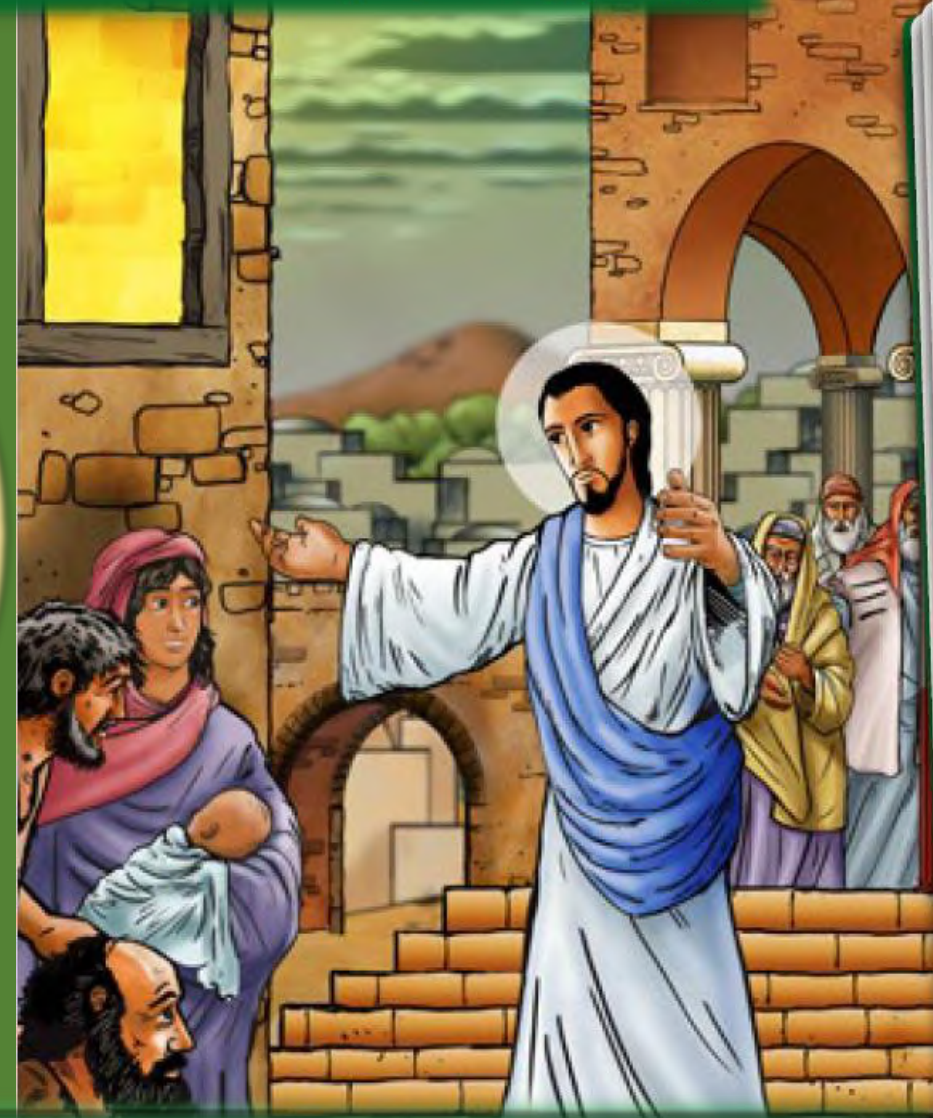
